CAPITAL PROJECT OVERVIEW:

The proposed Kenmore-Town of Tonawanda Union Free School District Capital Project will address the capital needs and priorities of the district's nine schools, which are between 60 and 90 years old. The \$75 million project would be funded primarily through New York State Education Department Building Aid with additional funding from the district's capital reserve. The impact on property taxes would be between \$17 and \$18 per \$100,000 of assessed full market value annually. Comprehensive planning has taken place to identify areas of need in all schools. This project will encompass critical maintenance and construction work as well as enhancements that will have the greatest impact upon student life, learning, health, and safety. 

• Other (All Schools): Other critical capital work is planned such as parking lot/sidewalk resurfacing at all schools, new carbon monoxide detectors at all schools, window replacement and classroom/office renovations at Edison and Lindbergh Elementary, and unisex single-occupant restrooms at middle/ high schools.




- Registered to vote by five days prior to Feb. 5, 2020
