## #9 Response to Pacific War Dec 1941-May 1942

(Background) While FDR asked Congress to approve a Declaration of War with the Japan you have been temporarily recalled from Europe and are being sent to Washington to help 'assess the immediate situation in the Pacific'. Privately you have condemned 'Plan Dog' for focusing too much on Hitler and his Nazi thugs while realizing the potential Japanese threat which was much closer to home. (Background) August 1942: The Bloody battles of the Pacific were fought on the Air, Land, and Sea pitting the U.S. forces against the Imperial Japanese Military. Some of the most vicious fighting of the war took place on remote islands including the Solomon Islands during the 6 month Battle of Guadalcanal. Conditions in this humid jungle region was some of the worst encountered by U.S. forces during the entire war. Against the greatest jungle fighter in the world what chance do you and your men have against the ultimate Guerilla fighter and any potential 'Banzi' charges you may encounter?

**(Task)** Cite a minimum of 5 pieces of evidence from both your Jungle War Article and Guadalcanal Battle plan as you describe the difficulties the Marines and the U.S. Navy faced as they began the daunting task of Island Hopping in the Pacific.

### #11 The Battle of Stalingrad Fall 1942

"A thousand years hence, every German will speak with awe of Stalingrad and remember that it was there that Germany put the seal on her victory."

-Joseph Goebbels

(Background) Stalin's personal city is under siege and the 'Enemy is at the Gates'. The line has been drawn in the snow; the German's may crawl into the city but will never be allowed to escape. The fate of Mother Russia is now in your hands. As a member of the O.S.S. you have been allowed further into the ranks of the Red Army then any other foreigner. Your rag tag band of snipers needs to convince the Nazi's to turn back to Berlin.' Can you and your men (and women) survive the most violent conflict on the Eastern Front? Using your less than honorable guerilla warfare tactics how far will you go to save a city and at what cost your soul?
