




A Time For Many Lasts

Taking The PSAT






Three Years, and Counting


A Step Ahead, Yet Two Behind

Just Like A Pro

Do you recall the feeling you had before you were old enough to drive a car? "Why do I have to wait until I am $sixtec_{\mathbb{N}^2}$ It is so easy--I could drive one right now." Then do you remember what it was like when you first tried to drive a car? The "only two pedals and wheel" became suddenly complex. And thirty miles per hour seemed remarkably fast. But, before $y_{0\parallel}$ knew it, you were driving "just like a pro."

Your impression of driving a car changed once you drove one; you experienced both before and after impressions of doing something. I am in a similar sitution as a first year teacher from a student's point of view. During high school, I never thought about how much time went into the dynamic lessons my teachers prepared. The day after I took a test or submitted a paper, I eagerly awaited the results. I never understood why it took "so long" for teachers to evaluate things. But these were some of my impressions before I became a teacher.

As a new teacher, my impressions have changed. I am no longer a recipient of a lesson; I am the creator. But developing a lesson involves so much more than just writing up a lesson plan. Agonizing hours not only go into deciding what to teach, but also into how to teach effectively. And those "why did it take so long" papers are also now seen in a new light. Thoughtful assessment takes time.

In addition to my changing views on classes and teaching, my impression of students has also changed. I never realized how easily students can become part of a teacher's life. This past year, I have learned so much about and from my students. They have a special way of making my day without even knowing it. Whenever a struggling student comes for after school help, or the joyous one shares good news, my day is "made." These student show me they understand that teachers are there for them. And we are.

Unlike driving, I do not think I will ever teach "like a pro." Instead, I will continue to learn from my colleagues and from my students. For these two resources are invaluable.


Boy's Gymnastics







No one tells the blade of grass as the first flakes begin to fall "there soon will be twenty feet of snow, and you'll be underneath it all."


