# Bronson Honored for Win at OP

Lockport Greg Bronson was a unanimous selection as the Buffalo Bills / U.S. National Guard Coach of the Week after his Lions made headlines with a 33-27 win at Orchard Park last weekend.

"It's nice to get Coach of the Week," Bronson said. "but the kids are the ones doing it. I wasn't even at practice on Wednesday."

Bronson missed practice last week because his son, Daniel, was undergoing surgery for a broken collarbone he suffered in the team's season-opening win over Starpoint.

"They put a plate and 8 screws on it," Greg Bronson said. "He's feeling much better. He's excited to get back to school and get back into the swing of things. He wants to come to practice and start helping us."

The Lions, with backup QB Tyler Fraass directing the offense, took a 33-13 lead in the 4th quarter and then held on for the win. It was the first home loss for Orchard Park since the 2006 season.

"We are fortunate to have kids who believe in each other," Bronson said. "I'm fortunate to have coaches that want to work hard at football."

Bronson admitted that he has endured an incredible swing of emotions over the past week - from his son getting injured and needing surgery to winning a game no one in Western New York thought the Lions would win.

"Absolutely," he said. "This is tough but I'm getting better about it. The last seven days have been pretty wild."

Bronson says that he was not shocked that his team came away with an upset victory.

"I can understand why people would be surprised," he said. "Orchard Park hasn't lost there in 7 years. They are a team that traditionally makes a trip to Section Finals and beyond. They have won the most Section 6 titles by far and two New York State Championships. It's a great program that doesn't lose very many games."

But Bronson feels he has a good squad this season. "We knew our defense had some playmakers," he said. "We know we are pretty good team. We're not surprised because we knew we could play well."

Bronson said that this group of players has been good for a while.

"These guys all played modified football together," he said, "and they were 6 points away from having an undefeated season on the JV team when they were 9th graders. They are a very close bunch and they play hard for each other."

Bronson said that the character training the program has been using for the past three seasons is starting to show results on the field.

"We have been making progress with the development of character with these guys," he said. "They are starting to understand the impact that relationships within a team have on your ability to perform on the field. A team really can perform at a level that is higher than the sum of its parts if people lift each other up."

As Lockport's starting QB,

Bronson led the Lions to Rich Stadium for a Sectional game in the fall of 1981.

"All the division winners played up there," he said, "but there wasn't really any Section champion. We were in Division III then and we beat Iroquois 21-8."

That season, the City of Lockport was beyond excited about high school football.

Not only did Lockport finish 9-0, but DeSales (the local Catholic school which has since closed) also finished 9-0.

"There were huge crowds at every game," Bronson said. "We had an extremely talented group of kids playing ball at that time. In fact, the coach at DeSales was Paul Vosburgh, who is now the head coach at St. John Fisher. It was a very exciting time."

Bronson is in his 7th season as head coach at Lockport and has a career record of 30-26.

## Remembering The Yellow Jersey

Friday, 7:00 pm @ Orchard Park

To say that Orchard Park is favored this week against Clarence is an understatement. In their last 9 regular season meetings, OP is 8-1 and has outscored the Red Devils 343-99. The Quakers have scored at least 28 points in every meeting, even the game that they lost. In those 8 wins, the closest margin of victory was 21 points in 2006 (35-14). It will be a daunting task to overcome that sort of dominance.

But, in 2010, Clarence turned "Yellow" and beat OP.

That was a special year for the Red Devils. Not only did they win the Section VI title, but they beat Orchard Park twice that year. Both games fall into the category of "epic."

In Week 2 of the 2010 regular season, OP visited Clarence in what is now widely remembered as "The Yellow Jersey Game."



Typically, the home team wears dark colored jerseys, but the Quakers showed up wearing their maroon shirts. There had been a mix up regarding the JV game between the


schools the night before and OP had to use some of its Varsity white jerseys for that contest. The Clarence Varsity players didn't have their white jerseys on hand when OP showed up on Friday night, leaving two teams with similar dark colored jerseys. The Clarence black and OP maroon were too close in color. The solution before game time was for Clarence to wear yellow practice jerseys (pinnies). Led by QB Zach Lauricella and RB Mike Gelz, Clarence finally beat OP 37-28 in a thrilling, back-and-forth game. The legend of the yellow jersey was born.

