The Hard Facts

- 2016-2017 is another difficult budget year for school districts all across New York State – marginal increases in State Aid (GEA, Foundation Aid, contractual costs)
- Huntley PILOT loss adds increased revenue obstacles - *greatly impacting tax cap

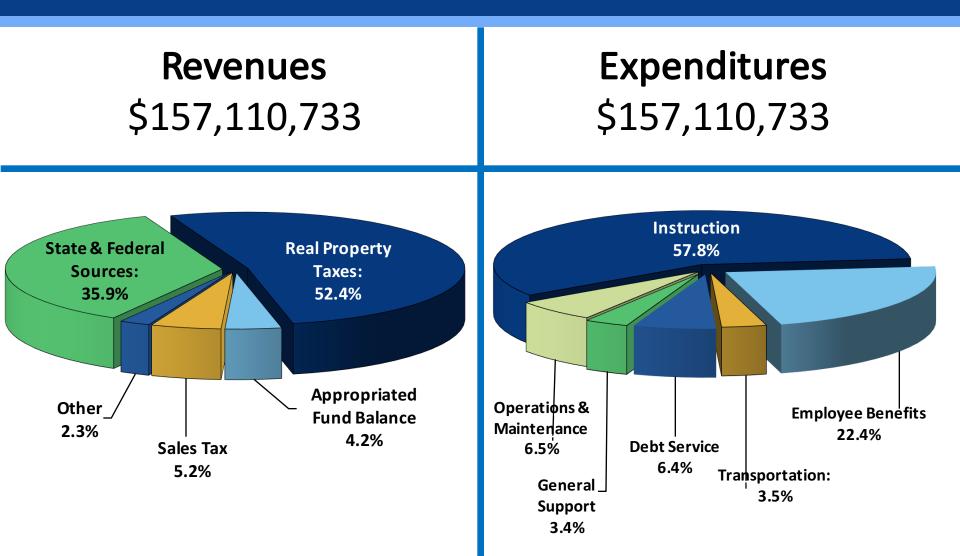

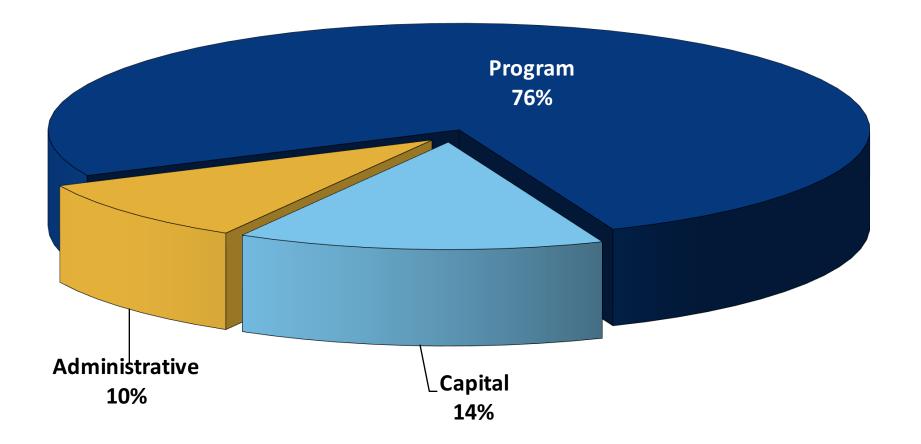

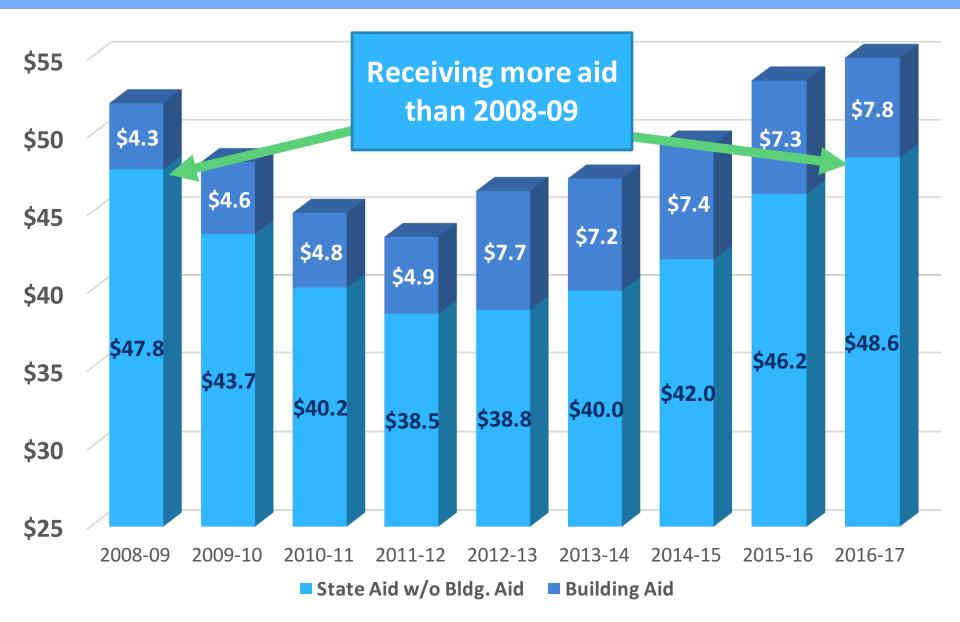
Historical Budget-to-Budget Increase



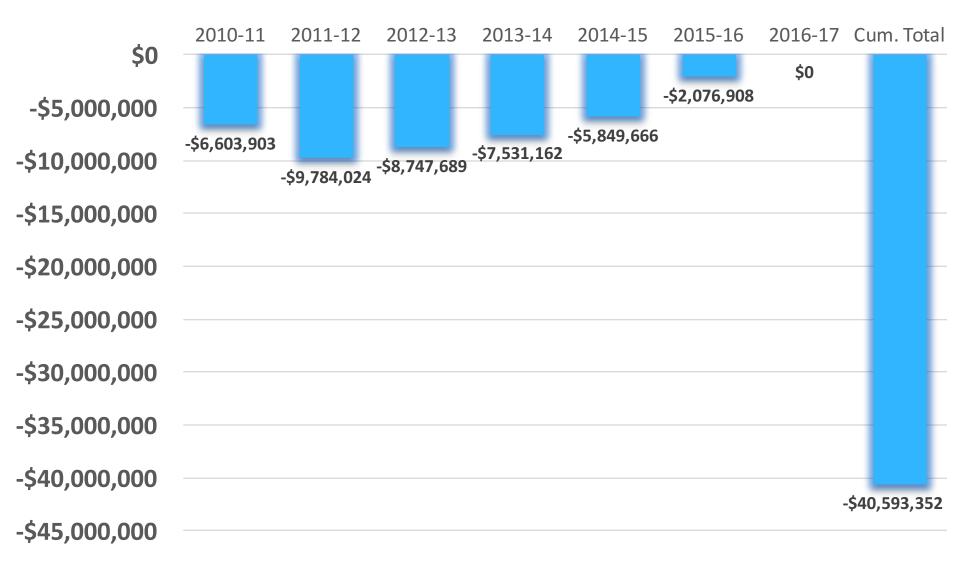
State Aid Comparison (in millions)



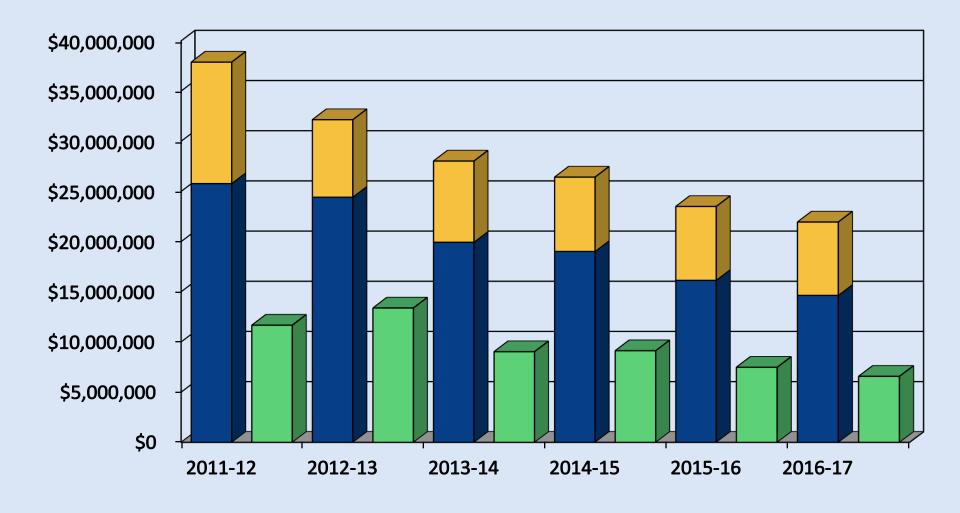
State Aid Comparison (in millions)

Estimated Tax Levy: 2016-17 School Year

- Tax Levy: \$82,390,409
- **Increase:** \$3,153,624
- % Increase: 3.98%
- Tax Levy Cap Threshold Adj. for Exclusions: \$82,910,744
 - Within the allowable tax levy cap
 - Does not require a super majority vote

Estimated Tax Rate: 2016-17 School Year

Assumes no change in assessed value

- Rate: \$49.33/thousand
- Increase: \$1.89
- % Increase: 3.98%
- **5-Year Average:** 3.69%
- **12-Year Average:** 3.34%

- District levy is under tax cap
- Household income under \$275,000

Projected Annual Tax Impact on a Home with a Full Market Value of \$100,000

	Actual 2015-16	Projected 2016-17	Projected Increase
Assessed Value*	\$40,500	\$40,500	\$0
Tax Rate Per Thousand	\$47.44	\$49.33	\$1.89
Tax Paid	\$1,921	\$1,998	\$77

*The 2016 equalization rate of 40.5% is used for both years in this calculation

