

MR. WITZIG'S MESSAGE

In September 1959 the "Class of 60" started to clear a path of educational experience over unknown ground. with strife.


But we also needed to satisfy our peers,

The ball sails through the air and nestles into the basket with a satisfying swish. The crowd roars and the 1959-60 basketball season is under-way.


