



How do we define engagement?


Students show sustained behavioral involvement in learning activities accompanied by a positive emotional tone.

1. Choose a "Smart Seat" that helps you do your BEST work!



2. Use each seat the right way.

3. If you wish to sit by a friend, you must be working QUIETLY.



4. If a spot is not working for you, MOVE so that you can do your BEST!



5. Put your supplies away when you're finished.



6. Flexible Seating is a privilege. The teacher can move anyone at any time.

The best seat is the one where you WORK the best!


Lily: "I like flexible seating because when I am in a regular chair I have a hard time staying focused, in these chairs I don't."
