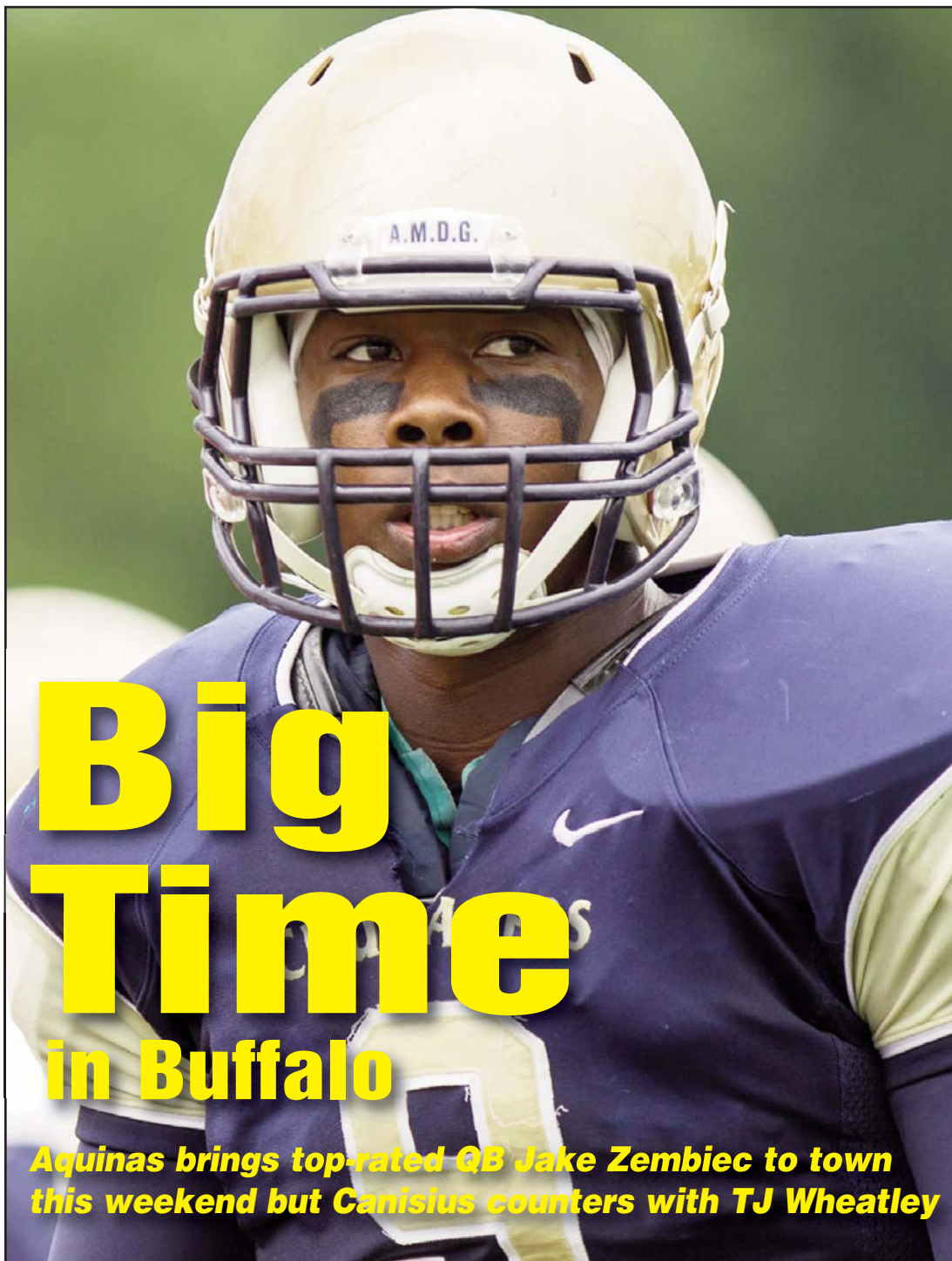

Curt Fischer Honored for Big Win

Maple Grove-Chautauqua Lake Curt Fischer was named the Buffalo Bills/National Guard Coach of the Week after his Thunder Dragons beat Randolph 24-12 in the season opener.

