





Cauley Honored for Comeback

Pat Cauley was named the Coach of the Week by the Buffalo Bills and the National Guard after his team beat Williamsville South 40-34 in overtime.

"I accept the honor on behalf of the team, our kids, our coaches and our community," Cauley said. "A lot more goes into a win like that than just the head coach. Everyone did a great job."

It was Hamburg's first-ever playoff win on the road and the Bulldogs used a most improbable way to earn the win.

Hamburg trailed 21-3 at the half and looked for the all the world like they were going to exit the playoffs.

"Way back in our summer conditioning program," Cauley said, "I made sure that the kids understood that, no matter what happened this season, we would be resilient and relentless."

At the halftime break, Cauley reminded his players of that.

"I just told the kids to take a deep breath," he said. "We were not going to die like this. We were going to get to the 4th quarter with a chance to win.

within three points when Micth Gomolka pounded in from the 4-yard line to make the score 34-31.

Hamburg needed one more stop.

"We had a guest speaker come in and talk to the kids on the Thursday before the game," Cauley said. "One of the things he told them was that every inch counts. He said that the game would come down to a few inches."

With Williamsville South facing a 4th-and-1 on the Hamburg 19-yard line, the Bulldogs stopped the Billies' just inches short of a game-clinching first down.

The Bulldogs drove frantically down the field and,

on the game's last play, Jason Shuttleworth kicked a 37-yard FG to tie the game.

In the OT session, the
Hamburg defense stopped South without a first down. With their own possession, the Bulldogs methodically drove to the 2-yard line and then Gomloka hammered in for the game-winning TD.

Cauley has been a coach at Hamburg for 23 years. He coached at the

We had worked too hard and if we were going to go out, we were going out playing our kind of football."

Hamburg scored early in the third quarter to pull within 21-9 but Williamsville South answered with a TD to push the lead to 27-9.

"We still felt we had a chance," Cauley said. "We can score from anywhere on the field but we had to stop them from scoring and we hadn't been able to do that."

However, Hamburg scored and then caused a turnover. When the Bulldogs scored again late in the third quarter, they trailed just 27-24.

Hamburg still had a mountain to climb when Williamsville South scored again to take a 34-24 lead with just 8:41 left in the game.

It took four minutes but Hamburg again pulled to


modified and JV levels for 15 years. He was also the head basketball coach for 11 years before stepping down to pursue his administration degree.

Cauley was named the Hamburg AD 2 years ago.

"It certainly is a challenge but I will never be an AD that is only interested in the program I coach," he said. "We are trying to create a culture where everyone is a Bulldog. I have excellent assistant coaches who do a great job and pick up any slack that might exist because of my other position."

Cauley says that his team is far from satisfied with winning a playoff game.

"There's no reason to be satisfied," he said. "We have a good team waiting for us but we want the opportunity to go out and compete and we want to win."

Size Means Nothing for Senior

Sweet Home jumped out to a 21-0 led at the half and beat McKinley 44-6 in the first round of the Class A playoffs last week.

"The kids did exactly what we coached them to do all week," Sweet Home coach John Faller said. "For the second week in a row they executed flawlessly. Our kids executed very well."

Sweet Home improved to 6-1 on the season. The Panthers

have won 6 straight gams since opening the season with a loss to Jamestown.

"You need to win or go home," faller said, "an our kids know that. They have been striving to get to this point since we lost to Jamestown."

After a sluggish win over Starpoint in Week 5, Sweet Home has dominated it's last two games.

"We have played really great football the last two weeks," Faller said. "Everyone has been contributing on offense, defense and special teams."

This Saturday, the Panthers will host West Seneca East in the semifinals for the second straight season.

"We played West Seneca East in the semis last year," Faller said, "and two years ago we played them at the Stadium. We are not unfamiliar with each other."

West Seneca East will have a significant size advantage when the teams meet.

"That's not a news

flash," Faller said. "We are undersized against everyone this year. We don't have any big kids like some of these teams do."

Faller said that he's pleased with the way his team has played despite the lack of size this season.

"Size helps but you go with what you have," he said. "We have pretty good technique and our kids work on it a lot. We do what Sweet Home does. We're really sound and these kids know what they're doing. We're not unbeatable but you better come with your 'A game' to beat us."

And while the Panthers will not be able to rely on size to push opponents around, for the first time this year, they will have a full roster to work with.

"We have everyone back healthy," Faller said. "We had a bunch of injuries, the kind that take time to heal. We've always had injuries before, everybody does. But you need somebody to go in and perform when they get their chance."

One player that has returned to bolster the Panthers is senior RB Jordan Heine.