Later in 2010, the two teams met at the Ralph for the Class AA Title. Clarence ran out onto the field holding a yellow jersey attached to a stick. In another thrilling affair, the teams were tied 28-28 with just seconds left in the game.

Clarence kicker Stephen Hughes ran onto the field to try a 37-yard FG. Hughes made "The Kick" as time expired to give the Red Devils the win.

Incredibly, it was Hughes' very first FG attempt!

The tale of Clarence and the Yellow Jersey is about the underdog fighting off demons and prevailing. It may be another 10 years before Clarence upends OP. Maybe they'll be wearing a special Yellow Jersey when they do.



#### Brandon Ball - Springville



# Medina Moving with ‘Munjie’

Medina used a punishing ground attack and a crisp passing attack as they rolled up 522 yards of total offense in a 44-14 win over Maryvale last weekend.

The Mustangs are now 2-0 and have outscored their opponents 92-20 on the season. Only five teams have scored more points than Medina.

“The season is still early,” coach Eric Valley said, “but I’m feeling real good about what we have done so far. We have been able to spread the ball around and we have played good defense. The kids have played well.”

The Mustangs showed nice balance as they rushed for 277 yards and passed for 250 yards in the win over Maryvale. Medina had a 200-yard rusher (Dan Brown with 203 yards) and a 100-yard receiver (Kyle Barna with 104 yards). In addition, QB Jason Hellwig passed for 250 yards and connected with six different receivers.

“That’s exactly what we are looking for,” Valley said. “We want to be able to do a lot of different things on offense and, so far, it’s worked out pretty well.”

The fact that Medina has piled up so many yards and scored so many points surprises a lot of area fans.

It doesn’t surprise Valley.

“Last year, we scored 330 points in 9 games,” he said. “That was actually a school-record for points in a season. I knew with the kids we had returning we could put some points on the board.”

Valley says that the Mustangs actually started slowly last season as QB Jason Hellwig learned the varsity game.

“Jason was a new quarterback and he was just a sophomore,” Valley said. “It took us a little while to get going. Once Jason got his feet under him, we were able to be pretty productive on offense. We won the Funke Bowl Tournament so we thought we had a pretty good team.”

Medina has also served notice that it is a contender for the B North Division title, especially since perennial powers Alden and Depew moved to the South Division.

“I think everyone in our division breathed a huge sigh of relief when we heard they were moving to the South,” Valley said. “There are still some good football teams in our division but it’s nice not to see Alden or Depew on the schedule anymore.”

This week, Medina will play its first league game when the

Mustangs host Akron. Valley says that the teams have the potential to short out the scoreboard on Friday.

“Akron plays a different style this year,” Valley said. “Their last two teams played smash-mouth football. But this year, Akron is a Spread, No-huddle team. Defensively, we are going to have to change our game plan if we hope to slow them down.”

The Mustangs will also be hoping for a lot of production from Dan “Munjie” Brown, who has rushed for 304 yards and 3 TDs on just 30 carries this season.

Incredibly, Munjie missed the first four games last season and the Mustangs still finished 6-3.

“When he came back, he was a defensive starter and a back-up on offense,” Valley said. “This year, we had a couple of graduating seniors that left some holes in our offense. Munjie has filled those holes very nicely.”

Whatever Brown does on the field this season, he already has one of the greatest nicknames in WNY history.

“When he was real little, he loved that movie Jumanji,” Valley said. “He called the movie ‘Munjie.’ His parents started calling him that and the nickname stuck. Now, everyone calls him Munjie... even the teachers in school. A lot of people don’t even know his name is Dan.”

Munjie Brown will be a serious offensive weapon for Medina before the year is over. He is 6-5 and 185 pounds and has very good speed.

“Some people might think he is too tall to play running back,”

Valley said. “He IS big and tall but he runs with a nice combination of speed and power. With his running style, he reminds me of Eric Dickerson.”

Valley said that Munjie is a lot stronger than he looks.

“He’s not skinny by any means,” Valley said. “He benches around 225, which is nothing crazy but for someone with his long arm length, he doesn’t struggle at all.”

Brown also starts at guard for the Medina basketball team.

“He’s a very good basketball player but I think his first love is football,” Valley said. “He could absolutely play college football. By the end of the season, I think there will be a lot of interest in him.”