Randolph had entered the game with a 23-game winning streak and was the two-time defending New York State Class D champions.

"We really looked at it as a great challenge to open the season with Randolph," Fischer said. "They were the champs and had a winning streak like that. It was a tremendous challenge."

Randolph had beaten MGCLake the last 2 years at 'The Ralph' in the Class D championship game.

But when NYS re-worked their enrollment numbers for the 2014 season, the Thunder Dragons were moved up to Class C.

"It meant that we would be playing some different schools this year," Fischer said. "It was a new start. Sometimes change gets you going again."

But, while MGCLake and Randolph were no longer Divisional rivals, the importance of the game did not change.

"Being moved up to Class C didn't change anything," Fischer said. "It was still a huge game. Beating Randolph means so much to our kids. Neither team wants to lose that game."

At first, it was not clear the MGCLake would even get a chance to play Randolph.

"That's just how the schedule came out," Fischer said. "Actually, I think it's an unwritten rule that we need to play every year. It's a good game for the area. We've each made each other's programs stronger over the years."

The Thunder Dragons led just 8-6 at the half.

"We moved the ball early and the defense played

well," Fischer said.

Dustin Graziano and Jed Micek tackled Randolph QB Bryce Morrison in the end zone for a safety and a 2-0 lead.

When the Dragons got the ball back, they drove 65 yards for a TD. AJ Hulton capped the drive when he punched into the end zone from 1 yard out.

Randolph pulled within 8-6 when the Cardinals intercepted a screen pass and returned it 39 yards for a TD.

Shortly after that, the game was suspended due to lightning.

"I was worried," Fischer said. "We had kids that were super high. They had confidence but then we had to call the game. But the kids came back the next day and played well."

MGCLake scored twice in the third quarter to take a commanding 24-6 lead.

"We started running the ball and getting to the edge," Fischer said. "The line and the backs started blocking extremely well."

Ryan Miller powered the MGCLake offense as he rushed 26 times for 206 yards and a TD. He also added 111 yards in returns.

Fischer has coached at Maple Grove for 22 years. Since he took the head job in 1993, his teams have won two NYS titles and 7 Section 6 titles.

He played high school football at Falconer under legendary coach Bill Race. Race later hired Fischer as a coach on his football staff.

"Played for him and coached under him," Fischer said. "Coach Race was a huge mentor in my life."

Fischer works full time at Cummins Engines in Lakewood. He also coaches basketball and girls softball at maple Grove and has coached baseball in the past.

"I knew we had some kids that had big play ability but I didn't know we had that many," coach Steve McDuffie said. "We probably have 10 to 15 kids that have big-play ability."

McDuffie's Tigers simply flattened their opponent, who happens to be coached by his brother, Chris.

"I feel terrible about beating my own brother like that," McDuffie said. "I gave my brother a hug and kiss after the game. I love my brother and I didn't want to embarrass his

"It was a competitive game until late in the third quarter," McDuffie said. "We started to get big plays."

One player who will play a big role for Bennett this season is Bennett senior Alexander Lofton.

"He is so special because is a game-breaker in every phase of the game," McDuffie said. "On offense, defense and special teams, he can score every time he has the ball."

Lofton caught 4 passes for 69 yards in the win over Williamsville East.

"He had two kickoff returns for 80 yards each," McDuffie said, "and both of them were called back by penalty."

Lofton, who has an academic average of 90, was named a team captain.

"He has enough credits to graduate right now," McDuffie said. "He is one of five seniors on the team and he is a great leader and a great student-athlete."

Lofton also starts for the Bennett basketball team.

"He mentors the Little Loop players in the summer," McDuffie said. "He's a role model on the team, in school and in the community."

