#### **Common HSA Terms**

**HSA**: The Home School Association is Hoover Elementary's parent / school organization. We work together with faculty and staff to ensure our students have the best school experience possible! We raise funds for field trips, PBIS incentives, and school activities.

**No Cost Fundraiser**: A way that the HSA can raise money without families having to spend any additional money out of their own pockets. We currently use Amazonsmile, collect Dash's receipts and always accept donation of your cans and bottles at Xtra Dime Back.

**Chairperson**: Chairperson duties will vary from activity to activity but generally the chairperson will be a point person for a task, activity, or part of an event. This person will delegate tasks to other volunteers when necessary and help to coordinate details. Chairpersons are always supported by the HSA board and never left to fend for themselves with a task.

**Room Parent:** Room parents are the point of contact for a particular classroom. They attend the monthly HSA meetings and report any pertinent information back to classroom parents and the classroom teacher. Tasks can vary slightly depending on the teacher and roles are defined when room parents contact classroom teachers in the beginning of the year. Room parents often coordinate teacher gifts at various times through the year and volunteer when needed/allowed in the classroom for special events.
