# School Responsibilities The Benjamin Franklin Elementary School will:

1. Provide high-quality curriculum and instruction in a supportive and effective learning environment that enables the participating children to meet the State's student academic achievement standards as follows:

In addition to following the district's curriculum in all content areas Franklin offers students the following service based on academic need: co-teaching in grades 3 & 4. Those who qualify also receive Response to Intervention Services in ELA (grades 1 through 4) and/or Mathematics (grades 2 through 4) and Lunch Bunch (intensive math assistance). In addition, all students participate in an ELA intervention block to remediate or enrich language arts skills. Occupational therapists push into the Kindergarten classrooms to work on fine motor skills with the students. Speech therapists provide push in services to Kindergarten students and pull out services to those who qualify in grades K-4.

Franklin Elementary School students also receive instruction in vocal and instrumental music, physical education, art, technology, and library skills which integrate into curriculum areas to promote academic achievement, the arts, and physical health.

2. Hold parent-teacher conferences (at least annually in elementary schools) during which this compact will be discussed as it relates to the individual child's achievement. Specifically, those conferences will be held:

Staff will be available to meet with parents by appointment during the school day as well as before school (8:15am-9:00am). Staff is also available for telephone calls or email correspondence before or after school hours.

5. Provide parents opportunities to volunteer and participate in their child's class and to observe classroom activities, as follows:

Parents and family members are welcome to volunteer in the classroom at the teacher's discretion. Parent volunteers help the teachers run learning centers, computer labs, guided reading groups, and math labs. The volunteers act as chaperones on field trips and serve as volunteers for special school events including PTA functions, family math night, family read aloud night, field day, picnics, and classroom celebrations. The parents are also involved in Math Masters which is a family math incentive program and in our American Reading framework home reading expectations. Franklin is focused on building character in our students through our PBIS (Positive Behavior Intervention Support) program. We celebrate those students who display positive character traits on the morning announcements and also at a monthly assembly.

Franklin has a very dedicated group of parents who run a successful PTA.
