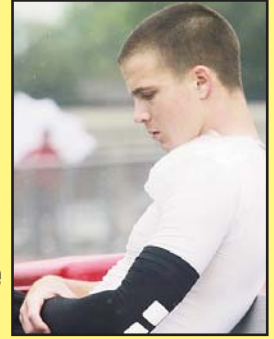

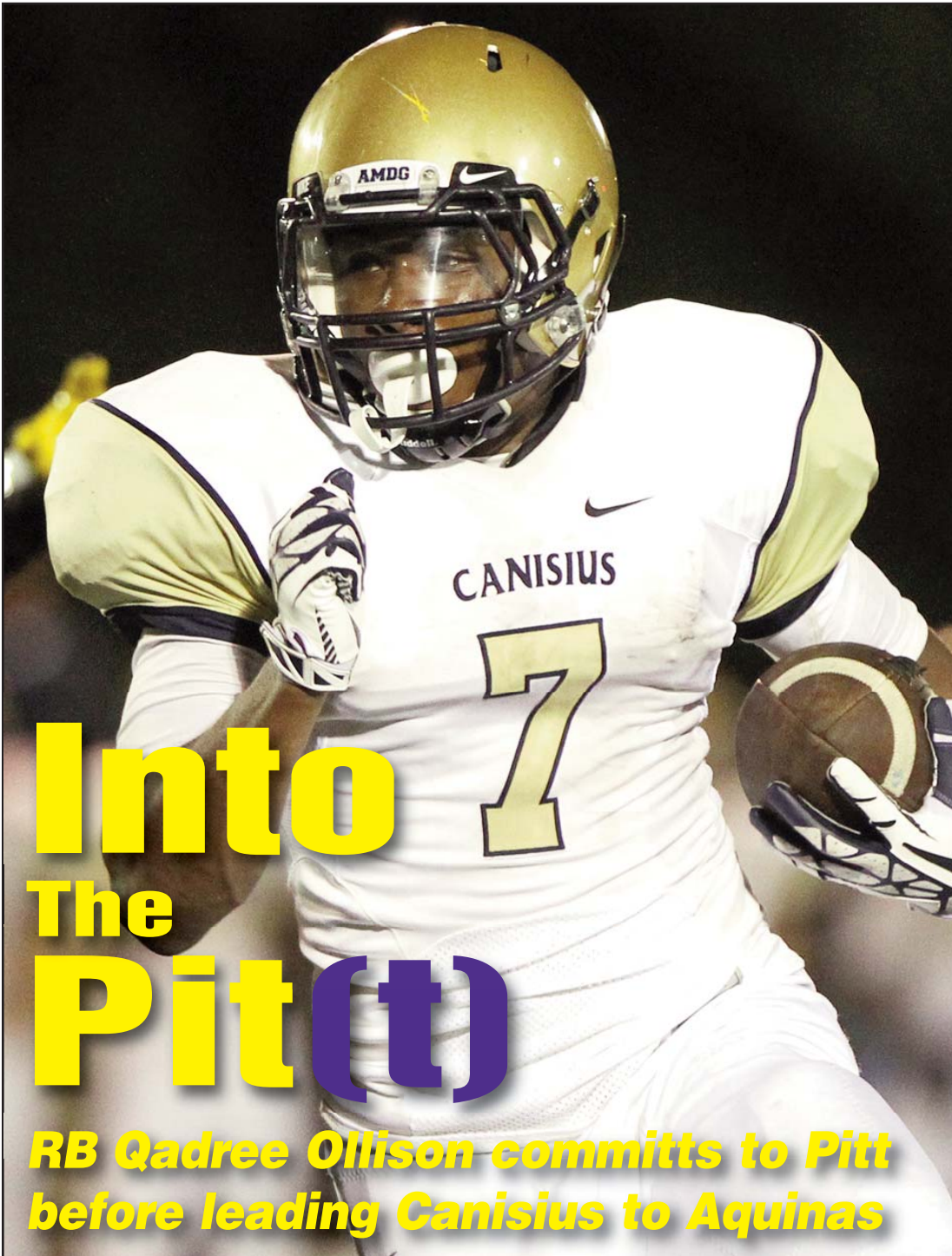

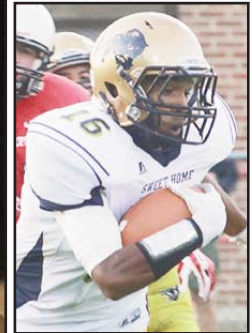

Gilbert Named Coach of the Week

St. Joe's coach Dennis Gilbert has been named the Coach of the Week by the Buffalo Bills and the U.S. National Guard after his Marauders earned a huge 20-14 win over Long Island powerhouse, St. Anthony's.

