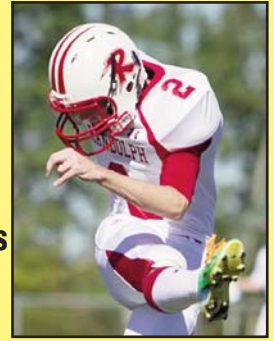

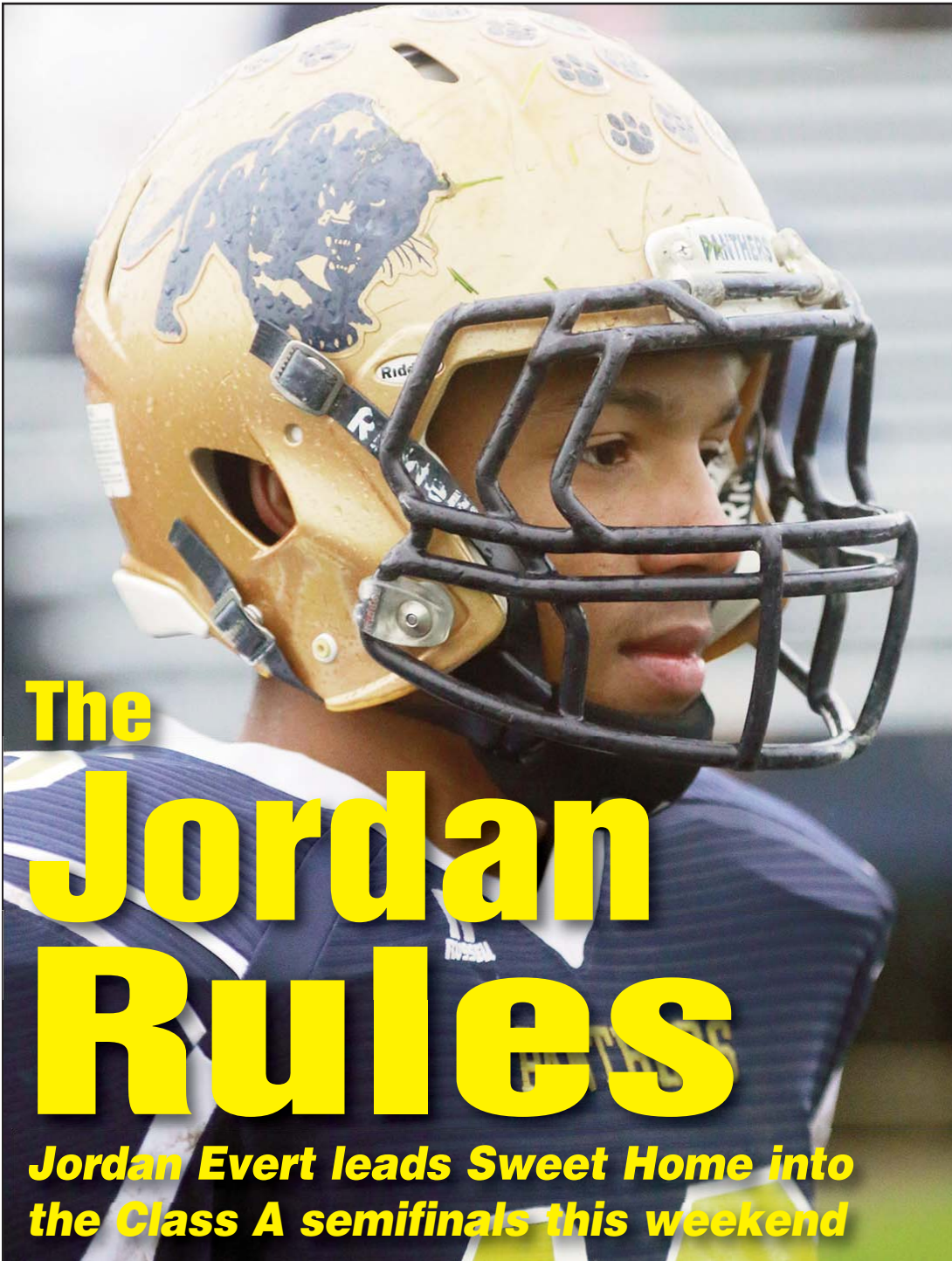

Mammoliti Honored for Playoff Win

Williamsville North coach Mike Mammoliti was named the Buffalo Bills / NY National Guard Coach of the Week after his 7th-seeded Spartans upset 2nd-seeded South Park 21-0 in the first round of the Class A playoffs.