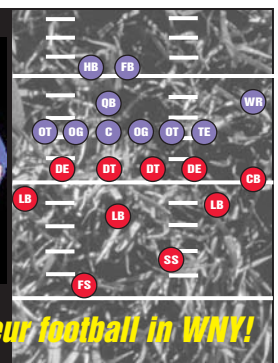
Bennett led 24-0 at the half when the game was suspended due to lighting. The teams had to return the following night to finish the game.

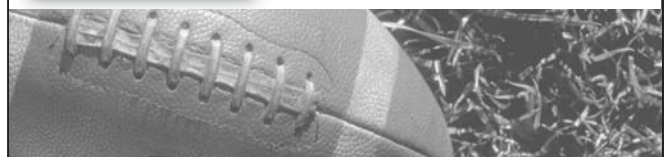

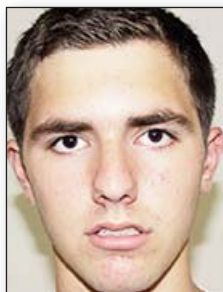
Defense

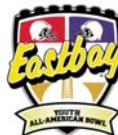

Fuzak Leads Billies in Class A

Williamsville South overcame an early 14-point deficit and a suspension of play to come back and beat Kenmore West 24-21 last weekend.

"We over came some adversity," Williamsville South coach Craig Kurzanski said. "We didn't play well early but we fought hard over both nights and were able to catch them in the end."

Ben Neuss kicked a 32-yard FG as time expired for the winning points.

"I was confident when we sent him in there," Kurzanski said. "He's a good kicker."

The Billies trailed 21-7 with 4:51 left in the first quarter.

"I thought our kids were a little tight," Kurzanski said. "We made some mistakes early on and Kenmore West took full advantage of them."

South began to settle in during the second quarter. The Billies scored with 5 minutes left in the first half to pull within 21-14.

With 2:15 left in the second quarter, the game was halted as lightning began to flash.

"We were just starting to roll," Kurzanski said. "We got everyone to the locker room to wait for the 30 minutes so we could start playing again. But, after a little while, it was obvious it was going to be a lot longer than 30 minutes so the officials called it off."

At first, Kurzanski was dismayed that the game had been halted - just as his team had begun to get on a roll.

"But, there wasn't anything we could do about it," he said. "Normally we make some adjustments at halftime but this time we had a 22-hour halftime to make adjustments. We went home and watched some film of the game. It's not very often we get a chance to watch film at halftime."

First, however, Kurzanski had his team's trainer talk with his players.

"We had them stretching in the gym," he said. "The trainer talked with them about getting enough sleep, about what they could eat on Saturday morning, about proper hydration. It was really hot Friday night and we were worried about kids getting dehydrated and cramping up the next day."

Kurzanski also wondered about his players losing focus but it turned out that he didn't have to worry.

"They came back excited and ready to play," he said. "It was a hard-hitting game and the energy level was just as high on

Saturday as it was on Friday. It was for both teams. Ultimately, our kids were ready to play and did really well."

Kurzanski also said that the referees in Western New York should come in for some kudos.

"The officials should get a lot of credit," he said. "Some of those guys ended up having to work three games on Saturday.

The only reason we got all the games in was because they were willing to help out with the situation. All the refs should get a ton of credit."

If Williamsville South is going to contend for the Class A championship this fall, they will need a big season from junior lineman Jake Fuzak.

"Jake never played JV football," Kurzanski said. "He went right from modified to the varsity. He's the first freshman ever to play for me. We thought he was good enough to play."

Kurzanski did talk with Fuzak's parents before officially placing him on the varsity roster.

"We communicated with the parents what our goals were for Jake," Kurzanski said. "He was 14 years old, playing against 18 year old kids. I was more worried about the social aspect of it rather than the physical aspect. Whenever you bring a kid up like that, he's not with his own friends. We didn't want him to have a miserable experience."