"We want to play the best," Gilbert said. "The best way to get our team ready for the league schedule is to play the best competition we can find."

St. Anthony's, which brought 91 players to the game, filling two locker rooms at the Kenmore Catholic school.

"College teams in Division I travel with just 65 players," Gilbert said. "This was a serious football program that we played."

St. Anthony's has lost just 11 games in the last 10 years and entered the game ranked in the Northeast by several national polls.

"I know different polls had them ranked number-2 in New York," Gilbert said, "but I don't pay a lot of attention to that stuff. I just know that they are a good football team."

Senior Nigel Davis powered the offense for St. Joe's as he rushed for 218 yards and 3 touchdowns on 27 carries. He scored every one of the Marauders' points.

"He's been with us from Day 1 of his freshman year," Gilbert said. "He's a 4-year starter and one of the best players in our area."

Davis rushed for 367 yards and 7 TDs in 2012. He also caught 8 passes for 89 yards. Davis was also among the top defenders in WNY with 6 interceptions.

"He was banged up last year," Gilbert said. "He had a groin issue and then a hip flexor. He never really got healthy. It was very frustrating for him. He re-habbed over the offseason and he is just electric again."

Davis ran 9 yards for a TD to give St. Joe's a 6-0 lead in the first quarter.

With just :09 left in the quarter, St. Anthony's scored on a 75-yard run to take a 7-6 lead.

"We always tell the kids that it's not if something goes

wrong but when," Gilbert said. "It's how you respond."

On the next St. Joe's play, Davis bolted 75 yards for a TD giving St. Joe's a 12-7 lead.

"Every time St. Anthony's did something, we answered," Gilbert said. "We just had to ask our kids who's going to make the next big play?"

Davis scored his third TD of the day when he ran in from 9 yards out in the 4th quarter. He then caught the 2-point PAT pass to give St. Joe's a 20-7 lead with 6:51 left to play.

"He also had a 40-yard run that he didn't score on,"

Gilbert said. "He was just explosive. He made great cuts. He plays offense, defense, returns kicks and punts. He did everything."

Gilbert said that St. Joe's fullback Rod Payne played a huge role in Davis' day.

"Rod was an absolute hammer with his lead blocking," Gilbert said. "We have a sophomore QB and gave up 40 pounds a guy on the line. Rod called all the pass protections and he was flawless as a lead blocker."

St. Joe's arch-rival Canisius

opened with a win and will likely be the top-ranked team in the first NYS poll. St. Joe's will also be highly ranked after beating a program with the reputation of St. Anthony's.

"It's a great win," Gilbert said. "I put it right up there with beating Aquinas last year."

Gilbert says that his players were ready for the season to start against a bigger and stronger team.

"It's a testament to the work the kids are putting in," Gilbert said. "The progress that our kids made in the off-season was outrageous. They are moving faster and hitting harder. They are so much more confident than themselves because they are stronger."

Gilbert is in his fourth season as the head coach at St. Joe's. He has a career record of 24-10 and won the Msgr. Martin championship in 2010.

Thursday Night Games in Amherst

Thursday, 6:00 pm and 7:00 pm

One of the unique scheduling quirks in the WNY football season are the traditional Thursday night games held in the Town of Amherst during the Jewish holiday of Yom Kippur.

The timing varies from year to year, but normally falls between week 2 and week 4 during the season. There are only a few other places in the State that also move games, including Long Island and Westchester County. What makes these Thursday games especially unique is that they also serve as a bit of a cross town rivalry. Amherst consists of 4 different school districts with 6 separate high schools. Four of those schools pair up to play the games, Amherst and the three Williamsville (North, South and East) programs.