The Spartans shut out one of the better passing offenses in Western New York. The Sparks entered the game with two receivers among the top 5 in WNY in receptions.

"The defense has stepped up to the plate all year long," Mammoliti said. "They are a cohesive unit and really understand what we are trying to do."

Mammoliti said that the players on defense went far beyond what most players do to prepare for games.

"Those kids have been like football junkies," he said. "Every time we go scouting, they go with us. We had a couple of guys out with injuries and those kids were doing tendency sheets for us."

Mammoliti also said that the defensive game plan drawn up by North's defensive coordinator, Ron Luders, was especially effective.

"Ron has done a great job with these kids," Mammoliti said. "One of the things we did was put pressure on their quarterback so he couldn't just sit in the pocket. Also, our secondary kids did a good job on route recognition and staying with those receivers."

The Spartans led 14-0 at the half. Derek Isler scored on a 29-yard run in the second quarter to give Williamsville North a 7-0 lead. A short time later, QB Ryan Majewski tossed a 31-yard TD pass to Zac Kelly.

Isler ran for a 59-yard TD in the fourth quarter to put the game out of reach. He finished with 142 yards and the 2 TDs on 23 carries.

The Spartans also got the ball in the 4th quarter with 8:53 left in the final quarter. They held the ball and kneeled out the game.

"Our guys wanted to get two first downs to burn some clock," Mammoliti said. "They ended up getting four. The

guys up front just did a stellar job."

Mammoliti said that it was the best drive of the season for the Spartans offense.

"For the importance of it, it was our best drive," he said. "South Park is pretty explosive. They hit two passes and they are right back in the game. We wanted to keep the ball away from their offense."

This is the Spartans first playoff win.

"We've won some Chuck Funke Bowl games," Mammoliti said. "In 1998 we were undefeated division champs and we lost to Niagara Wheatfield. We've gone

over to Orchard Park three times and lost all three."

Mammoliti says that the first playoff win in almost two decades has excited the entire school.

"Our kids are jacked up and we are too," he said. "By this time of year we have grown so close to each other. We have been together for 67 days since August 19th. We've had fun together, laughed together and got mad at each other. For me, it's like having 36 sons."

The Spartans will play Grand Island at 5:00 pm

Mammoliti played high school football at Canisius under the legendary Johnny Barnes

"It was a completely different era of football," Mammoliti said. "It was 3-yards-and-pound it football."

He graduated from Canisius in 1976 and went on to play at the University of Buffalo, a D-III program at the time. He was a teammate of Depew coach Brian Wilson.

"He and I were roommates" Mammoliti said. "We were best buddies and we still are."

Other UB teammates include Tony Percival, an assistant at Cleve Hill, Ken West head coach Rich Harris, and Kenmore East assistant Jeff Martin.

He has been coaching at Will North since 1984, under Lou Martini. He was named the head varsity coach in 2000.

A Tale of Two Ron's

Orchard Park @ Frontier, 7:30 Friday

Orchard Park and Frontier have been division foes for years and have faced each other many times. However, the two teams have never met in the AA Finals at the Ralph.

While it is not quite the Finals, the Falcons and the Quakers will battle this weekend for a spot in the championship game.

The schools are just minutes away from each other, a short trip down Route 20. They also have a connection with two legends in WNY history, Ron Pitts and Ron Wolfley.

Section 6 first held playoff games at Rich Stadium in 1979. Orchard Park made its debut performance, but unfortunately lost to North Tonawanda 17-14. Despite the loss, things looked bright for the Quakers heading into 1980, as two of its stars would be returning seniors.

