Please Explain:

1. Rationale and Purpose for this Educational Field Trip: (include how this trip is directly related to, enhances, and reinforces your current curriculum and/or district priorities; how this trip will enhance and reinforce specific NYS Learning Standards and Performance Indicators.)

The intended trip would be to the city of Frankenmuth, Michigan. This city models itself after a typical German Bavarian town. The architecture, restaurants, shops, clothing of the workers, and the activities are what students would encounter if they were able to travel to a town in southern Germany. The people there boast the ability to speak German and will be willing to engage our students in conversation.

The two New York State Standards for World Languages state that students will learn communication skills in the target language, and develop a cultural awareness of the target culture. During this visit, students will be served the traditional continental breakfast, and will be served typical German dishes for the evening meals. They will see the structure of the German houses and buildings as we discuss them in class. They will see many handmade and traditional German products. Students will also have the opportunity to learn about the emigration of the Germans and their immigration to, and settling within the United States. Students will have the opportunity to communicate with native and non-native speakers of German in the town. Learning to communicate with non-native speakers is especially important as German is a common "linqua franca." Since most Europeans study German, as do over 60% of Japanese and many Chinese students, it is often the language through which groups of people who do not share the same mother language choose to communicate. This can help our students in their interactions with multiple groups of people within their own country.

2. Itinerary and description of actual instructional activities that will occur during the trip. (Include what preliminary activities are planned before the trip and what follow up activities will occur after the trip to reinforce or apply learning.)

Prior to the trip, students will learn about packing and organizing for a trip, preparing to travel as an ambassador for our school, obtaining necessary documentation, and being responsible for themselves and their belongings. We will cover appropriate behavior as well as restaurant and hotel etiquette. Students will receive brochures, see pictures of where we will be going, and background information about the town. We will role play certain travel situations that might arise. After our return, we will revisit the town throughout the curriculum of the following year. The culture, language, and vocabulary can be tied to experiences the students had on the trip. This will also be a great starting point for students who are considering traveling to German with the high school exchange program. Students can test their independence and see if they are willing and ready for the lengthier, more intense travel to Europe.

I am in the process of finalizing an itinerary for the trip directly with the organizations in Frankenmuth and with their Chamber of Commerce and Visitors' Center which have been helpful in providing information and ideas. Please see the attached preliminary itinerary.

The town of Frankenmuth is set up to receive tourists so it has several nice hotels and restaurants, along with boat excursions, demonstrations, and group tours.

Student Trip to Frankenmuth, Michigan

Grades 7,8,9
Hoover Middle School and Kenmore West High School
(Possible Franklin Middle School and Kenmore East High School)

Preliminary Itinerary:

Monday, June 26, 2017

Students should arrive at our pick-up location by 7am to stow the luggage and load the bus. Please make sure you have eaten breakfast before we leave and that you have enough snacks with you to keep you satisfied during the approximately 8-9 hour trip to Michigan. You should also have a book to read, cards or a game to play, music, or a movie to watch. We will try to have a movie on the bus for all to enjoy. We will stop for lunch at a rest area approximately half way to our destination (around noon). Leave KenTon at 8am

Arrive at our hotel at approximately 4pm. Check into rooms, unpack, and head downstairs for a German buffet dinner. After dinner you are free to enjoy the waterpark until lights out.

Tuesday, June 27, 2017

Breakfast at the hotel and then we head out to explore Frankenmuth. We will ride into town and then take a walking tour of the downtown area with a visit to the historic St. Lorenz Church and cemetary, the covered bridge, and a stroll along the Cass River. We will stop at 10 for a guided tour of the Historical Museum, and then continue our exploring until we have lunch at noon.

After lunch we travel to The Adventure Park of Frankenmuth from approximately 2pm to 5pm for a little fun and physical activity with this aerial forest adventure that includes tree top climbing and zip lines. Then, it is out to Sullivan's Black Forest Restaurant for dinner and then back to the hotel for more water park fun until lights out. Or, we could take a short stop at Bonner's Christmas shop on the way home.

Wednesday, June 28, 2017

After breakfast at the hotel we head out for about 2 hours to Grandpa Tiny's Farm from approximately 10am to noon. We will see a working historical farm, one room school house, residential home, and outdoor "Backofen." This is the life many of the German immigrants would have lived when they first arrived in this area. Our visit here will include a guided tour, a wagon ride, and a visit to the petting farm

After the farm, we will travel to the River Shops near the Bavarian Inn, which will give you a glimpse of the life in a German village. Here we will find lunch, shop, visit the Ultimate Mirror Maze, stop in at the German-style "Sugar High Bakery", and participate in some pretzel rolling at the pretzel shop. We will work our way down to the dock for a 4pm trip down the Cass River on the Bavarian Belle Riverboat. German-style Chicken dinner at the Bavarian Inn Lodge for dinner after our boat ride and then back to the hotel for one last night at the water park before lights out.

Thursday, June 29, 2017

After breakfast at the hotel, students have time to enjoy the waterpark one last time before we leave. All rooms must be packed up, cleaned up, and vacated by 11am.

We will leave Frankenmuth at approximately noon after a stop at Bonner's Christmas Village (unless we were able to visit on Tuesday evening.) We will eat lunch on the bus (bagged lunch ordered from the hotel) and make a stop for dinner at a rest area on the way home. We should pull back in to KenTon around 9pm.