This year, those contests will be held relatively early, September 12th. Williamsville North will play at Williamsville South, while Williamsville East will be at Amherst.

For many of the kids involved, they'll be facing off against friends and known neighbors. Some of those involved attended elementary and Middle School together. They see each other practicing at local parks and playgrounds. They may even work out together at local gyms.

Not that long ago, all three Williamsville schools played home games at District Field behind South HS. There would be a Friday night game, followed by an afternoon and night game on Saturday.

What makes this year's installment a bit higher in stakes is that the three Williamsville schools are grouped together in the same division for the first time in recent memory. If Amherst hadn't recently dropped from Class A to B in enrollment in the past couple years, all four may have been division rivals.

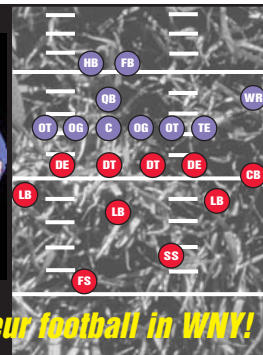
Class A now has three divisions and only 2 teams from each division are guaranteed a playoff spot. That could mean that any game involving one school against another may be the difference between playing in the post season or not.

There hasn't been a shortage of great players and moments that have participated within the district.

Williamsville North has produced the Gronkowski brothers. Also eventually making the NFL were Mark Rubin (Amherst) and Jim Dombrowski (South). During the mid 1980s, the South Billies, led by Chuck Huber, were ranked #1 in New York State. During a Thursday night game in 2009, current University of Buffalo QB Joe Licata set a WNY record by throwing for 492 yards in a win for South over North.

This year, Williamsville North has a passing combo of Ryan Majewski and WR Kolbe Hughes, but will face a South squad that has come close to winning a Sectional title the past few years. Williamsville East has a dynamic QB in Jaleel Battle.

For one night during the football season, all focus is on Main St in the Town of Amherst and the Village of Williamsville. It's a fantastic opportunity to not only watch a few more games and a chance to witness some of the better talent that WNY has to offer.

Lockport Loses in Win

In their annual season-opening rivalry game, Lockport overcame heavy rain and a wet, muddy field to win a slugfest, 7-0 over Starpoint last weekend.

But while the Lions won the game, they lost starting QB Dan Bronson early in the third quarter when the senior suffered a broken collarbone. Bronson was hurt at the end of a 22-yard run up the middle.

"I saw him get hit and I saw him go down," Greg Bronson said. "He was a little slow getting up. He set up the next play and reached down to pick up his mouthpiece."

The simple act of bending over was obviously painful.

"He ran two more plays," Greg Bronson said, "but then he came over to me and said, 'My collarbone is broken.' He knew right away."

Even worse news greeted the Lions on Tuesday.

"It's a clean break," Bronson said, "but he's going to need surgery to put it back together. The doctor said he'll be out eight weeks. We're not too happy, but what are you going to do?"

The decision to have the surgery as soon as possible was easy for the Bronson family.

"He's captain of the basketball and baseball teams," the coach said. "Football is his favorite sport but he wants to be able to play the other sports, too."

While the loss of his starting QB is trouble enough, Bronson has the added pain of watching his own son miss his senior season.

"It's a difficult thing for a coach," Bronson said, "because you don't want to see anybody's kid get hurt. But when it's your own son, it's a bit rougher."

Bronson got emotional when he talked about his son's disappointment.

"He's worked like crazy for his senior year of football," Bronson said. "He's worked as hard as anybody. This hurts. As a parent, this hurts."

Bronson said there was just faint hope that his son will play football for Lockport again.

"Eight weeks takes us into the playoffs," he said. "Daniel's done unless we go far."

Bronson also says that he feels a responsibility to shake off his own hurt for the sake of his team.

"This is a tough break, personally," he said, "but I have 48 other kids out there and I still have to coach those kids. They all still have the same goal. Every kid wants to play for a Sectional

championship, and Daniel does too."

Unfortunately, Greg Bronson is feeling a foreboding sense of *deja vu*.