Heine, a 2-year starter who is just 5-foot-6 and 145 pounds led the Panthers with 124 rushing yards in the win over McKinley.

"In high school football, little guys can be very good players," Faller said. "He runs as hard as a guy who is 190 pounds and he is twice as quick."

Heine has been timed at 4.6 in the 40-yard dash.

"It's his change of direction that he's really devastating with," Faller said. "He can stop and go on a dime. You don't know which way he's going to go. Most kids are not going to get a clean shot at him. Once he changes direction, he accelerates really quickly."

Heine suffered a hairine fracture in his shin in the Panthers openingweek loss to Jamestown.

"It took a long time to heal up," Faller said. "He didn't come back until Week 6."

Heine returned for the Panthers win at Starpoint. In that game he ripped off a 60-yard punt return to set up a Sweet Home TD in a 28-9 win.

"He's really dangerous on punt and kickoff returns," Faller said.

The following week, Heine rushed for 99 yards and a TD as Sweet Home won the A North Division with a 48-13 win over Williamsville South.

"Every game he has been back, he was one of our leaders on offense," Faller said. "We've been giving him a little time at defensive back but mostly he just plays offense."

Heine also starts at point guard for the Sweet Home basketball team and is a midfielder for Faller in lacrosse.

"He's a real good lacrosse player," Faller said.

Heine also plays a lot bigger than his size, Faller said.

"He's a real competitor," Faller said. "He gets on the field and he has no fear. He's ready to go from the opening kickoff. Size means nothing to him. He'll lower his shoulder and hit people."

"He's bigger than he looks," Mammoliti said. "He has great football sense. He Photo by Mark Adair understands all the schemes."


Becht is a mem-


Shuttleworth nailed the FGsending the game into overtime. The Bulldogs comback when Mitch Gomolka powered

MGCLake Follows Senior Running Back into Class C semifinals

MGCLake beat Lackawanna 45-0 in the first round of the Class C playoffs last week.

"We jumped out early and got the edge with our ground game," coach Curt Fischer said. "We tried to throw a little more than usual just to work on it but our run game was pretty solid."

The Thunder Dragons, who are now ranked #3 in NYS, rushed for 335 yards in the win.

It was also the 6th time this season that MGCLake as shut out an opponent.

"Our defense was phenomenal," Fischer said. "We had two turnovers inside their 20yard line in the first quarter. That really set the tone for the game."

In fact, Fischer said, the Thunder Dragons defense has set the tone for the entire season.

"Our defense has given us an opportunity to go for it on 4th-and-short when we should be punting," Fischer said. "The

confidence we have in our defense allows us to take chances that we wouldn't normally take. They just shut other teams down."

WNY with 1,546 yards and 20 TDs.

The Dragons defense does more than just shut down offenses, though.

"They create turnovers, too," Fischer said. "We had 4 more in the win over Lackawanna."

So far, this season, MGCLake really hasn't been challenged yet. The Dragons beat Randolph 28-7 in the season's opening game. They were tied at 8-8 with Southwestern at the half before winning 32-8.

Other than that?

"Every other game we've had has been over by the half," Fischer said.

The biggest problem facing the Dragons' coaching staff has been how to NOT run up the score.

"You always worry about getting into a situation where other coaches are screaming across the field at you," Fischer said. "One time this year, we gave the ball to 22 different kids after the half. Eleven of them were lineman who had never carried the ball before."

It made no difference as the opposing staff was still angry because MGCLake went for 2 points after each touchdown, instead of kicking a PAT.

"We haven't kicked a PAT all year," Fischer said. "We don't have a kicker."

Fischer is alternately happy and frustrated that his team is so strong. Sometimes, he said, his players are actually harmed by playing less than half a game.

Ryan Miller, the Dragons leading rusher, gained 156 yards and scored 3 TDs on just 15 carries against Lackawanna.

"We could get Ryan three or four hundred yards a game," Fischer said. "In some of our games, he is getting 9 carries. His yards-per-carry average is amazing. But I don't know how many Connolly Cup nominations he has missed out on because we don't run him 25 or 30 times a game."

Fischer says that his team isn't exactly losing interest in the season.

"The kids aren't bored," he said. "But there is some frustration because they don't get to play a full game. But See "Cover Story" on page 25

they are all very team-oriented. Any kind of personal stuff as been put aside. It's a pretty special group."

Miller has been pretty special this season, too.

The senior has rushed for 1,390 yards this fall... more than any other player in WNY. Miller has also rushed for 17 TDs, tied or second in WNY. His production has come with just 120 carries, which means he is averaging more than 11.5 yards per carry.

