## The SAT Digital Test is Here!

The new test is computer-based only, shorter test taking time, shorter reading and math questions and longer time allotted to answer the test questions.

While many colleges have gone test optional, the early data has shown that students who submit SAT or ACT test scores have an admissions advantage.

Test optional means schools don't require SAT or ACT scores but will still review and consider them as part of your application. It does not mean that SAT and ACT scores are no longer important. Only schools that are "test blind" don't look at standardized test scores at all.
