KTUFSD GUIDANCE FOR FAMILIES VIRTUAL LEARNING Second Semester Update January 14, 2021

1. Can my K-12 child stay virtual past January 29th?

If a KTUFSD student is currently assigned as a virtual learning student (VLA) they will remain a virtual learning student through June 2021, pending an unexpected resolution to the COVID-19 pandemic.

2. Can a Virtual student change to the Hybrid instructional model?

Students must be approved by the building administrator to move from Virtual to Hybrid. Parents must notify the school, and if approved, a start date will be assigned the week following the request. A delay between approval and start is required in order to allow for the preparation and coordination of services to ensure a smooth transition (transportation; technology; physical distancing; attendance configurations; programming, etc.).

3. If I switch to Hybrid can I go back to the Virtual instructional model at a later date?

Students may request virtual instruction with documented medical/quarantine reasons (gr. 5-12) or other COVID- 19 related reasons (family related illnesses etc.) ONLY. These approvals will be very limited and must be approved by the school, including the building administrator and other relevant school members. Parents should request this change by contacting their child's school and if approved, a start date will be assigned the week following the request. Please understand that the district does not have the capacity for families to change back to virtual due to staffing constraints, especially at the elementary school level.

While the District continues to work with families with significant concerns, appropriate medical documentation, or late registrants, the District can not accommodate multiple requests for changes to the instructional model for several reasons including but not limited to ensuring social distancing and safety protocols.