Munjie was voted as a team captain before the season.

“He is well-liked and respected at school,” Valley said. “He’s a hard-working kid. He’s a good student and he’s very respectful to the teachers. He’s a great kid to have on the team.”



# QB Wins first Varsity Start

Lockport made headlines around WNY when the Lions beat Orchard Park 33-27 last weekend. It was Orchard Park's first loss at home since the 2006 season

"We've been close to beating them for a few years,"

Lockport coach Greg Bronson said. "but we haven't been able to get over the hump. We lost in double-over-time in 2009."

Lockport played without starting QB Dan Bronson who broke his collarbone in Week 1.

"We definitely would prefer to have our 3-year starter," Greg Bronson said, "but he's not available and you can't cancel the game."

### Backup QB

Tyler Fraass completed 7 of 11 passes for 125 yards and 2 TDs. He also passed for a 2-point PAT.

"I told a number of people that he was a good quarterback," Bronson said. "He started on our JV team last year and they went 6-2."

The Lions lost to Orchard Park twice

last season, including a loss in the Class AA semifinals which ended the season.

"We were ahead at the half," Bronson said, "and we weren't able to close out the game. I think the kids wanted some redemption."

In addition to running the offense, Fraass recovered the onside kick that sealed the win.

"He hadn't taken any snaps since the summer," Bronson said, "but he got all the reps this week."

Fraass was thrust into the spotlight in his first varsity start.

"I think he was a little nervous," Bronson said. "You could see in warm-ups he wasn't real accurate. I think he was feeling some pressure."

However, once the game started,

Fraass was a cool customer.

"He's already had 2 varsity baseball seasons," Bronson said. "He's a very steady personality and he is very even-keeled. He has a very quiet confidence about him and that is very important after what has transpired over the last week."

# Smith Runs Hard for Ken East

Kenmore East beat Starpoint 22-0 last weekend to improve to 2-0. It is the first time that the Bulldogs started with two wins since 2001, when they won their first four games.

"It's certainly a lot more exciting when you are 2-0," Kenmore East coach Matt Chimera said. "These kids work really hard, but, it doesn't feel like work when you are winning."

Kenmore East has now won 6 of 7 games, dating to last season. The Bulldogs finished 4-1 and won the Class A Bowl Tournament.

One veteran who will play a big role this season is junior WR Kam Varner,







"He never gives up. He gets knocked down, gets back up and makes plays."


Myers (5-10, 270) starts at OT and DT. He was named a 2nd-team all-star in 2012.

# Run-n-Gun Raiders

*QB Jake Sisson is throwing for a lot of yards and piling up points*

Jamestown is serving notice that they may be the favorites to win the Section 6 Class AA title this season.

The Red Raiders, who trailed 28-24 halfway through the third quarter, turned on the jets to beat Kenmore West 50-28 last week.

It was the second straight week the Raiders scored 50 points. Jamestown beat Niagara Falls 52-14 in the season opener.

"It's a lot of points," Jamestown coach Tom Langworthy said, "but we actually feel like we could have done better."

Langworthy says that one of his points of emphasis in the pre-season was scoring more points.

"We are running a hurry-up offense and we are running more plays," he said. "One thing we wanted to do was score more points. So far, we've been able to do that."

But, the coach isn't entirely satisfied yet. Langworthy pointed to several missed opportunities against Kenmore West as evidence that the Raiders can do even better.

"We drove down inside the Kenmore West 5-yard line," he said, "and we threw an interception. We came away with no points and that's a critical mistake. We had a TD called back by penalty, which is another critical mistake."

Langworthy said that as the season progresses, the Raiders will be less likely to get away with sloppy errors.

"A lot of these games are really close in AA ball," he said. "It's just a mistake here or there that can change a game. There is a lot that we can improve upon."

There were other times in the early part of the game that Jamestown did not finish a promising drive.

Orchard Park.

Langworthy said that he has not brought up the losses in the championship games. He refuses to use the losses as motivation this season.

"We have the same goals we always have," he said. "We want to get better every week and we want to win every game as it comes. We have an experienced group and I don't need to bring up the past to motivate them to play well."

One reason that Jamestown has made themselves the favorite to win the title this season has been the play of senior QB Jake Sisson.

