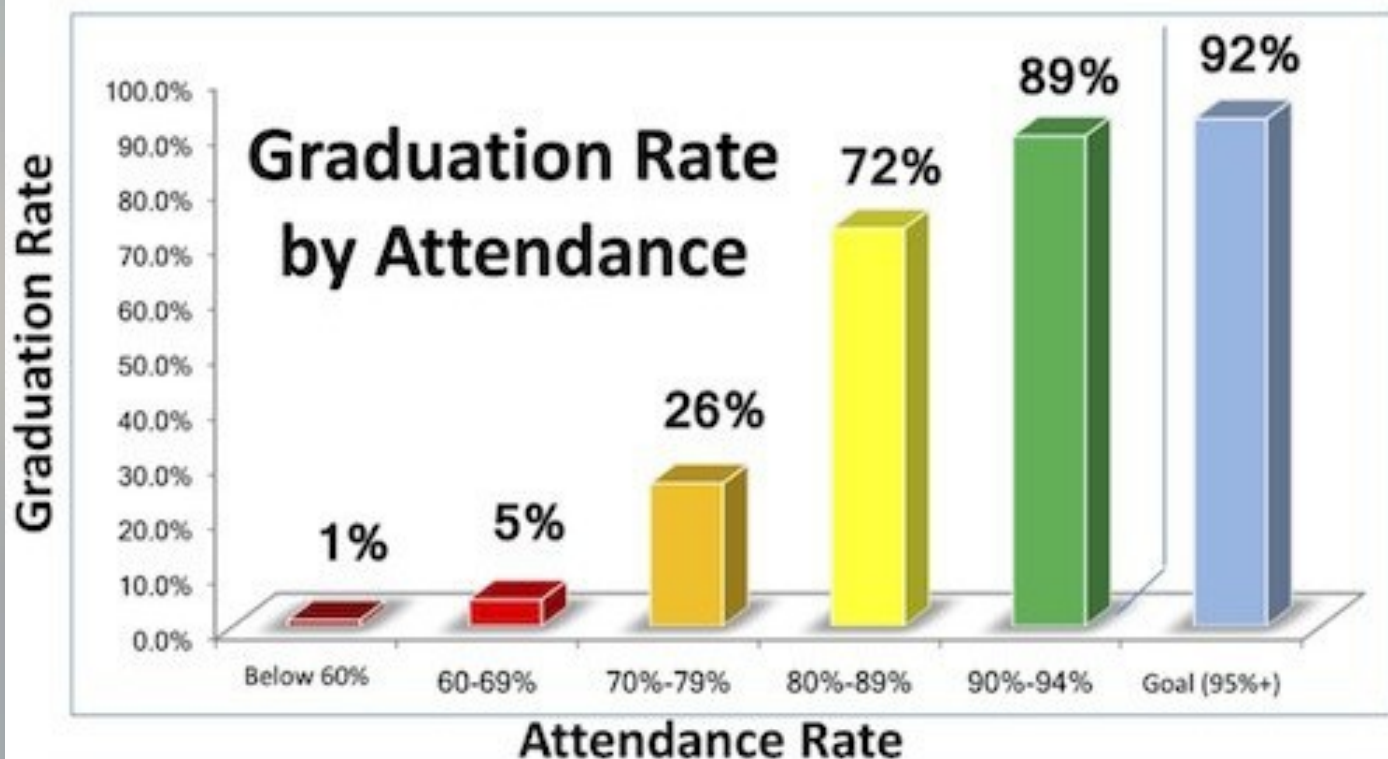


Phoenix Harvest Agricultural Measure Fall Kick Off

Ken-Ton Big Picture is thrilled to announce the successful launch of our school garden, made possible by the Whole Kids Garden Grant, and the invaluable support of community members. This hands-on project has engaged students from 7th to 12th grade in critical tasks like composting, weed prevention, and planting native plants using an auger to ensure robust root growth before winter. As we transition through the seasons, we will provide quarterly updates detailing our progress and future enhancements, including a greenhouse, raised garden beds, an art mural, and more exciting developments.



Attendance data



There have been articles about student attendance each month. This month we would like to highlight some statistical data. The graph above shows how likely a student is to graduate from high school based on how much school they attend. For example, a student that attends school 95% or more of the time has a 92% chance of graduating on-time. The less a student attends school, the lower the success rate.

Attendance is a key indicator to student success. We review student attendance regularly and will be sending notifications to families for any students that are considered Chronically Absent (missing more than 15% of school so far) and what the implications may be for their school programming. 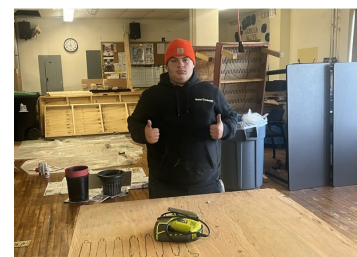