Fuzak (6-5, 278) started at linebacker as a freshman.

"He started out as a linebacker," Kurzanski said, "but he kept

growing so now he's on our lines."

Fuzak, who also plays hockey for Williamsville South, is more athletic than most kids his size.

"He runs a 40-yard dash in under 5 seconds," Kurzanski said, "which is fantastic for a high school kid his size. He also went to U.S. Football National Development Game and was one of 90 kids in the nation to play in that game and he had three sacks."

The University at Buffalo has already offered Fuzak a football scholarship.

"He'll have more coming," Kurzanski said. "He's an excellent student. He has a 93 academic average so he won't have any problems there."

Fuzak was also named a team captain before the season.

"He's very outgoing and he's mature beyond his years," Kurzanski said. "He cares about others more than himself. He is a great football player and a great leader. The first time you meet him, you are impressed."

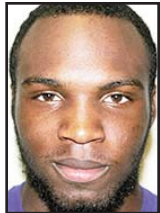

White (6-3, 190

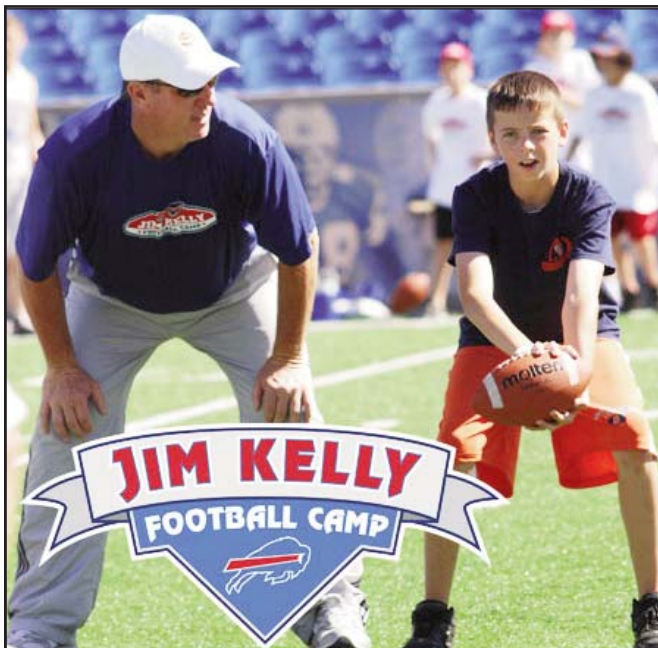
also starts at CB.

Mosely Shines at Jamestown

After jumping out to a 14-0 lead, Jamestown fell behind 21-14 in the 4th quarter but rallied for a 35-28 win over Sweet Home in the season opener.

"We lost our rhythm offensively," coach Tom Langworthy said. "We got in a little rut and turned the ball over."

Sweet Home took the lead when Jamestown lost a fumble in the end zone, resulting in a Panthers TD.

"Turnovers are a huge part of the game," Langworthy said. "We want to make sure that we protect the football."

The Raiders actually coughed up 5 turnovers.

"The good news is that we threw 5 TD passes," Langworthy said.

"We made a lot of mistakes yesterday. Luckily, they were all correctable. This is the first week and it's not unusual to make a ton of mistakes in the first game of the season.

Langworthy was proud that the Raiders gave Sweet Home its first home

loss since 2006.

"Playing against teams like Sweet Home will pay dividends down the road," he said. "I'm pretty proud that we could go into Sweet Home and come out with a

win. Not many teams do."

If the Red Raiders are going to repeat as class AA champions this fall, they will need a big year from senior DE Kevin Mosely.

"He's an intelligent player and he has a nose for the ball," Langworthy said. "He'll get to the ball carrier and make plays."

Mosely started the 2013 season at LB before moving to the DE spot.

"He was giving our offensive line fits in practice," Langworthy said.

"We moved him to defensive end and he had a big game at The Ralph."