In the win over Kenmore West, Sisson completed 21

"Kenmore West played a great game and they are a really good team," he said. "There were a couple spots in the game where it was really uncomfortable. But our kids didn't have any doubt and hung in there. They just kept playing ball and I was really pleased with that."

Jamestown has experienced the ultimate in frustration the past two seasons.

of 40 passes for a Section 6 record 508 yards. He also threw 6 TD passes.

"Kenmore West took away our running game," Langworthy said. "We had to throw the ball and Jake rose to the occasion."

And while the 508 yards is definitely a Section 6 record, Langworthy says he is unsure if the 6 TDs is even a school record.

"We're still trying to check that," he said. "I think it is a school record but I'm not 100 percent sure. We don't have a record book and this school has been playing football a long time. It's certainly a record for as long as I have been around."

Langworthy says he feels confident with Sisson at the controls of the offense.

"He is a captain of our team," he said. "Jake is a good leader and the other kids look up to him. He's just a tremendous person to have on the team."

Langworthy says that Sisson is one of the hardest-working kids he has coached.

"Jake is a great kid," he said. "He has been at 100 percent of our off-season stuff. He's in the weight room three days a week all year long. His dad would drop him off at school at 6am every Monday, Tuesday and Thursday all year long. His parents even drove back early from a vacation in Florida so he wouldn't miss one of our 7-on-7 games at the Ralph in March."

But Sisson does more than just work on football. He is also a member of the Jamestown basketball and baseball teams.

"He did all this work even though he had basketball and baseball practice after school," Langworthy said. "He would have had an easy way to get out of working for football. We would have understood because we want kids to play other sports. But he still took the opportunity to lift and get ready for football."

Sisson (6-1, 205) is also a member of the school's Honor Roll and maintains a 96 academic average.

"He's a gifted athlete," Langworthy said, "but he takes academics very seriously. He's a very focused young man."

Sisson is focused on scoring points this season.

"Our objective is to get points on the board in a hurry," he said. "The coaches set out the game plan for us and then it's all in the preparation that week."

Against Kenmore West, Sisson did not know how many passing yards he had until late in the game.

"I found out on the last play we ran," he said. "Coach told me I was at 498 and he wanted to get me to 500 so we ran a hitch to Ben Larson. That was the first time I heard that I was first time I heard I had that many yards. I wasn't keeping track I just wanted to make sure we won the game."

Sisson wants to win a lot of games this season.

"I really want to play for a state championship," he said. "My goal is to play for a championship in the Carrier Dome this season."

## Damon Janes dies at 16

Every person associated in any way with high school football in Western New York was heart broken when the news hit that Westfield Damon Janes died this week.

"Everybody shares the same sentiments," Section 6 Chairman Ken Stoldt said. "We are just incredibly sad about this. I can't even put it into words. We just want to offer our prayers for Damon's family and for the communities of Westfield, Brocton and Portville."

Janes died three days after Westfield's loss to Portville.

It was reported that Janes died after suffering a helmet-to-helmet collision but that is now being called into question. (See story on page 55.)

Stoldt says that he has an open offer for anything that the his organization could help with Janes' family or either community involved with the tragedy.

"If there is anything that can be done to help with this, we want to do it," he said. "I hope all the communities and the schools understand that whatever Section 6 can do to support, we we'll help in any way we can."

Stoldt has been around WNY football for a long time and said that nothing this tragic has ever occurred. "Nothing of this magnitude," he said. "There just isn't any way that anyone can prepare themselves for

this. There are a lot of people thinking the same thing. You can't downplay what happened. It's just devastating for everybody."

Stoldt also has a more personal take on Janes' death. He has two sons that play football. His son Tyler is a QB at Brockport State and his son Brian is a QB at Alden.

"As coaches we have to emphasize safety in every way possible," he said. "As a dad, yes, I worry about it. I worry about it every time one of my boys steps on a field."

Stoldt emphasized that situations like this are rare in football.

"Regardless of your sport or your activity, head injuries are a possibility," he said.

"But the leading cause of concussions is riding bikes. It can happen anywhere. Just last week, a

Niagara University soccer goalie hit her head on the goal posts and was in the hospital."

Stoldt also says that he is certain that every coach in WNY had a talk with his players about player safety and hits to the head.

