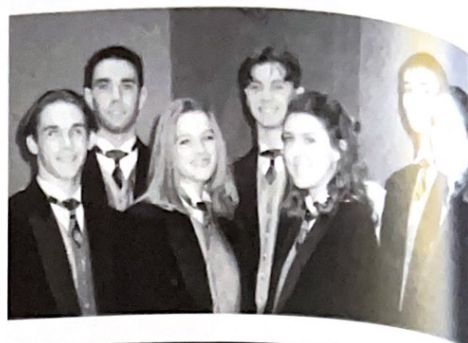

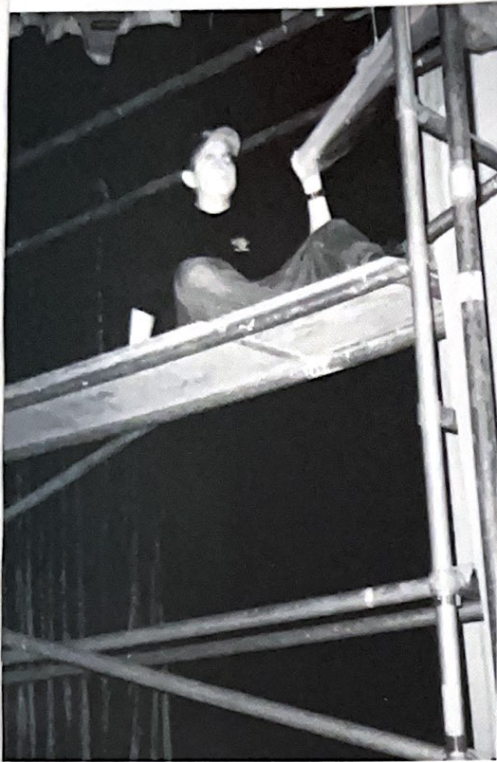

five names in one sentence, you can get quite a headache trying to read those sheets!

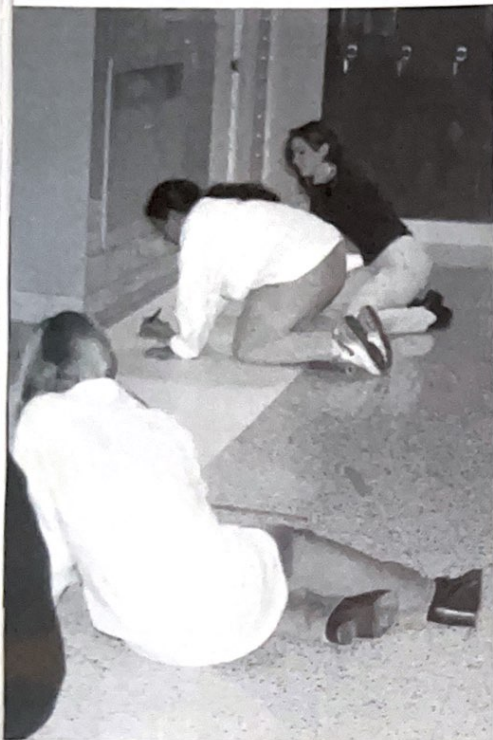
But we are a dedicated morning announcement staff, and as we lead our peers in the Pledge of Allegiance each morning, all we can do is hope that someone is listening.

