As a Bills fanatic, I wanted to share some information about Highmark Stadium with you. Here it is:

History:

The stadium opened in 1973 as Rich Stadium and is the home venue of the Buffalo Bills of the National Football League (NFL). It was known as New Era Field from 2016 to 2019, and Bills Stadium in 2020. I found this information for my article on the following sites.

Fun Facts:

Why did it used to have the name Ralph Wilson stadium?

It opened in 1973 as Rich Stadium, after the food products company of that name. After the sponsorship contract ran out in 1998, it was nicknamed Ralph Wilson Stadium in honor of Ralph Wilson (1918-2014), the team's founding owner from 1960 until his death in 2014.

Why Highmark?

On August 20, the team announced they would temporarily use the name Bills Stadium until they found a new namingrights partner. On March 29, 2021, the team announced that the stadium's new name would be Highmark Stadium after reaching a 10-year agreement with Highmark Blue Cross Blue Shield of Western New York.

Why do the Bills have a bison in their logo?

The Buffalo Bills might have a blue bison in their logo, and their mascot Billy Buffalo might also be a (you guessed it) blue bison, but the animal simply represents the city's name — not the team name. The Bills, instead, are named after "Buffalo Bill" Cody, a man who literally hunted bison.

Seventh Graders Attend King Arthur Assembly

On November 14, 2023, the seventh graders attended an assembly from the King Arthur Baking Company. Ms. Leanne Reynolds was the presenter. Mrs. Donn and Mrs. Speyer helped to organize the assembly. Two students named Ryan Rejewski and Alessandra Collana volunteered to help demonstrate how to make bread. Everyone in seventh grade got a free bag of flour, sugar, and yeast at the end of the day. We had to make one loaf for our immediate family, and another loaf to donate to someone as an act of kindness. One anonymous student explained that she made the bread at home. The student said it turned out well and was really fairly easy to make; the student gave away one loaf of bread to her abuelo (grandfather). The student saved the other loaf for the family members in her home. In addition to learning how to make bread, we learned about science (sugar helps yeast to be more active). We learned math by seeing how to use fractions on measuring cups. We also learned ELA by reading and following stepby-step directions in the recipe. Then we learned a social studies fact that the highest mountain in New York is Mount Marcy.

A Talk With Ukrainian Students

On November 16, 2023 the students on my team were able to interview students from Ukraine through a Zoom meeting. Mrs. Hyde organized the meeting, and the meeting took place in Mrs. Greiner's classroom. We learned about their food, school, music, after-school activities and life during the war. The students we interviewed attend the Innovative Gymnasium School, in central Ukraine. The food there is definitely different than our school lunches. They eat pizza, sushi, McDonald's, a grain called buckwheat, apple juice, Coca-Cola, and borscht, a type of beet soup. In school they have different shifts. One group of students might go to school from 8:00 AM to 2:00 PM and the other goes from 12:00 PM to 6:00 PM. They have 13 classes a day including math, geography, PE, music and Ukrainian, and they have a lot more homework than we do. There are many Ukrainian musicians but they also know a few of ours like Taylor Swift. The students we interviewed like to dance, sing, draw, art, and do of all kinds of sports like football and basketball. They do not celebrate the Thanksgiving holiday in their country. During the war that still is going on, the students said they had many losses of family members and family friends and a lot of people had to fight in the war. It becomes normal to hear a bomb alarm and have to go into the bomb safe room in the basement. We were really lucky to get to talk to the Ukrainian students and we were impressed by how well they spoke English.