This has happened before... twice in fact.

Last spring, Dan Bronson was the starting catcher on the Lockport baseball team. One day, he began experiencing intense pain in his abdomen.

"We thought that maybe he had food poisoning," Bronson said. "He woke up next morning and it had not subsided. He

went to baseball practice but he didn't participate. Later that afternoon my wife took him up to the Emergency Care Clinic and they said he needed to go to hospital immediately. At 10:30 that night, they removed his appendix."

Dan missed 10 games while he recovered, but he did make it back to the field before the season ended.

"They won the league title and went to the Section semifinals before losing," his father said.

Could Daniel Bronson again return from an injury to play for a Section 6 title?

"This will be his second surgery in less than 6 months," Greg Bronson said. "So, we'll see. There's always hope."

Bronson said that junior Tyler Fraass will step in at QB.

"He doesn't have the experience at the varsity level," Bronson said, "but he's capable of filling in. Tyler has filled in for Daniel before."

In an odd twist, when Dan Bronson underwent his emergency appendectomy, Fraass is the player who moved from

shortstop to catcher to replace him in the baseball lineup. So, Fraass who played WR and RB in Saturday's win over Starpoint, will once again be called on to fill in for Bronson.

"Tyler was going to be our QB next year," Greg Bronson said. "It's just going to happen earlier than we planned."

Bronson said that his son will attend practice as soon as he is cleared from the surgery.

"Dan will be there at every practice," Bronson said. "He won't miss one. He'll do everything he can to help Tyler out."

Incredibly, this isn't the only time that Greg Bronson has had to replace his senior QB... who happened to be his own son.

His older son, Kevin, suffered a broken hand in Week 2 of his senior year in a win over North Tonawanda.

"That was the first time we had beaten North Tonawanda in 11 years," Greg said. "That should have been a big day for us, too. It's kind of strange that it's happening again."

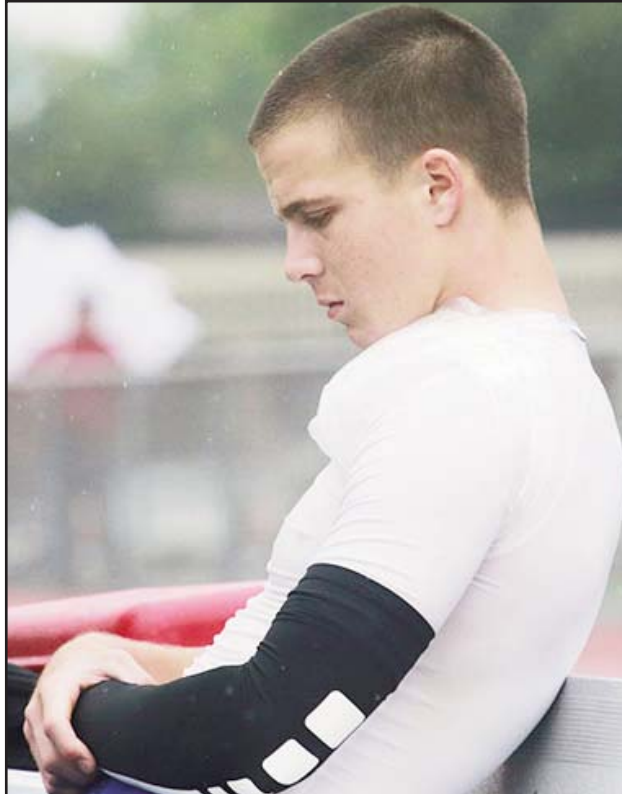
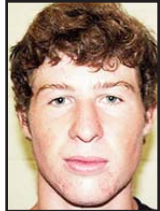

Jamestown opened the season with a 52-14 win over Niagara Falls. The Red Raiders scored on their first drive, then forced a turnover to set up a 2nd TD drive.

In fact, Jamestown scored on all six possessions in the first half and took a 52-0 lead at the break.

"It was the perfect storm," coach Tom Langworthy said. "We scored, pinned them back with good special teams and the defense forced quick 3-and-outs."

