Intro:

In order for you to graduate in June you must pass an Economics course. You must earn a 65% passing average to receive credit. Being AP students this shouldn't be an issue. In May, you will take the AP exam to earn college credit. In order to achieve these goals you must read the book, complete the homework and projects, pass weekly tests and participate effectively in the classroom. If you put forth the proper amount of energy and effort you could make this an enjoyable semester. Time will fly if we are having fun, but we cannot have fun if we do not work hard.

Economics is the study of the useful application of the wealth and/or material resources of a county, nation or society. As you will learn this year, it pervades all of human activity. This course is a college level course in Microeconomics: the study of the economic behavior of individual households and firms within individual markets. *This course is going to be difficult and frustrating at times. Despite this you will leave my room with a much heightened ability to tackle the economic problems of your and our futures.*