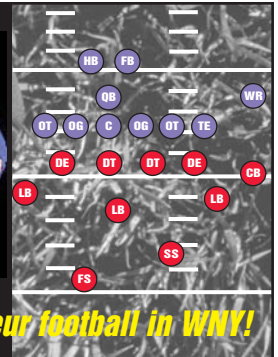
Pitts was a standout back who was a Connolly Cup finalist. The hard-nosed Wolfley was hoping to break out of the shadow of his older brother, Craig, who had just finished his Senior campaign at Syracuse as a standout Offensive Lineman. But shock waves hit WNY football as Wolfley decided to transfer to nearby Frontier for his senior season, and the two would be split apart.

Looking back, one can probably sympathize with Wolfley. Pitts seemed to be the feature player for the Quakers. He was the son of Bills' coach Elijah Pitts, who played in the first two Super Bowls for Green Bay. He was a "can't miss prospect" who would play college football at UCLA, and then the NFL. The WNY Award for Top Defensive Back is named after him. If Wolfley wanted to impress college scouts, he needed to be a feature back somewhere else.

It turned out to be a life-changing decision for Wolfley. Not only did he thrive at Frontier, it helped define his career. He led the Falcons to a 27-0 win over Sweet Home at the Stadium. Wolfley rushed for 1,338 yards, still the best season in Frontier history. A Connolly Cup finalist, he went on to play at West Virginia and was a 4-time Pro Bowl pick in the NFL. He's the only player to have played in St. Louis for both the Cardinals and Rams.

Two players. One team... then two teams. Both went on to play major college football. Both played in the NFL. And, incredibly, both were born on the same day... October 14, 1962!

If there's one team that, over the years, has played OP tough, its Frontier. Technically, the teams do not play a rivalry game... but ever since Wolfley's transfer, the rivalry has not needed that special designation.

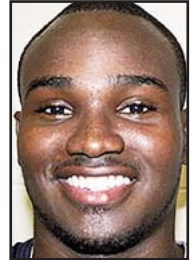

DeSean Walker - Orchard Park

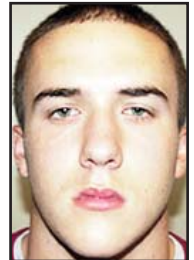

Cardinals are Alive and Kicking

Randolph beat Dunkirk 42-16 in a game that was scheduled after Dunkirk's season-ending game with Fredonia. Randolph coach Brent Brown scheduled the game because his own team had earned a bye in the first round of the Class D playoffs.

"I don't think byes are good," he said. "When you have a bye, your week of practice isn't very good. Sometimes that carries into the next week. I just think you stay sharper when you play a game."

Brown said that his players were also eager to play the game.

"The kids signed up to play football," he said, "and they wanted to play a game that week. We played, we stayed healthy and it was good for us."

The Cardinals will now host Ellicottville in the Class D semifinals.

"Every year, our first goal is to get a home play-off game," he said. "Our second goal is to get to the Ralph. That's what we're playing for."

Brown says that he is using creative tactics to get his team ready.

"This time of year can be monotonous with the regular practice routine," he said. "We'll try to keep it interesting and fun. We'll try to put some other things in and work on some stuff that we'll need for the play-offs."

He said that his players don't need to be reminded about what is at stake for the next few weeks.

"A lot of this group went to the Dome last year so they know what to do and they know what it's about," he said.

However, one player who went to the Dome last year, may have to miss some of the football playoffs.

Micah Kehoe, the Cardinals kicker, is the latest in a long line of Randolph soccer players to join the football team. The soccer Cardinals are 12-0-2 and are trying to win a Section 6 title of their own.

"Our soccer team is good," Brown said, "They are still playing and they have a shot at being Section champs."

Having a soccer player on the football team is not new for Randolph.

"We've had a soccer kid for years," Brown said. "Way back when we won our first New York State title, we had a soccer kid kicking for us. Pat Slater started that."

David Philblad kicked PATs and field goals for the Cardinals when they won the NYS title in 2005. When the Cardinals won the title in 2009, Nick Millman had joined the football team just to kick PATs.

Brown said that soccer coach Dave Levandowski has always been open to allowing one of his players kick for the football team.

"We really have a great relationship with the soccer program," Brown said.

Each year, before the end of the school year, Brown will ask if there are any soccer players that want to kick for the football team.