What Happens if the Budget is NOT Approved by the Public?

Two Options:

- 1. Resubmit the original budget or submit a revised budget to the voters on the third Tuesday in June OR
- 2. Adopt a contingency budget that levies a tax no greater than that of the current year (0% increase in the tax levy).

If the resubmitted/revised budget proposal is <u>not</u> approved by the required margin:

• The Board of Education <u>must</u> adopt a budget that levies a tax no greater than that of the current year (0% increase tax levy) and the budget would be subject to contingent budget requirements.

Districts will <u>not</u> be allowed to increase the tax levy to the extent necessary to fund items of expenditure excluded from the tax cap

- No growth factor
- No capital, court order/judgments or pension exclusions

Four Propositions

Proposition 1: Budget: \$157,110,733

Proposition 2: Bus Purchase

- Standard replacement cycle:
 - 10 Passenger Buses
- District Consolidation Buses:
 - 3 Passenger Buses
- Total Proposition:

\$1,149,680

- \$ 342,057
 - = \$1,491,737

Approximately 70% = \$1,044,215 in State Transportation Aided Leaving District share for 13 buses at approximately \$447,521

Propositions

Proposition 3: Capital Reserve

- \$15 million cap
- 10-year lifespan
- Established and expended by voter approval
- *Purpose: To fund future capital projects that have no/minimal additional tax increases*