Mosely led the team in tackles in 2013.

"We look for him to make plays against the run and the pass," Langworthy said. "He can dip his shoulder and get the quarterback."

Big Time In Buffalo

Two of the Nation's Top HS players will face off at Canisius

Canisius opened the season with a big 48-3 win over McQuaid last weekend. The Crusaders led 28-3 at the half and scored two more TDs early in the third quarter to put the game out of reach.

"It was nice," coach Rich Robbins said. "In the 4th quarter we were able to give everybody an opportunity to play."

Robbins said that giving his younger players in-game experience will be crucial in the coming weeks.

"With our schedule, we don't get too many chances to get the young guys in and get quality time," he said. "It was nice for them, after working so hard in practice and on the scout team, to get them some quality playing time."

Despite the lopsided score, Robbins said that the Crusaders beat a good team.

"McQuaid was ranked in the Top Ten in the Rochester *Democrat & Chronicle*," he said. "I think they have a good team and will have a good season. But our kids were ready to play. We jumped on them early and did not look back."

Canisius did not play a perfect game, Robbins said.

"We had some penalties," he said. "We had some screw-ups with substitutions, some offsides. We had some kids forget to go out for an extra point. That's just 'details stuff' that is normal for the first game. It wasn't even that much of an issue but we want to clean it up."

The Crusaders started fast as Josh Huffman returned the opening kickoff 90 yards for a touchdown.

"There is not a better way to start the season than that," Robbins said. "That was a statement right there."

Canisius led 7-0 after one quarter and exploded for 3

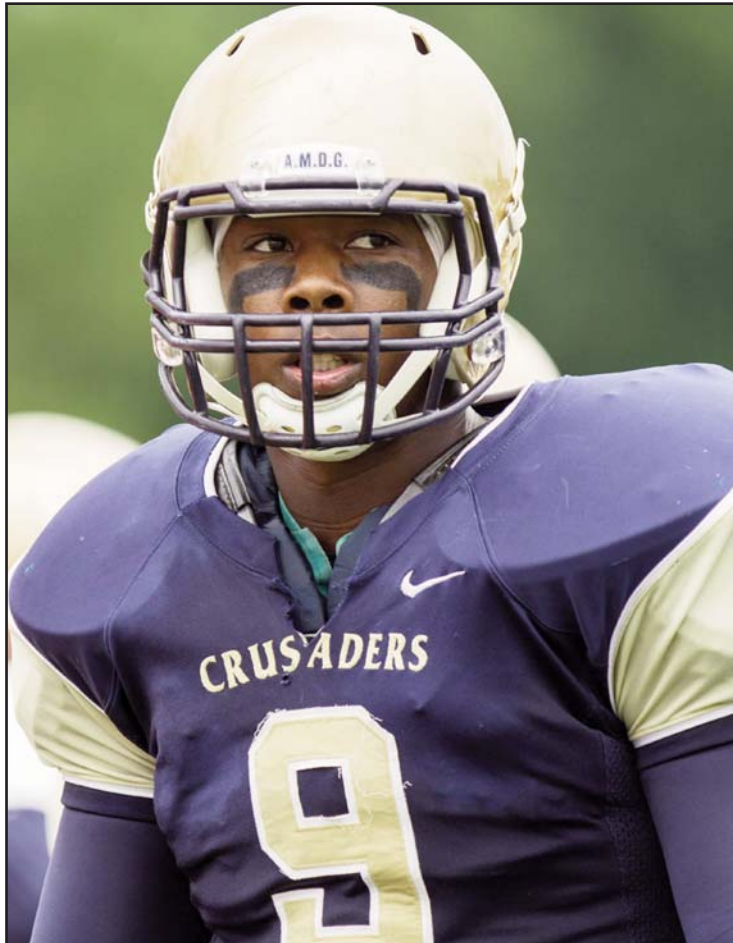

TDs in the second frame to take a 28-3 lead at the half.

