



U.S. Contingency Defense Plans

(**Read/Highlight**) In 1939 a joint board of Army and Navy leadership passed the so called '*Rainbow*' **Plans'** designed to provide for various **World Wide Contingencies** the U.S. would potentially face in case of war. Many of the Rainbow plans were in reality previous plans based in out dated technology and tactics. For example, Plan Orange (1911) dealt with the U.S. occupied Commonwealth of the Philippines which stated that in case of Japanese attack the armed forces would hold out until the U.S. Pacific Navy would sail from California to send reinforcements.

(**Read/Highlight**) By the Spring of 1940 (while the Nazi Blitzkrieg in Europe is in full effect) U.S. Navy planners under the guidance of **FDR** drafted '**Plan Dog** 'which concluded that the priority once the U.S. would need to <u>intervene in the European Theater</u> of War and eventually <u>Defeat Germany</u> to achieve this aim. In addition, '**Plan Dog**' insisted that U.S. armed forces already located in the Pacific would need to assume a <u>Defensive Stance</u> against the Japanese in the Pacific to limit Japanese assistance to Germany.






(**Read/Highlight**) In January 1941 the "**A.B.C.**" or American British Conference took place in Washington D.C. with the greatest of secrecy and lasted for over two months discussing hypathical scenarios regarding preexisting Contingency Plans. A significant outcome of the conference contributed to the transfer of numerous naval units from the Pacific theater to the Atlantic.



(**Read/Highlight**) Throughout the Summer and Fall of 1941 the U.S. increased their support of Great Britain by occupying both the countries of Greenland & Iceland, drafted the **Atlantic Charter** on the **Prince of Wales in August** highlighted by the agreement to preserve democracies and creating the basis of the future United Nations, ordered the **U.S. Navy in July** to Patrol the Atlantic Ocean, and by **October** even arming **Merchant Ships** giving their commanders the opportunity to 'Shoot on Sight' any German U-Boats in the vicinity.





The Debacle in the Philippines

Dec. 7, 1941-May 5, 1942

(**Read/Highlight**) The Philippine Islands were under U.S. Military jurisdiction since the 1800's and now was to be considered a key Japanese target once war broke out due to its strategic location in the Pacific. A strong presence was required to deter the Japanese which led to FDR personally handpicking the new Field Marshall of the Philippine Army **Douglas Mac Arthur** to lead the joint U.S. and Philippine defense. Unfortunately, the defenses were not what the General hoped for



Clarke Field Layout




The 'So Called' Philipino Army

Unfortunately, the U.S. forces will finally surrender on May 5th.



(**Read/Highlight**) On December 8th the Japanese strafed **Clark Field** just as the Allied scout planes returned with half of the U.S. bombers to be caught on the ground. Sensing a Japanese onslaught, the remaining B-17 Bombers were re-moved to the safer Australia on December17th. The Japanese now have *Air Superiority* over the islands without risking their vital Air Craft Carries will begin to devastate naval installations at Manila Bay forcing the rest of the Allied Asiatic Fleet to move to Australia as well. The Japanese then began to 'soften' the beaches in preparation for the main invasion at Lingayen Gulf on December 22nd.

The Allied prewar contingency defense plan called for the U.S. to retreat to the **Bataan Peninsula** as **Plan Orange** have the U.S. Pacific fleet located at Pearl Harbor race across the Pacific to reinforce the defenders. By the middle of January 1942 despite losing most of their food and ammunition, the remains of both the Philippino and U.S. army would make a bloody retreat to **Bataan** as Japanese soldiers attacked Allied defensive positions by having the first wave jump on the barbwire and the 2nd and 3rd wave run on their backs.



On April 18, 1942 **Jimmy Doolittle** and his **80 Doolittle Raiders** would attack Japan. Describe the Plan including Date, Equipment, Training, and Time necessary if the plan had any chance of success.

Results of the Doolittle Raid:

(Read/Highlight) Of the 80 total Doolittle Raiders only 3 Died during the mission while 8 Men became Japanese P.O.W.'s. Of the 8 in captivity 4 of the Raiders would Die of Starvation, 3 would be Publically Beheaded and 1 would Die of Dysentery. Despite the loss of 11 Airmen the Doolittle Raiders '1 Hour Over Tokyo' caused United States Morale to go through the roof. When asked where the Raiders launch point was located FDR would only cryptically respond 'Shang Ra La' causing the Japanese to not only pull their 10 Carriers back within their defensive perimeter but attempt to determine where in fact 'Shang Ra La' was located. Japanese Military commanders (who all were veterans of the Russo Japanese War of 1905) determined that the December 7th attack on Pearl Harbor did not do enough damage to significantly cripple the U.S. Pacific Fleet. Immediately Japanese Imperial Naval commanders began planning for one big battle (similar to Tsuschima) to destroy the U.S. Navy once and Shang Ra La once and for all.
