
























### Classroom Learning Liberates The Mind











# Lunch Brings a Welcome Break






### Student Forum Voice of The Students



Although not all desired goals are achieved, learning to cope with defeat can be even more beneficial.











# Honor Choir Sings a Variety of Tunes.



#### It's Academic Loses in Close Competition













## Spectrum Incorporates Many New Ideas




# Students Travel to Germany






#### Office Aides Offer Help

My family there was fantastic and I became very close to one brother in particular.



Rich Doran spent his summer in Paraguay.



#### Girls' Volleyball Goes Undefeated


The Kenmore East Girls' Varsity Volleyball team proved that desire, dedication, and teamwork produce positive results — an undefeated season and the N.F.L. championship.

The Junior Varsity placed second in the N.F.L., suffering only one defeat at the hands of undefeated Tonawanda.






# K. E. Establishes Football Supremacy


# Fall Season


#### Swim Team Has Successful Season



#### Basketball Makes Sectionals
















# Industrial Arts Introduces Metric System



The Science department is continuing to provide a broad range of course offerings for students at Kenmore East.



We are looking toward providing the best science background for students at Kenmore East by balancing our technical course offerings with contemporary, informative courses which stress applied science.








## Social Studies Department Changes Curriculum








# Math Expands Its Curriculum


