To date, Carrie has had a very good tennis career. She has been playing tennis for ten years, five of which were for the KE tennis team coached by Mr. David Coates.





most since last season.


Dave Idzik, as safety and tight end, said this year's team has a great sense of unity. He said the team improved since the beginning of last season.

In the final game of the season against Eden in the sectional semifinals, the Bulldogs battled valiantly but lost to a superior team which had four All-Western New York players.






Getting Involved
