
### OFFICE AIDS



Bill Thomas takes his key position at center.






The girls' sports program this year was progressing to strengthen the sports' program. Soccer was the principal sport held during the fall season while basketball and badminton occupied the winter months.







For us the basketball season reached its height at the East-West game when we won in the last few minutes. That was paying off a certain debt for the blue paint on our sidewalks. The Senior Play, "Time Out for Ginger," under the capable direction of Miss Barrett, was further proof that now we were capable of being stars. In the scholastic field, Valedictorian Judy Burzynski and Salutatorian Bob Vincent bow with honors. Our honor society was ceremoniously chosen, and they elected Bob Vincent president. Our last act progressed rapidly, and with mixed emotions, we saw Class Day, the Senior Supper, Senior Prom, and Graduation become memories.

As we close our scrapbook, we know the sights and sounds of our production will always remain deep in our hearts . . . the comedy, the tragedy, the rehearsals . . . always striving for the rewards of the sound of applause and the sight of our name in lights.

We leave the theatre only because we are now ready to accept different roles in the future.