"I know that every single coach is thinking the same thing," he said. "What can I do? Are there things I could do to make my program safer. And while we can teach proper technique and have medical people ready if case something happens, there are some things you just can't control."

# No 'Helmet-to-Helmet'



On Friday night, Westfield's star running back Damon Janes left the Wolverine's game at Portville shortly after scoring what would be his last varsity TD.

Word quickly spread throughout Western New York that Janes had suffered some sort of catastrophic head injury and was in a dangerous situation.

By Monday evening, the 16-year-old junior was dead.

When word of Damon's death hit the news, every person with any ties at all to high school football in Western New York felt crushing heart break.

Such stunning, and tragic, events rarely happen in football... but now it HAD happened... and right in our own back yard.

The next day, *The Buffalo News* ran the story on the front page with the headline, "High School Player dies after Helmet-to-Helmet collision."

Within hours, Janes' death was national news as websites from Sports Illustrated, ESPN, the New York Times and other national news outlets picked up the story.

By Tuesday afternoon, it was world wide news as websites from the UK Journal and media outlets in Japan and throughout Europe published the same story.

Only, maybe, what's being reported is not what happened.

Portville coach Gary Swetland says there was NO helmet-to-helmet hit in the game.

"That is not at all what transpired," Swetland said. "There was no collision that stopped the contest. There was no penalty called at any time."

Such a revelation is odd, given area referees' insistence on flagging ANY helmet-to-helmet hits this season... even accidental hits to the helmet are flagged.

"It was a well-played, clean contest," Swetland said. "It was stopped suddenly because of whatever happened on the Westfield sidelines."

Witnesses say that Janes was tackled on a running play in which he gained 8 yards. He got up after the play and went to the Westfield sidelines.

"No player ever stayed down on the field," Swetland said. "None of our players had any sense that anything was wrong."

As the teams lined up for the next play, the referee blew the whistle and approached Swetland.

"The referee told me that Westfield had an injured player and needed a medical professional," Swetland said. "We sent our trainer over but there was no sense that anything really bad had happened."

As the teams again lined up for the 3rd-and-short play, the referee blew the whistle again.

"I thought Westfield had called a timeout," Swetland said. "The ref came over and asked me to come out to midfield because the Westfield coaches wanted to talk to me."

Swetland was still unsure as to what was happening.

"When I got to midfield," he said, "they told me that they had an injured player and that they had to end the game. I asked them if they needed anything. I offered our locker room, whatever they needed. They said that they had an injured player and they were going to the hospital with him."

In fact, Swetland did not find out the severity of Janes' injury until the next morning.

"My Superintendent called me," he said. "He told me that the young man might die. I was stunned. I was just baffled."

At that point, Swetland got out the game films.

"I watched the films," he said. "I didn't see any helmet-to-helmet hit. There was nothing on that film that would lead anyone to believe that a young man would die. Absolutely nothing."

Swetland, now worried about Janes and worried about the effect on his own players, began watching the film intently.

"I watched it over and over," he said. "I must have watched it a hundred times from beginning to end. I watched every single play very, very closely. I didn't see anything. A catastrophic hit just didn't happen. The game films don't reveal anything, and believe me, I looked at every play as close as possible. There is nothing there."

Swetland was so certain of this that he actually showed the game film to his players.

"I reviewed it with the players so that none of them has to think that they are the one who caused this," he said. "There is no violent collision. There is no wounded or damaged player on that film. I'm not a doctor but there is nothing that would lead any-

one to believe that a player would lose his life that night."

This fact, while significant, does not make Swetland feel any better about anything.

"It doesn't change anything," he said. "Nobody's better off for it. A boy died and it's still a tragedy. The Janes family is still emotionally destroyed. I feel terrible even bringing it up. But nothing happened in that game to cause that boy to die. Whatever happened that night, happened on the sidelines."

Swetland called Portville Superintendent Thomas Simon. They met and watched the film together.

"He didn't see anything either," Swetland said. "When we were done watching it, he put the game film in the safe at the school."

If there was no catastrophic collision and no helmet-to-helmet hit, it makes Janes' death an awful mystery. We have yet to hear from a coroner or any doctor that performed an autopsy. We have yet to hear from any medical professional as to why Damon Janes died.

Only one thing is certain.

A 16-year-old boy is dead and everyone is heartbroken.