"We usually get one that wants to do it," he said. "We give him a bag of balls, a tee and a holder. They practice all summer."

Brown says that he will not put one of his soccer kickers into a game, even if it's a blowout.

"No! Geez..." he said. "We put a kid in a corner-back a few years ago and the soccer coach got a bit nervous about that. So, we don't do it. Micah is a great soccer player and the last thing we need is to get him hurt playing on defense or something."

Once in a while, there is a conflict.

"We have an agreement that soccer comes first,"

Brown said. "We keep the peace and honor that."

Twice this season, Kehoe was at a soccer game, forcing the football team try a 2-point conversion after scoring a TD.

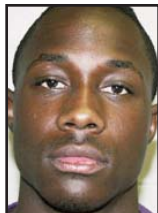
"That's happened more than once," Brown said. "Usually he gets there before our game starts, but, against Maple Grove, we scored our first TD and I saw him running up the sideline. He had just got there. We called timeout to give him a few seconds to get ready and then we put in our kicking team."

Kehoe has a rare opportunity to win two titles or be named all-league in two different fall sports.

"He's a good kid," Brown said. "He's very athletic and he's fast. He's a very good kicker, practically automatic on extra-points. He can boot field goals in practice, too. We haven't tried a field goal in a game yet but I'm confident he could make it."

"He's built like a senior," Harris said. "He packs a punch when he hits."

Harris would not normally play a freshman on the varsity.

"He's an unbelievable football player," he said.

"Jayson rushed for over 2,000 yards in his one modified

football season. He had the ability to come up right away and play on the varsity."

Taylor is the defensive captain and makes all the calls at the line,

"When he blitzes, bodies just explode," Harris said. "He just blows up the middle of the field."

Jamestown exploded out of the gate and led 41-0 after one quarter and beat Niagara Falls 63-6 in the first round of the AA playoffs.

"It's a new season," coach Tom Langworthy said.

"It was nice to start the playoffs with a dominating win."

Langworthy said he was hoping his players would stay focused after blitzing through much of the regular season.

"We didn't have a letdown," he said. "We did our jobs and moved on to the next round."

The Raiders will host Kenmore West on the semifinals this weekend.

"They have good athletes and are well-coached," Langworthy said.

Park also plays a number of Special Teams units.

"He caught a TD pass in the first five games,"

Langworthy said. "He also caught a TD against Orchard

If the Vikings are going to advance to the Ralph for the A final, the will need a big night from junior lineman Nick Paolini.

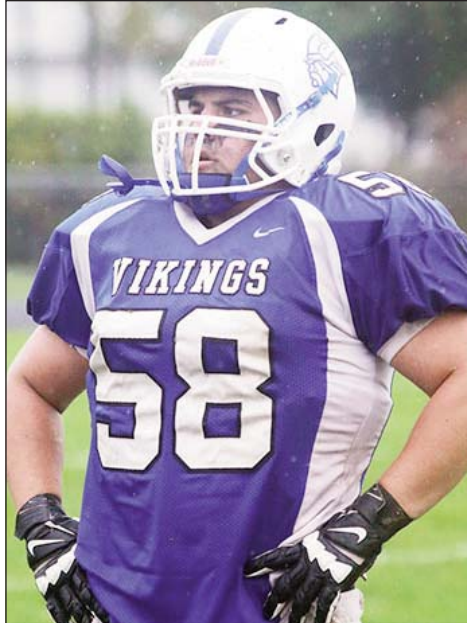

Jordan Evert Leads Sweet Home into Class A semifinals

Sweet Home beat Kenmore East 32-0 last weekend to advance to the semifinals in Class A.

The Panthers battled extreme weather conditions that included 40-degree weather, sustained 50-mph winds with even stronger gusts, and a piercing sideways rain.

The Panthers scored twice in the 2nd quarter while driving directly into the teeth of the storm.

"We put points on the board going against the wind," coach John Faller said, "That was pretty big."

Sweet Home is 8-0 and the top-seed in Class A. The Panthers were a heavy favorite entering the game against Kenmore East.

Faller, however, made sure to tell his players that seedings don't matter at this point in the season.

