Definitions		A minor referral is a legal document that will go home to parents. It is a way to document an incident and to allow parents to know there is a problem in your class. Writing a minor gives you management control. It is highly recommended that you phone parents in order to engage their support as well.	A major referral is used when the infraction is greater than a minor and needs Administrative assistance. Generally, the infraction calls for more punitive and/or restorative disciplinary measures. If a major has been written after a number of unsuccessful minors, it is important that you include in the write-up previous interventions used. This lets administration know that you have been unsuccessful in changing that student's behavior and other measures need to be taken.