QB Jakob Loucks completed 11 of 16 passes for 166 yards and 2 TDs to lead the offense. Canisius also rushed for 164 yards as nine different players carried the ball.

"We did pretty much what we wanted to do," Robbins said. "The kids played really well."

Now Canisius will play the most anticipated game of the season when Aquinas comes to Buffalo.

The Little Irish are ranked #1 in New York State while Canisius is ranked #3. Last season, Aquinas beat Canisius 3-0 in a monsoon-like rainstorm that hampered both offenses.

"I'm sure our kids remember it in the back of their minds," Robbins said. "But this year's team is not last year's team. Aquinas has a new team, too. I just know it's going to be a

great football game."

Both Aquinas and Canisius will have players in the game that are among the most heavily-recruited high school players in the nation.

Aquinas QB Jake Zembiec (6-3, 205) is ranked in the top five of all high school quarterbacks across the country. He is also ranked as one of the top 10 Dropback QBs in the nation.

"No doubt that kid is something special," Robbins said. "But we think we have some pretty special kids on our sideline, too."

Canisius has TJ Wheatley, the son of former Michigan star Tyrone Wheatley, who is now on Doug Marrone's

staff with the Buffalo Bills.

"When Coach Wheatley got the job with the Bills, the family started looking at a lot of different schools in Western New York," Robbins said. "When we got the call that TJ would be coming to our school, we were excited. Not just because he is a great football player but because they are really good people, too. They are a great family to have in our program."

Wheatley, a 6-7, 260-pound senior, starts at DE and TE for the Crusaders. He is also one of the biggest of the big-time recruits to ever play in Western New York.

"He has scholarship offers from LSU, Oregon, Alabama, Florida State, Michigan, USC and UCLA," Robbins said. "The list goes on and on. The only two schools that were absolutely out for him were Ohio State and Michigan State. I think with his family situation, neither one of those two schools were an option for him."

Robbins has heard from almost every big-name college coach in the country, regarding Wheatley.

"I'm not going to lie," Robbins said, "when Brady Hoke or Brian Kelly calls it's great to talk with them. You can get a little start struck. But I love talking with Mike Cragg at Hobart and Paul Vosburgh at St. John Fisher, too. They are great guys and great coaches. And, honestly, we'll have a lot more guys play at those schools than Michigan."

Robbins says that despite the fact that Wheatley is going to play at a big-time football school, you would never know it when talking to him.

"The nice thing about TJ is that even though he is a big-time recruit, his main focus is helping us win games," Robbins said. "He is a humble kid."

He has never, once, 'big-timed' anyone, Robbins says.

"Yes, he's a big-time recruit," the coach said, "but he just came in here, worked hard and did what we asked him to do. He's been a great kid to have in the program. Mostly, he's excited about getting a chance to win a state championship this year."

Yes... a state championship.

In 2013, Zembiec led Aquinas to the New York State Class AA championship. The Little Irish, in fact, claimed the state title by winning a tournament that Canisius is not allowed to play in.

However... this season, for the first time, the Msgr. Martin champion will have an opportunity to play for a NYS Catholic Championship.

The Msgr. Martin Association has entered into an agreement with the NYC-based CHSFL that will have the champions of each league meet a week later to play for the New York State Catholic championship. Organizers are hoping to play that game in Yankee Stadium but the details have not been finalized yet.

"It will be nice for both leagues to have their champion get another game and maybe be able to call themselves State Champs," Robbins said. "Our whole team is excited about getting an opportunity to do that. We still have a lot of football to play before we get to that point but it's been our focus to get to that point."

Leavell Leading Fisher Defense

Nationally-ranked St. John Fisher College scored the game's final 22 points to earn a 36-14 win over visiting Otterbein University in the Division III football season opener for both teams.

Fisher, ranked No. 9 in the D3football.com preseason poll, senior quarterback Tyler Fenti completed 22-of-33 passes for 296 yards and 4 TDs., Senior WR Nathan Nigolian scored 2 TDs and finished with 8 catches for 148 yards.

