How does this book relate to your program?

Shakespeare's plays have long been a staple for the high school English curriculum. Even with all the changes in education in the last few years, Shakespeare has remained. The Common Core Standards themselves reference Shakespeare saying that students must grapple with texts with language as complex, powerful, and beautiful as his. At least one module unit per grade level focuses on a Shakespearean play.

How will this text be used?

The English department would like to use the Prestwick additions of Shakespeare's plays instead of the Dover additions we have historically purchased for students as consumables. The Prestwick additions cost approximately the same as the Dover, but are much more user friendly for students. These unabridged texts come with better marginal notes for antiquated language, a helpful glossary and textual notes. In addition, the Prestwick additions include line numbers for each scene. This is of vital importance in order to teach students to properly cite textual evidence.
