Slight bump or push in non-harmful manner	Theft Burglary or Larceny Property damage/vandalism Inappropriate Language-ex. directed language to another Verbal/Written threat to cause harm Fighting/Assault Forgery Arson Bomb threat Gang Affiliation-ex. Wearing colors or stating to others you are in a gang DASA related insults PDA (Public Display of Affection) Use/Possession: ex. weapon, combustibles, tobacco, drugs, alcohol Disruption of class- ex. refusal to follow directions to stop negative behavior after multiple attempts or spontaneous shocking/horrendous disruption Academic misconduct-ex. cheating/plagiarism Truant from class-ex. skipping class Acceptable use violation-ex. violation of district technology policy Social Media- ex. any activity on social media that impacts the educational process Cell phone Violation- ex. taking a picture, recording or video False alarm or threat to others Urinating/defecating anywhere but in the toilet Gambling Graffiti Leaving the Classroom or Building without permission Spitting at/on another person Physical aggression- ex. punching, fighting Minor altercation-a mutual fight, including self defense Chronic tardiness or truancy
Process	Classroom Management Plan Staff discretion	1) Staff member completes a minor referral by the end of the day.	1) If necessary, staff member sends or escorts the student to a separate location (ex. Time Away Room).

		2) Staff calls home to share the minor offense with parent/guardian. Documentation of the phone call is made (ex. Infinite Campus Parent Log.)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> When fight occurs, separate students (ex- nurse and time away) Contact administrator/office immediately 2) <u>Complete a referral immediately</u> so that the office can proceed appropriately with the staff member's incident description. 3) Administrator conducts investigation. 4) Parents are notified and informed of due process (see pages 27-33), and consequence(s) assigned in Infinite Campus.

Definitions		A <u>minor referral</u> is a legal document that will go home to parents. It is a way to document an incident and to allow parents to know there is a problem in your class. Writing a minor gives you management control. <i>It is highly recommended that you phone parents in order to engage their support as well.</i>	A <u>major referral</u> is used when the infraction is greater than a minor and needs Administrative assistance. Generally, the infraction calls for more punitive and/or restorative disciplinary measures. If a major has been written after a number of unsuccessful minors, it is important that you include in the write-up previous interventions used. This lets administration know that you have been unsuccessful in changing that student's behavior and other measures need to be taken.