"We need to get back and do some things a little bit better," Fisher coach Paul Vosburgh said. "We weren't always technically sound. But when adversity struck, our guys stood up to it and responded."

After forcing Otterbein to go three-and-out in the game's opening drive, Fisher marched 54 yards on just three plays for the game's first score.

"When we scored in just three plays, it looked pretty easy," Vosburgh said. "But Otterbein is a pretty good program. They fought back and it wasn't until the third quarter that we could get the game in hand."

St. John Fisher has been to the post-season for 11 straight seasons, five times making the NCAA Playoffs.

"We are the winning-est team in the East in the last 11 years," Vosburgh said. "Nationally, we are in the top ten in wins over the last 11 years."

Vosburgh says that staying on top will be difficult.

"Our league is so tough," he said. "This past weekend, the Empire 8 went 8-0. Every team in our conference won a non-league game. That speaks well of our conference."

with the recent additions of Buffalo State and Brockport, along with next year's additions of Cortland State and Morrisville State, the conference has been measurably strengthened."

"It's tough every year now," Vosburgh said. "There is no easy weekend. You better be ready to play or you will lose."

Fisher has an open date on the schedule this week before playing the annual Courage Bowl game with Brockport State.

"It's a conference game for both of us now," Vosburgh said. "It's exciting. I think the fact we have the State schools coming into our league is good for college football and good for New York State. Fans don't have to go very far to see great football."

If the Cardinals are going to repeat as Empire 8 champions, they will be relying heavily on senior safety Paul Leavell, an Orchard Park grad.

"Paul is the third of his brothers to play for us," Vosburgh said. "Mike and Joe were both solid players for our program."

Vosburgh recruited Leavell heavily as he was finishing his high school career at Orchard Park.

"You could see that he was an outstanding football player and a very good overall athlete."

Leavell did not immediately break into the Fisher lineup. In fact, this is the first year as a full-time starter.

"When we recruit kids, we tell them that it's not easy to start here, especially as a freshman,"

Vosburgh said. "Paul worked his way up. Last year, he was behind a

senior who was also in his first year as a starter. Paul did a great job on special teams."

Leavell will have full responsibility to make sure the Cardinals defense is in the proper formation on every play.

"As our free safety, he is the quarterback of the defense," Vosburgh said. "He sets our defense and gets us lined up in the proper alignment. He has to see the offensive formations and then make the call to get us in the right spots. If he makes the wrong call, he misdirects the whole defense."

Leavell was in on 7 tackles, 4 solo, in the win over Otterbein.

"He is playing very well right now," Vosburgh said. "He's a competitor and he is doing a great job."

Leavell is also solid in the class room.

"He's a very good student," Vosburgh said. "He has great grades and does a great job with his academics. He did in high school. He's a little quiet but he does run the show out on the field. We hoping that he progresses into being an All-Conference performer this season."

Joe's grad Kicks BSC to win

Buffalo State opened the season with a wild 51-48 overtime win over Cortland State last weekend.

"I have been coaching for a while now and have never had a finish like that," Buff State coach Jerry Boyes said.

"We were up the creek, we didn't have an oar and the current was against us."

With just :06 left, the Bengals trailed 48-45 and Cortland had the ball on Buff State's 48-yard line, facing a 4th down. The Red Dragons sent the punting unit on to the field.

"We just sent everyone after the punter," Boyes said. "We thought he was just going to run around and try to kill the clock."

Instead, with most of the Bengals defense chasing him, the Cortland punter did a hook slide with :01 still on the clock.

"They lost 20 yards on the play," Boyes said. "That gave us the ball at the 32-yard line. It gave us a chance for one

more play."

Boyes sent in the field goal unit and St. Joe's grad Marc Montana nailed a school-record 49-yard FG to send the game into OT.

