

Delaney Honored For A South Title

South Park coach Tim Delanev was named the Buffalo Bills / NY National Guard Coach of the Week after his Sparks beat West Seneca East 22-0 last weekend.

Entering the game, West Seneca East was the 13thranked Class A team in NYS while South Park was an Honorable Mention selection.

South Park opened the scoring in the second guarter when TJ Scott burst in from a yard out. A successful 2point PAT gave South Park an 8-0 lead.

Late in the second guarter, another turnover led directly to a TD. Sparks' LB William Burgess hit the QB as he

was trying to pass. Austin Neal intercepted the pass and returned it 22 yards for a TD.

"That was huge," Delaney said. "We were expecting to go into the locker room up 8-0. It was just a huge turning point in the game."

In the third guarter, South Park QB Tyler Mascio threw a 25yard TD pass to Brandon Jefferson giving the Sparks a 22-0 lead. The defense finished the shut out.

With the win. the Sparks clinched the A South Division

championship for the first time since they joined Section 6 four seasons ago.

"I think the kids were very focused on winning the division," Delaney said. "There was a little bit of a different feel from the time we got on the bus until we kicked off. Everybody was a little more serious and focused."

Delaney says that his team played their best game of the season in the win over West Seneca East.

"We felt like we won the game in all phases," he said. "The kids were physical. If we play like that, we can play with anybody in our class."

This has been a difficult year for Delaney to get ready for. In March, he was informed that his team would be merging with Middle College for the upcoming football season.

Delaney was informed that his program was going to

be merging with Middle College High School, giving the Sparks an influx of new players to meet and work into the program. He also had to provide the South Park kids with a solid off-season program.

"We have a really good group of guys this year," he said. "They want to win. They are good football players and they put in the time and the effort to get better."

Delaney had solid attendance at his team's off-season functions - from both schools.

"These kids did the 7-on-7 tournament," he said, "they were in the weight room and went to the summer camps.

When the new kids came in, they saw the commitment from the South Park kids. They understood that we were serious about winning football games."

Delaney is hoping that the Sparks have started a new winning tradition at South Park.

"I think this is the start of something great," he said, "but it's been a long time coming. It's taken a lot of work from a lot of people.

Delanev was named the South Park the head 2008 season. South Park had

> lost 18 consecutive games and had scored all of 12 points in 2007.


"It was tough," he said. "We had minimal resources. I had one assistant that I didn't get to choose. At the time, I had no idea how much work being a head coach is. I had to find people that were willing to commit time and energy to these kids for no pay. It wasn't easy."

Delaney, who played football at South Park and won the Harvard Cup in 1998, says that his father, Tim Sr., has been his biggest supporter.

"My father doesn't coach," Delaney said, "but he does everything else. He makes sure our equipment is ready, he makes sure we have enough water, he gives kids rides if they need it. He does a million things that nobody sees but makes it easier for us to just coach football. He's really been incredible."

Back To The Future

Friday, 7:00 pm, Canisius @ Bishop Timon Everyone knows that Canisius and St. Joe's is the "big" rivalry in the Monsignor Martin Association. The rivalry has been featured as one of the Nation's Best Rivalry's and has

But there was a time when Canisius and Bishop Timon were fierce competitors for MMA supremacy.

For most of the 1970s and 1980s, those two programs dominated the league... and for good reason. Both teams had a legendary coaches stalking the sidelines. Johnny Barnes led Canisius while Paul Fitzpatrick oversaw the Timon squad.

Barnes coached for an amazing 42 years and amassed



a WNY-record 287 wins. Most people are familiar with Canisius' record 42-0-1 unbeaten streak between 1972 and 1977, but most people don't realize Barnes actually retired in the middle of that streak. He had coached the Crusaders to undefeated 8-0 seasons in 1972 and 1973 and had his team ranked #2 in New York, then he walked away.

The program he built would Timon coach Charlie Comerford. maintain its momentum winning titles for the next 5 sea-

sons going 38-2-1 during that stretch.

Canisius' reign as MMA champs ended after 1978. Timon had hired Fitzpatrick, a former player, to take over the program that same year.

"Coach Fitz" would lead the Tigers to a championship in 1979, and add 4 more titles in the 1980s ('83, '84, '85 and '88).

The 1985 team went undefeated and was ranked #2 in New York State. While he didn't coach as long as Barnes Barnes, Fitzpatrick still won 161 games, which places him 13th in WNY history.