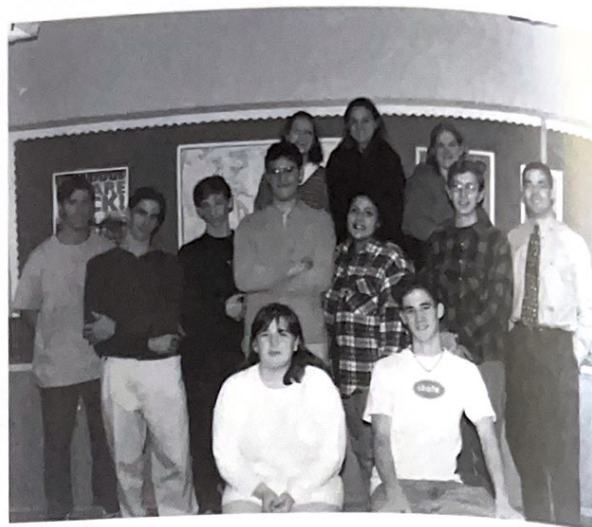

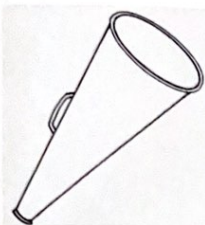

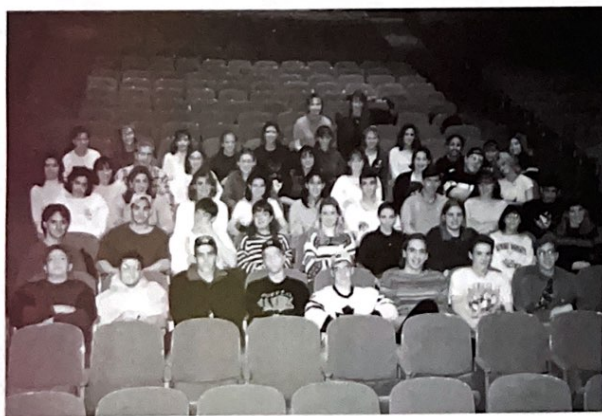
75 Years and Going Strong

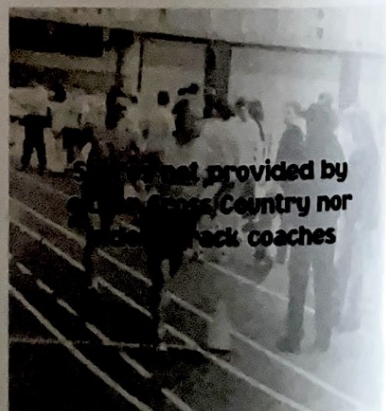
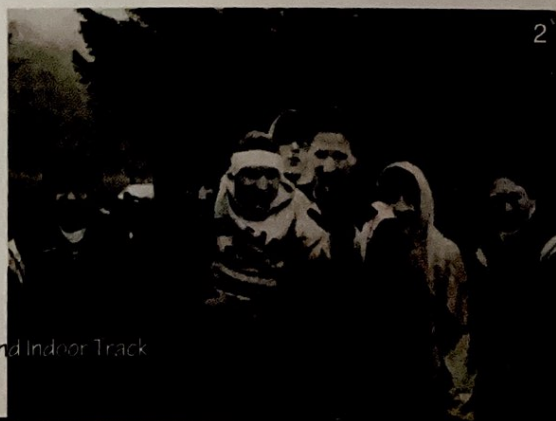
Cross Country and Indoor Track

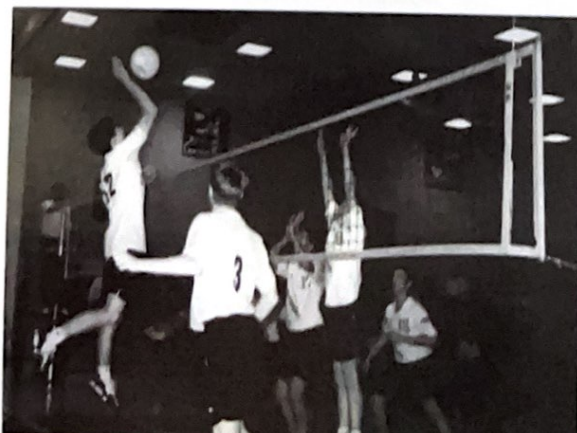
A Smashing Season

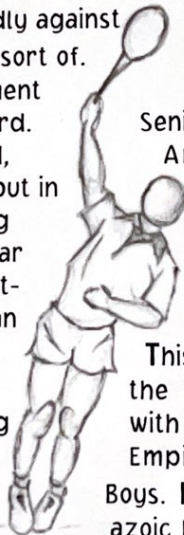
Boys Tennis Seniors show improvement and an eccentric musical taste.

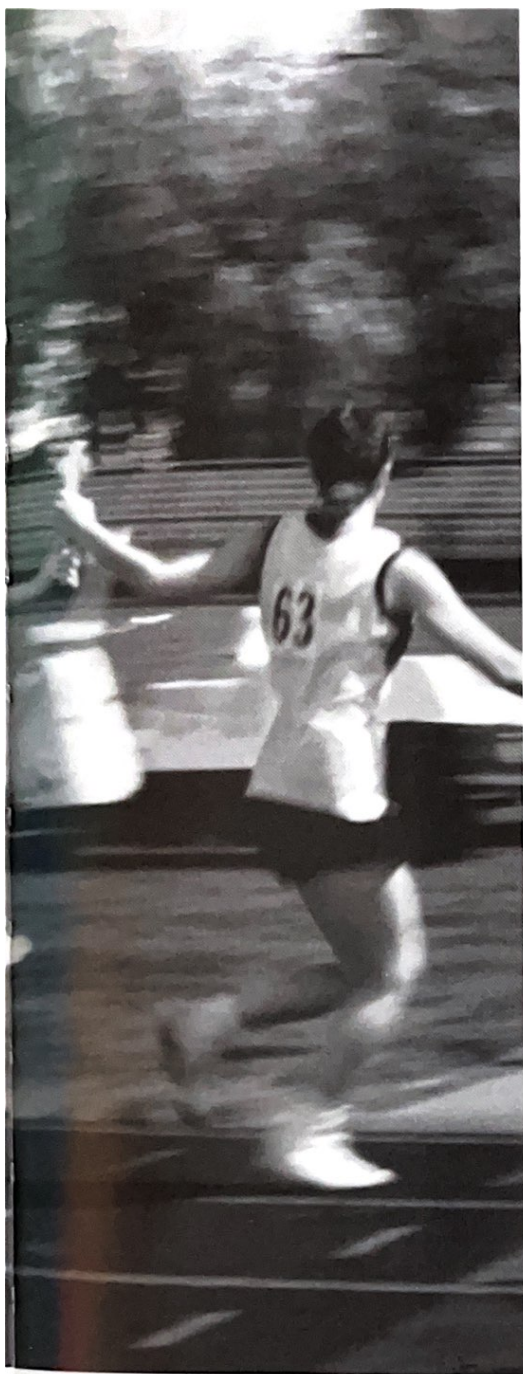
*The Girls 1996 Outdoor Track Team

Special Olympics touches the hearts of those who work with the athletes

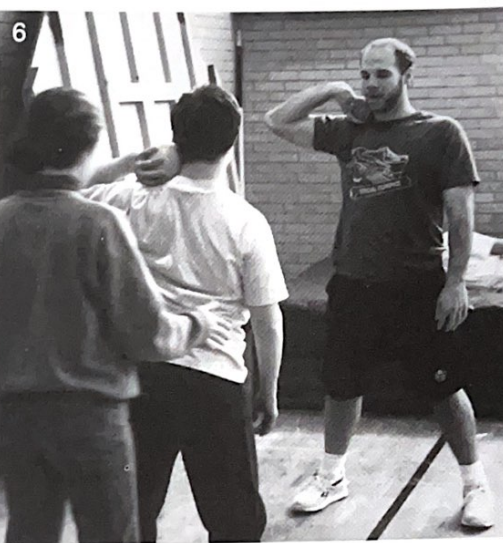
