"Rise of Dictators: The History of WWI"

Welcome to The Rise of Dictators: The History of World War II. The course is a college style (not a college level) is an elective course that covers a wide range of global events beginning with the causes of the 'Great War' and ends with the seeds of the 'Cold War'. Students will see that the men and women of our '*Greatest Generation*' must not be forgotten and deserve all the honor and recognition that they rightfully earned as citizen soldiers when they fought for ideas such as democracy, freedom, justice and a determination to end totalitarian rule throughout the world.

Course Outline

The course is divided into six main units that loosely follow your textbook World War II: A Short History.

I. The Beginning of a Great War through the Rise of Dictators

- Did You Know that Germany used the 'Scorched Earth Policy' on France during WWI?
- Did You Know that Hitler was democratically elected by the German people?

II. Hitler's Blitzkrieg through Barbarossa

- Do You Know that Great Britain allowed Germany to re-arm its military (1935) in violation of the Treaty of Versailles (1919)?
 * Actually, Britain encouraged it!!*
- **Did You Know** that one of the great secrets of WWII, R.A.D.A.R. was invented in Britain? *Hitler had no clue why the British knew exactly where to counter-attack his Luftwaffe.*

III. The Sleeping Giant Awakes

- Did You Know that Congress didn't unanimously declare war on Japan after Pearl Harbor?

IV. 1942: Turning Points of World War II

- *Did You Know* that in Leningrad civilians ate all their pets, zoo animals, and rats to live?
- **Did You Know** that during the Battle of Midway Admiral Nimitz moved the fleet only 5 minutes before the Japanese Fleet arrived which would have annihilated the U.S. Pacific Fleet?

V. The Real Second Front Begins as Hitler Falls Down

- Did You Know that Only 30% of all bombs landed within 5 miles of their targets?
- Did You Know that Hitler slept through the first 8 hours of the D-Day? *Would you wake him?*
- **Did You Know** that General Patton was removed twice from command during the war because he wouldn't follow orders? *But he was quickly re-instated when U.S. newspaper sales declined. *
- **Did You Know** that Hitler used doctors, lawyers, and retired police officers as his willing executioners?

VI. Which Island to Hop as the Rising Sun Finally Sets!

- Did You Know in 1943 U.S. soldiers were ordered to stop wearing human body parts?
- **Did You Know** that Nagasaki was actually the 4th city on the target list to drop the Atomic Bomb but the 2nd (Nagano) and 3rd (Akita) were covered by clouds?

"Independent Reading Assignment"

The Independent Reading Project is designed to allow the student the opportunity to choose a topic that occurred during World War II that they are intrinsically interested in giving the student the opportunity to expand their knowledge base on any topic found in the course.. The Project accounts for **30%** of your their grade for the course and is mandatory for course credit by combing both a **Visual and Written** portion determined by the student. Possible ideas include the one of the following......

- 1) Power Point Slide Show
- 2) Create a Website
- 3) Movie with a Typed Script or a Radio Program with a Typed Script
- 4) Build A Model, A Display, a Salt Map, etc. with a Journals or Reflections,
- 5) A Board Game with Typed Game Rules, Cards
- 6) Illustrated Children's Book, Graphic Novel, or Creative Story.
- 7) A Newspaper w/ Pictures & Captions
- 8) CD Case /Songs & Book Jacket/Poems