Canisius has returned to the top of the Monsignor Martin Association, winning titles in 2009 and 2012. Coach Rich Robbins, led the Crusaders to the state's top ranking after an undefeated season in 2012.

In a strange twist, Timon is once again trying to regain past glory by hiring a former player.

Charlie Comerford led Timon to the MMA championship game last fall where the Tigers lost to Canisius 28-20.

This will be the teams' first meeting since last fall's championship game.

Panthers Try for A North Title

Sweet Home won a hard-fought battle 19-7 over Grand Island last weekend to clinch at least a tie for the A North Division title. The Panthers will try and win the division outright when they play at Kenmore East this weekend.

"We'll enjoy this one," Sweet Home coach John faller said,

"but we have another big game next week. As we go along now, all the games are going to be tough."

The Panthers win over Grand Island was hard hitting and fiercely contested throughout.

"There wasn't a lot of scoring but there was a lot of big plays," Faller said. "Both teams had turnovers, fumbles, interceptions. Both teams had some good drives and big plays. We saw some good defense on both sides of the ball, too."

Sweet Home scored with :14 left in the first half to take a 13-7 lead at the break. The Panthers scored again in the third quarter to take a 19-7 lead.

"It definitely wasn't a runaway," Faller said. "Grand Island gave us some pressure. We bent a little bit but we shut them out in the second half."

Faller also said that his team would have to improve if they were going to win a 7th straight Section 6 Class A title.

"We've won by some big scores this year," he said, "but now these games

are going to get tighter. We can't afford the mistakes and the penalties."

Faller said that, despite the public perception, this Panthers squad is not a veteran unit.

"We have a lot of young kids," Faller said. "We have a lot of juniors and a few sophomores, in the lineup, too. This is a different team than we had last year. This was our first game where we were pushed really hard. That experience will make a big difference in how far we go this year."

One first-time starter who played well in a tough game was junior QB Kevin Torrillo, the younger brother of last year's All-WNY quarterback Mike Torrillo.

"Kevin is not his brother," Faller said. "They are different kids and different quarterbacks. But Kevin is getting better and

better each week and he's helping us out."

Torrillo completed 15 of 24 passes for 210 yards and 3 touchdowns in the win at Grand Island. He threw an early interception but a stout defensive stand held Grand Island out of the end zone

"I think that interception right away got him rattled a bit,"

Faller said, "but he came back and played well. That's one of the things he has to learn. Things aren't always going to go our way and the question is how we handle it."

Torrillo tossed scoring passes of 29, 20 and 12 yards.

The junior QB hit Jordan Evert with a 20-yard TD pass on fourth down in the second quarter. He hit Brandon Smiley with a TD pass on 4th-and-12 with :14 left in the half.

The TD to Smiley came after Torrillo's previous two passes were dropped in the end zone.

"Those were pretty big plays," Faller said. "Especially the one right before the half. That gave us a lead and made things a bit easier in the second half."

Torrillo may be the most experienced first-time starting QB ever. His father is a Sweet Home assistant coach and he has been around Sweet Home football since he was about 7 years old.

"He was a ball boy for a

while," Faller said. "He's

very familiar with the state
d what his brother did last year.

championship teams. He watched what his brother did last year. He knows our offense as well as anyone."

Torrillo also started at QB for the Sweet Home modified and JV teams before being called up to the varsity for the playoffs in 2012. He certainly learned something in all that time.

"He is a cerebral quarterback," Faller said. "He understands the offense when you explain things to him. He picks it up quick. He's a smart kid. He's a very good student in school, too."

So far, Faller says, he is happy with his QB's play.

"He has some things to work on," he said, "but he will get better each week, too. Kevin is very accurate with his throws. Now it's just a matter of working on his timing and getting his reads down. He's done really well for us with just 5 varsity games under his belt. He's done a great job."

Truilizio also said that Woodard is becoming a solid leader for NT.


"Chris is vocal when he has to be." Truilizio said, "He always leads with Photo by Mark Adair his actions. He has punted for us, he's kicked PATs and







Zulawski, a 2vear starter, has provided the Raiders some stability on the line.



Hillbullies Storm C

Fredonia RB Matt McCarthy leads a charge to the C South title

Fredonia started fast and scored five times in the first quarter and beat Allegany-Limestone 49-17 last week. The Hillbillies led 35-0 in first quarter.

"We wanted to open up the passing game and we did," coach Mike Marshall said. "I want to see what we can do and see what our talent is with our wide outs."