Jamestown, which has lost in the Section 6 title game the past two years, is one of the favorites to play for the title again.

"Our kids are very motivated," Langworthy said. "They don't need

to think about last year to be motivated. They are motivated for this year. We want to play good football every weekend and they know it will get harder each week."

If Jamestown is going to get a third straight try at the Class AA title, the Raiders will be relying heavily on the

play of senior lineman Eric Tingue.

Tingue (6-0, 210) won't intimidate opponents with his size.

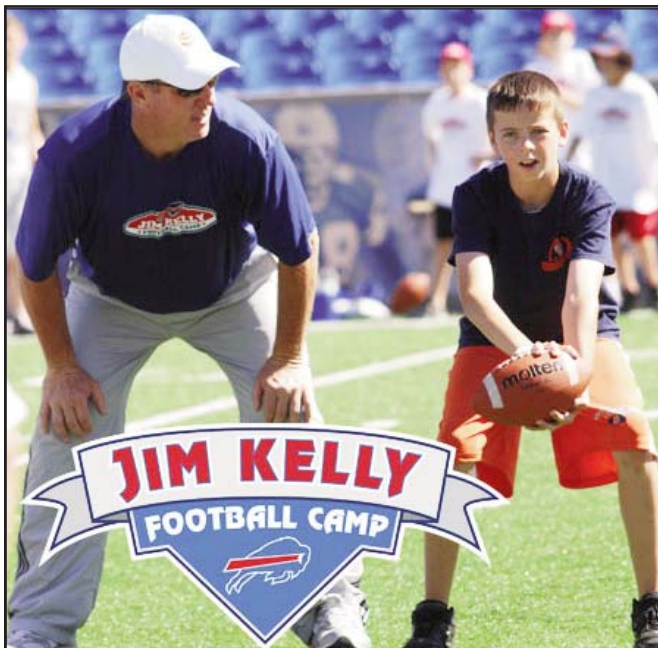
"He's not huge," Langworthy said.

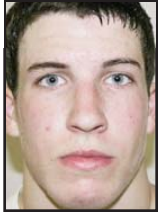

Evert leads Sweet Home

Sweet Home overcame typical early-season sloppiness to earn a tough 27-13 road win at Iroquois last weekend.

"It was a good game," Sweet Home coach John Faller said, "but we had 15 penalties for 110 yards. That was our fault. You make mistakes and you pay for them. We kept putting ourselves in a hole."

Sweet Home has just 4 returning starters on offense and defense.

"A lot of kids were playing their first varsity game," Faller said. "It could have been nerves but that many penalties shouldn't happen."

Junior QB Kevin Torrillo completed 10 of 17 passes for 129 yards and 2 TDs.

He was intercepted once.

"Kevin managed the offense real well," Faller said. "He did a good job for his first varsity game."

Junior RB Jordan Evert kept the Panthers offense moving as he ran for 158 yards on 16 carries. Evert also caught 2

passes for 44 yards, including a 30-yard TD in the 3rd quarter that gave Sweet Home a 14-6 lead. Evert also intercepted a pass on defense.

"We're trying to play him on both

sides of the ball," Faller said. "Last year, he didn't play much on defense but this year we will need him on both sides."

Evert (6-1, 185) rushed for 879 yards and 18 TDs, both team highs. He also served as the team's back-up QB.

"It was a lot for him to take in to play that many positions," Faller said, "but he did a good job with that. Now he has a year of varsity experience. We are looking at him to do some big things."

Evert plays guard for the Sweet Home basketball team. He also started for the varsity baseball team and was named the team's MVP.

"Jordan is definitely one of our best athletes," Faller said. "We'll need him on the field a lot this year."

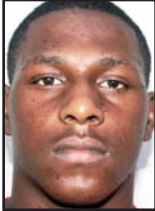

Rutledge Leads Macks

McKinley opened the season with a tense 14-12 win over Williamsville North last week.

"It was a defensive battle," McKinley coach Ed Wilson said. "There was not a whole lot of offense going on for either team. It was the first game of the season and we had a lot of mistakes. But we made it through and got the win."

Wilson says he feels good about his roster in 2013. Stephon Johnson, Rey Jordan and Cliff Brown all graduated from last year's playoff team.