"The number in front of your name doesn't mean anything," Faller said. "The night before our game, seeds 2, 3 and 4 all lost. At this point, everyone is a pretty good team and the only thing that matters is how you play for 48 minutes."

The Panthers will now host West Seneca East (7-1) in the semifinals at 2:00 pm Saturday. Another trip to 'The Ralph' is at stake.

"It's the last home game for our seniors so it will be important to them for that reason, too," Faller said.

It may be the last game the Panthers play on the field at all. A new bond issue was passed in district voting and Sweet Home is hoping a brand, new athletic facility with artificial turf will be open in time for next season.

"I'm not sure when the construction will be done," Faller said. "We might play on the new field next year but we don't know yet."

That makes this week's game extra special for the current seniors.

"They will never play on the new field," Faller said, "but they will be the last kids to play on the old field. They were part of starting a new tradition. I think they'll feel a lot of pride in that when they get older."

Speaking of tradition, the Panthers are now just one win away from playing in Ralph Wilson Stadium for an eighth straight season. They have won six straight Class A titles and 68 straight games against WNY opponents.

Even talk of the 'Sweet Home Streak' is becoming a tradition during 'Ralph Week. Faller says he has no problem talking about any of the streaks.

"It's not really a conversation in our locker room," he said. "but we know it's there. The only time we bring it up is before the season. We put it right in front of the

kids."

Faller says that he tries to make his players understand that Sweet Home has a target on the side of their helmet.

"Everyone wants to be the team that knocks us off," he said. "Every team is going to give us their best effort and pressure us. How we answer the call when it's time to play under pressure is important. Every time you have to overcome something, it makes you stronger."

Faller said that in last year's Far West Regionals, Sweet Home benefitted by playing through difficult situations earlier in the season.

"We had been behind several times last year," he said.

"That experience helped us when we fell behind to Eastridge in the playoffs and we needed to make a comeback."

One player whose experience has helped this season is junior Jordan Evert.

Evert, a 6-1, 185-pound junior, was called up to the varsity as a sophomore last season.

"He was a good all-around athlete on the freshman team," Faller said. "We brought him up as a sophomore because we needed a back-up quarterback."

Starter Michael Torrillo was never hurt so Evert never had to step in at QB. However, when Khalil Humphrey was injured, Jordan stepped in as a running back.

"He did well," Faller said. "He became our leading rusher last year."

Evert did a lot more than just fill in at RB.

"He played defensive end, linebacker and safety," Faller said. "He also played a little at wide receiver, running back and a little quarterback. He had a lot to learn and he showed us what he could do."

Last weekend against Kenmore East, the Panthers needed the experience as three starters were missing from the action.

Brandon Smiley, a starter at WR and LB missed the game because he was sick. Davonte Lee, who starts at DB, was injured early in the game suffered a sprained knee. Both players may be back for the semifinals. However, John Navarro, a starter at both OT and DT, will miss the rest of the season with a torn ligament in his hand. He had surgery earlier this week.

"That's a lot to overcome," Faller said, "but I think the kids that filled in played well."

Despite what many area fans may think, the Panthers are actually a young team this season. Most of their starters are juniors and sophomores.

Which is why Evert is so important.

"If you have you a sophomore playing for you, it's like having a 2-year senior," Faller said. "That first year of experience is important It makes you better."

Evert is quickly becoming one of the better players in Western New York.

He has rushed for 829 yards this season. He has also caught 12 passes for 208 yards and scored 14 TDs.

"He has a real good drive when he runs," Faller said. "He has strong legs and once he gets moving, he's a load to bring down."

Evert, one of the hardest hitters in Class A when he plays safety on defense, understands that the Panthers rely on his experience.

"We lost 7 senior starters from last year," he said. "But we had people come up from the JV that can play as well as anyone from last year. They have filled some shoes."

Evert, who also plays for the Sweet Home basketball and baseball teams, says he is thinking about one thing.

"Our whole mind set is just playing the game and coming out with a win," he said. "That's all. That's the only thing we think about each week."

Goltz served as a back-up to Holmes last fall and did not enter 2013 as the starter.

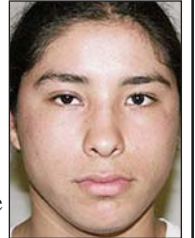