"He's special," Fischer said. "He is a very patient runner. It's like he floats in the air, and then plants his foot and changes direction. It's amazing to watch."

Miller also runs with power, according to Fischer.

"Ryan can also run over a guy," Fischer said. "He will lower his shoulder to get a couple of extra yards."

Thus far, Miller has been limited to playing only offense.

"He could play defense," Fischer said, "but we have so many kids that can play. We have three extra defensive backs that could go in and play at any time. That keeps him fresh."

Fischer says that Miller worked hard to make sure he was physically ready for the season.

"He busts his butt with his conditioning," Fischer said, "this off-season he and a couple of other players drove to Erie, Pa. to work out with a personal trainer. That's the kind of work he has put in. That's why he's having the season he is having."

Miller (5-11, 192) is being looked at by several college programs.

"Quite a few D-3 schools want him," Fischer said, "We've heard from Alfred, Buff State and Hobart. They would all be great options for him. I feel there are a couple of D-2 schools that he could play at. We have been in touch with Edinboro, Gannon and Mercyhurst but he is keeping all of his options open."

Miller, who has an academic average in the high 80s, was a sophomore on the last Chautauqua Lake team in 2012. He says that he feels more at home this season, one full year after the merger between the Maple Grove and Chautauqua Lake programs.

"When we started out last year, we didn't really bond," he said. "It took some time, but by the end of the season we were definitely one team. This season, we are like brothers now."

He said that he thinks about MGCLake's loss to Randolph at Ralph Wilson Stadium in the Class D title game last season.

"Especially when we found out Randolph was our first game this season," he said. "We needed to prepare as hard as we could or that game. It was nice to get that one."

Miller says that he has his sights set far higher than winning at the Ralph this fall.

"We're taking it one game at a time, one step at a time," he said, "but our goal is to win a state championship. We believe we can get there."

Khari Demos Starting for Fisher

St. John Fisher beat Alfred State 61-0 last week to improve to 6-1, (4-1 in Empire 8 games). The Cardinals were only marginally helped when Utica beat Buffalo State that same day.

"It really didn't do anything for us," Fisher coach Paul

Vosburgh said. "Buff State only has 2 losses. It doesn't change our scenario at all. We have to win."

The Cardinals will host Buffalo State at noon Saturday. The winner will be the favorite to win the Empire 8 Conference.

"Buff State is a very good football team," Vosburgh said, "and has been for the last 3 or 4 years. Since Coach (Jerry) Boyes has come back to coach, they are a very good football team."

The winner will also have the inside track into the NCAA playoffs.

"This should be an outstanding football game," Vosburgh said, "it should be a great contest."

The Cardinals will be helped by the probably return of Lockport grad Khari Demos to the lineup. Demos has been nursing a minor knee injury the last two weeks.

"He should be ready to go," Vosburgh said.

"We are expecting him to play."

Demos transferred into the Fisher after spending a year at the University at Buffalo. He was a "gray shirt walk-on" but was never activated for a game.

"Khari is a good football player," Vosburgh said. "He can play at the scholarship level. For whatever reason, his opportunity to play for UB never materialized."

Vosburgh says that is not entirely uncommon.

"There are a lot of kids like that in Division 3," he said. "It doesn't mean that they weren't good enough. Sometimes the situation just doesn't allow them to get where they would like to be in a Division I program. Sometimes the program has already given out so many scholarships they can't get them into the lineup. There are a lot of reasons that happens but it does not mean they weren't good enough. UB liked Khari enough to ask him to

be on their team.'

Vosburgh recruited Demos hard when he was at Lockport High School.

"I liked him a lot," Vosburgh said. "He was very athletic and had good feet. He played on the basketball team and

he was a very good student. He was involved in a lot of other things in high school, not just sports."

Vosburgh was disappointed when Demos opted to attend UB instead of SJF.

"He's a great kid," he said. "I understand kids wanting to try and play at the highest level possible. When we lose a kid like that, we wish them the best and tell them the door is always open for them. I've lost kids that way and they have made it. I would not have been surprised had Khari made it."

Vosburgh was elated when Demos called and asked if the opportunity to play at St. John Fisher was still open.

"We were pretty excited about the possibility of getting him back,"
Vosburgh said. "I knew his grades wouldn't be a problem."

Demos is now 6-4 and 290 pounds.



"He's gotten bigger and stronger," Vosburgh said.

"We had an inter-squad scrimmage and with we scrimmaged with UR," Vosburgh said. "He did a great job and we named him the starter."

Just like when he was in high school, Demos is involved in much more than just football.

"He's a very intelligent young man and he has good grades," Vosburgh said. "He's a good football player and a good person. He will be a highly successful person after college."