"We're a young team with just a few veterans here and there," he said. "We have some adjusting to do. We have to find some guys who can step up but I think we have as good a chance as anybody else this season."

Senior QB Jamar Rutledge will be a key player this season.

"This is his second year starting," Wilson said. "Jamar would have started as

a sophomore but he broke his wrist early in the season. He was hurt on the first play of the game against North Tonawanda."

Rutledge passed for 1,061 yards and 11 TDs last season.

"He ran the offense consistently," Wilson said. "He gets other kids in the position they are supposed to be. He knows the play-book inside and out."

Rutledge is a returning captain. "Jamar's leadership has picked up," Wilson said. "He tries to bring the guys together and get them on the same page of music."

Rutledge, who has an academic average in the 90s, rushed for 380

yards and 4 TDs in 2012.

"He's a smart guy and a hard worker," Wilson said. "He's on the honor roll in school. He's fast but he can stay in the pocket and throw the football. He's the best QB we've had at McKinley in a long time."

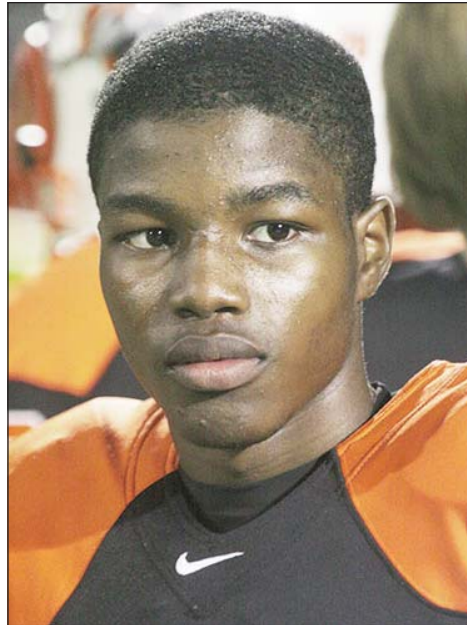

Leonard Leads South Park

South Park started the season with a 14-8 win over Hutch Tech last weekend.

"I thought we played well," South Park coach Tim Delaney said. "We were a little sloppy and turned the ball over a couple times but that's not unusual in the first game of the season."

Delaney said that he was happy with most of the offense.

"We scored in four plays on the first drive of the game," he said. "and we ran the ball very well."

More importantly, the Sparks defense was fierce.

"We played great on defense," Delaney said. "We put pressure on the QB, we had a number of sacks. We had an interception that was big."

South Park's new QB Tyler Mascio completed 9 of 12 passes for 90 yards.

"He's still getting used to what we do," Delaney said. "He's been with us for three weeks. I know that he'll get even better than he was against Hutch Tech."

Qadree Ollison will lead Canisius against Aquinas this weekend

Canisius opened the season with an emphatic 42-15 win over McQuaid last weekend. It was the 12th straight win for the Crusaders.

"We made some first-week mistakes," Canisius coach Rich Robbins said. "Both touchdowns that McQuaid scored were on defense. We had some sloppy stuff that we need to clean up."

The Canisius defense allowed just 46 yards and two first downs.

"We played well on defense," Robbins said. "McQuaid is a pretty good football team."

The emphatic victory announced that the Crusaders are dead serious about matching last season's perfect 11-0 record.

"These kids have said right from the start they want to go 11-0 again," Robbins said. "I think we are better than last year. In the skill positions and on defense, we are better than we were last year."

Entering this season, the biggest question for Canisius was the offensive line, which saw four starters graduate, including Trench Trophy winner Ryan Hunter.

"We had some very good linemen last year," Robbins said, "but, this year, our kids are 15 pounds heavier on average. They just need to keep getting experience."

Senior running back Qadree Ollison rushed for 195 yards and 4 TDs on just 20 carries while playing just over half the game.

"He played half of the third quarter and then we took him out," Robbins said.

Two days after his big game, Ollison announced that he was verbally accepting a scholarship offer to play football at the University of Pittsburgh in the Fall of 2014.

he's bigger, stronger and faster. We're excited about him."