"Sometimes you are good and sometimes you are lucky," Boyes said. "I think we got a little lucky."

Montana finished 3-for-4 on FGs and was 6-for-6 on PATs. He transferred to Buffalo State before this season.

"He wanted to go somewhere that he could make a difference," Boyes said.

"Thank goodness that Buffalo State is in his hometown because he sure made a difference already."

'Lightning' The Mood



Well... THAT was certainly interesting.

When teams kicked off the 2014 season last Friday, little did anyone know that this was going to turn into one of the most memorable Opening Nights to a football season in WNY history.

Things started normally, when East Aurora and Amherst started their game at 6pm. Most games began at 7:00 pm without a hint of trouble.

By 7:45, a lightning storm had moved into the area forcing teams to get off the field. Many began the 30-minute waiting period but it quickly became clear that this storm was much bigger than initially forecast.

Ironically, earlier that day, Section 6 Chairman Ken Stoldt thought there might be a small problem.

"I saw the weather report and it didn't look good," he said. "I sent an email out to all the Athletic Directors to be prepared if their game had to be postponed or suspended. We had to keep in mind that, if we had some suspensions, that there needs to be a minimum of four days rest between games. I thought we might have 2 or 3 games in that situation."

While Stoldt was in attendance at the Depew at Alden game, lightning flashed, and the game was stopped.

"I got 2 or 3 calls that games were being suspended," he said, "and then my phone just blew up. I knew that this wasn't good."

It was obvious, from all the red on the radar reports, that this storm was far bigger than initially forecast. Lightning strikes were everywhere and the storm stretched from Rochester to the middle of Michigan.

"I was not expecting to have 19 games suspended," Stoldt said. "I went home. Thankfully, I live a block away."

When he arrived at his house a few minutes later, there were more than 30 phone messages, emails and texts waiting for him.

"I knew it was going to be a long night," Stoldt said. "I just started calling people. I had my cell phone going, my home phone going, I was getting texts... I felt like a bookie."

Finishing the games on Saturday wasn't the problem. "We knew we could play the next day," Stoldt said,

"but everyone wanted to play at 2 o'clock. That just wasn't possible. We didn't have enough officials to play every single game at 2 o'clock."

Stoldt then got on the phone with Dan Finucane, who schedules the officials for Western New York. He also had to consult with Al Feser, who does the same job for officials in the Southern Tier.

"We were all awake until after one in the morning," Stoldt said. "We had to make sure that some of the officials could get from one game to the games that were suspended. Dan and Al really came through for us. They did an amazing job."

All the games that were suspended Friday night, would have to be replayed no earlier than 6pm Saturday. And, still, it wasn't as simple as re-scheduling the football games.

"Some of the fields had soccer games scheduled for 7pm Saturday night," Stoldt said. "So we had to work around other sports, too."

It was obvious that some of the area's referees were going to put some serious miles on their cars on Saturday.

"Honestly, the officials as a group really came through big time," Stoldt said. "We had some guys that had to ref a 2pm game in Newfane, then drive to West Seneca East to finish a suspended game, before going back home to Lockport."

Even the WNY coaches, notoriously uptight about staying on schedule, were all on board with the plan.

"The coaches were all great about it," Stoldt said. "We had a lot of people in the same boat. They understood this was bigger than we planned."

Amazingly, every game was completed. The final contest was finished Monday night when McKinley beat East High at Riverside Field.

"I was just panic stricken that we had missed a game," Stoldt said. "I just knew that we would have a game scheduled and no referees show up. But, in the end, that didn't happen. Every game got played and the officials all got to their games. Everyone came through."

Stoldt said he has thought about coming up with an emergency plan in case of a re-occurrence of something this big.

"There is no way to really plan for this because you don't know how many schools will be affected," he said. "Next time, it might be one or two games."

All in all, it turned out as best that could be hoped for. It certainly was memorable.

"It was a great way to kick off the season," he said. "We got through it and now we are on to Week 2."