Fredonia is now 5-0 on the season and has clinched the C South title. The Hillbillies will play their last C South game this week against Gowanda before their annual rivalry game with Dunkirk.

"We stress that we need to concentrate on just one game at a time," Marshall said. "No matter what our record is, we have to continue to improve every week."

Marshall said that Fredonia, despite the explosive offense the Hillbillies have used this season, still needs improvements before the Class C playoffs start. F_Hs

"I want our team to play at a certain level," Marshall said. "I don't want to have a big swing from game to game. When we break down the game film, we look at areas that we have to get better at. That will improve our whole game and that's going to be really important in the next few weeks."

Marshall is a first-year head coach but he has been around the Fredonia program for 13 years. He took over the head job from Bob Ball this fall.

"Bob is really the one who built the program up," Marshall said. "I started in 2000 when he took over the varsity spot. He hired me as the head JV coach. He brought me up to the varsity 5 years ago."

Marshall says that Ball surprised everyone when he

leaving the football program.

announced that he was

"It was a surprise to all of us." Marshall said. "but he has three young kids and his two boys were in the Midget League here in Fredonia. During his last year as head coach, he was only able to see one of their games. He was missing a part of their life that you never get back. I know it was a tough decision for him because he loves working with kids and he loves football."

Marshall was apprehensive about taking over for the coach that had won almost every season, made appearances at the Ralph, and was popular with the players.

"I was definitely nervous," Marshall said.
"But Bob told me that if I applied for the job and got it, he would help out in any way he could."

Marshall says that Ball has followed

through with that promise.

"He has been in the background," Marshall said. "He's been very helpful. Because he handed it over the way he did, it's been a very easy transition."

Marshall says that most people were not completely surprised that Ball left, but they were surprised at the timing of his decision. Ball quietly resigned a short time after Fredonia lost the Class C championship game at Ralph Wilson Stadium last fall.

"Most coaches stay when they are on top," Marshall said, "and then they bow out when a downswing is coming. Bob left on top. I think that shows his commitment to his family and to our football program."

Marshall says that he did not change very much when he stepped into the head coaching position.

"I've taken his offensive and defensive philosophy and put a few tweaks to it," he said. "I didn't have to teach the kids anything. We run the same things we've always run, just a bit differently."

Marshall's 'tweaking' has obviously worked. The Hillbillies offense has been explosive this season.

In the win over Allegany-Limestone, RB Matt McCarthy rushed for 197 yards and 5 TDs on just 11 carries. He scored on runs of 73, 10, 17, 6 and 25 yards. He also caught a 17-yard TD pass.

"We actually used him as a decoy," Marshall said. "He only had 11 carries. When we played Falconer he touched the ball four times and scored 3 touchdowns. I took him out of his position after that."

McCarthy has been the most visible player to benefit from Marshall's offensive tweaks this season.

The junior RB has rushed for 695 yards on just 45 carries - over 15 yards per carry. He has also scored 14 TDs.

"Matt he has been a surprise this year," Marshall said. "He was our starting cornerback last year and didn't play much offense. He came to all the summer practices and he brought 110 percent on everything. His performance this season is the results of his work ethic."

The junior is not only fast but opposing coaches around WNY say he runs incredibly hard.

"He can go up the middle and run through people," Marshall said. "You can't arm tackle him. He can also see a hole, get through it and run away from people. He'll see holes on the other side of the field and get there in a heartbeat."

McCarthy was named a team captain before the season started.

"I was extremely excited," McCarthy said. "It's an honor that my teammates thought of me as a leader like that."

McCarthy says that he is most pleased with the way that the Fredonia players have grown closer in the past year.

"We've been practicing together since the spring," he said. "It helped a lot with our team chemistry. We still go out once a week to dinner or something else. It's helped to bring us together. Our team is a lot closer this year."

McCarthy is also focused on making it back to Ralph Wilson Stadium this fall.

"That's all we've thought about since we lost to Cleve Hill," he said. "We wanted to get back to the Ralph right after we lost that game. We'd love to play Cleve Hill again but it really doesn't matter who we play. We just need to get back there and win this time."

So far, with a 5-0 record and eye-opening offensive totals, Marshall is pleased with the Hillbillies season.

"I guess I'm still going to wait for the final results," he said. "We might be all right in the C South. Southwestern gave us a real test but I want to see how we do against the C North teams in the playoffs. I'm pretty happy so far but the final results aren't in yet."