Ollison rushed for 1,876 yards and 26 TDs last year. He was named 1st-team All-state as his team finished the season as the top-ranked Class AA team in NY State. He was named the Player of the Year by the Football Weekly and co-Player of the Year by the Buffalo News.

Ollison was also a Connolly Cup finalist but the award, given to the best football player in WNY, went to Alden's Corey Barczykowski.

"Qadree won everything except the Connolly Cup," Robbins said. "He absolutely plans on leaving no doubt about who will win the Connolly Cup this year. It's the only trophy he does not have in his trophy case."

"His dad and I knew he was down to two schools," Robbins said. "But he kept his decision to himself. Until he got to the podium, we had no idea which way he was going to go."

Robbins said that he suspected Qadree would choose Pitt.

"Pitt made him a priority," Robbins said. "They offered him a scholarship the first time they met him. He felt wanted right away."

Robbins said that the chance to play immediately at Pitt was also an attraction for Ollison.

"He'll get a chance to be 'the guy' as early as next year," Robbins said, "and I know he wants to play right away."

Ollison certainly looked the part of a big-time football recruit in the win over McQuaid.

"He put on about 15 pounds of muscle since last season," Robbins said, "and his 40-times are faster than last year. He's another year older,

Robbins said that Ollison wants to make the decision easy for the Connolly Cup committee.

"He is way more focused on team goals than individual goals," Robbins said, "but he wants to have a great year. Just like the rest of the kids, he wants to win all of our football games, win the Msgr. Martin championship and finish 11-0 again."

In order to reach those goals, Ollison will have to face one of the top programs in the Northeast this week when the Crusaders head back to Rochester to face Aquinas.

It may be the toughest opponent Canisius will see this season.

"Aquinas is an established program and one of the top teams in the Northeast," Robbins said. "We absolutely had a great year last year but Aquinas has been doing this a long time. Any time you play Aquinas, it's a measuring stick for your program."

The road to 11-0, for Canisius, goes through Rochester.

"You can't say you are number-one in the state if you don't beat Aquinas," Robbins said. "For us to reach our goals, Friday night is a game we have to win."

Canisius beat Aquinas 35-7 in 2012... the school's first win over Aquinas since 1946. Aquinas was 21-0 against Msgr. Martin teams until losing to Canisius.

"They have had our number for a long time," Robbins said. "We beat them at home last year. Going into their house on a Friday night is a completely different animal. They are a very good team with a very good defense."

Aquinas is 81-21 over the past decade, including several NYS championships. Aquinas sports a home record of 36-7 in that time. The only team with a winning record against the Little Irish is Cathedral Prep of Erie, Pa., which has beaten Aquinas four times in five games.

Robbins has played at Aquinas 4 times in recent years.

"Every time we got our tails kicked by 40 or 50 points," he said. "Aquinas is very tough to beat at home."

Going into such a pit, would seem to be a fitting challenge for a running back that just committed to Pitt.

"Aquinas is a great team," Ollison said. "They are great every year. They always have athletes all over the field."

Ollison said that Aquinas will remember the loss the Irish suffered at Canisius last season.

"They were at the top and we knocked them off," he said. "That will make them even more hungry to play us. They are going to try and knock us off now."

Ollison did say it was nice to be able to focus on Aquinas, and not his recruiting process any longer.

"It's nice once you finally pick the one school," Ollison said. "I feel like Pitt was the place I wanted to live for the next four years, and potentially the rest of my life. I don't have to worry about talking to coaches from five different schools every night now. I can just focus on playing football for Canisius and winning the rest of our games."

Robbins said that his running back will benefit from the early announcement.

"I think he's relieved to just be a Crusader for the next ten weeks," Robbins said.

Colafranceschi is an outstanding student with an academic average of 95. He is also a member of the National Honor Society and the Academy of Finance.

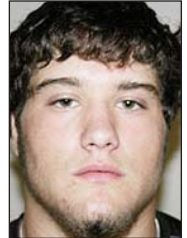
"He's a great student and very studious," Dickson said. "A lot of teachers in the building like him. He's a very bright kid and involved in a lot of things in school."
