POLITICAL AND WORLD AFFAIRS

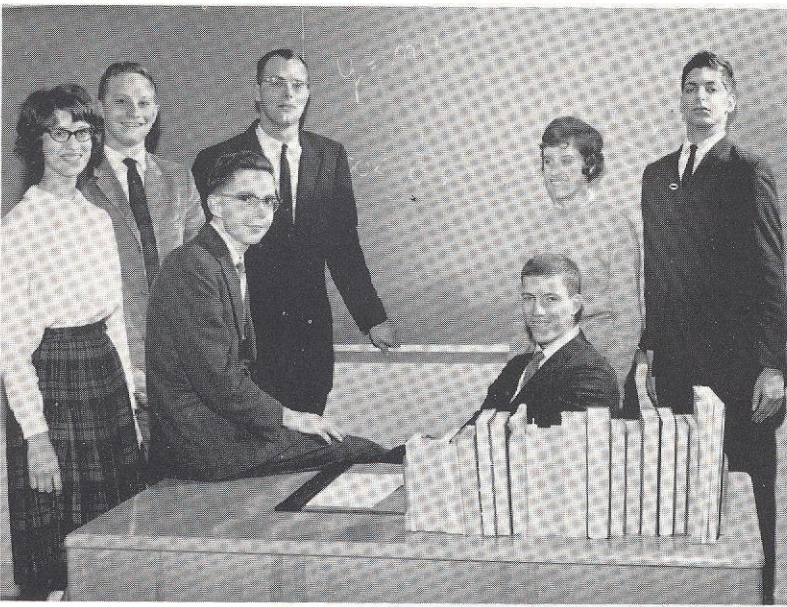

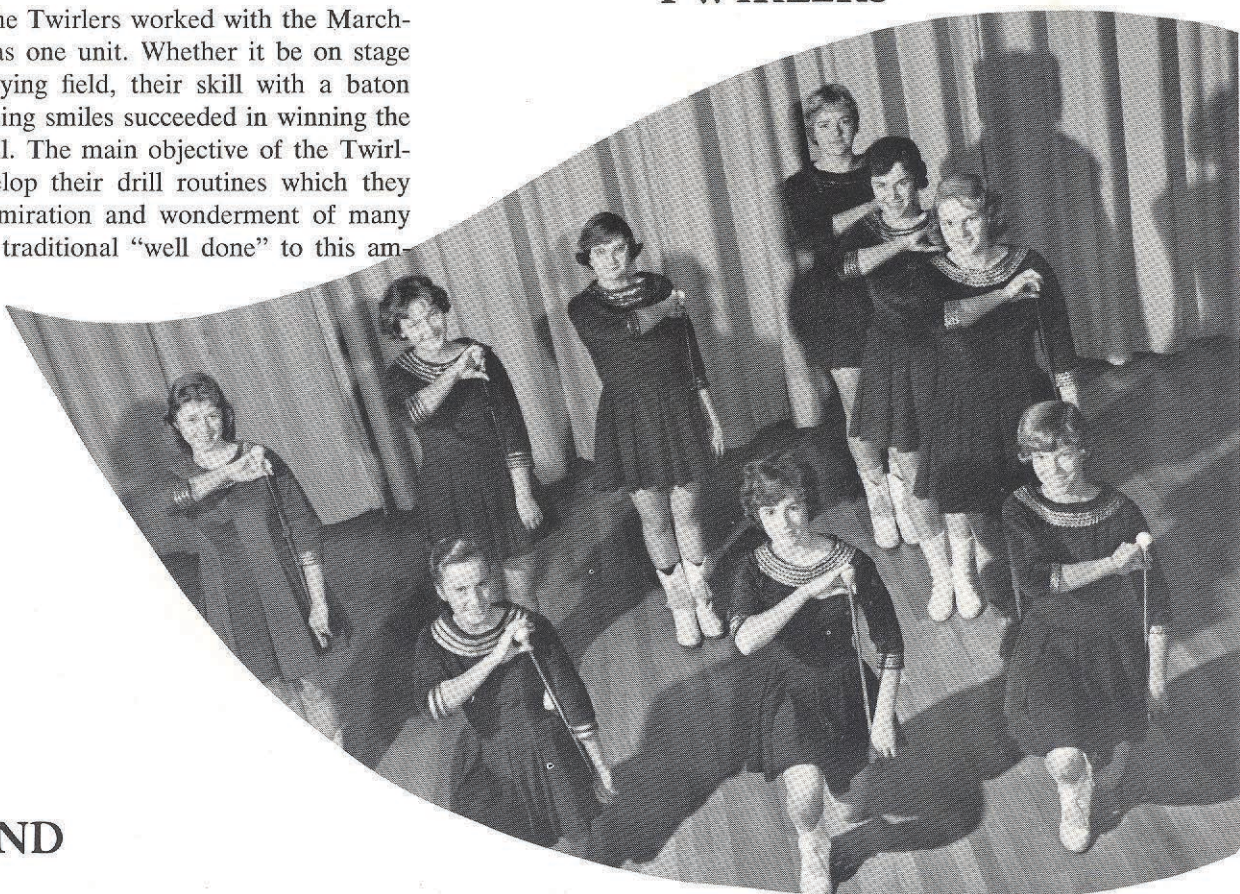


MARCHING BAND

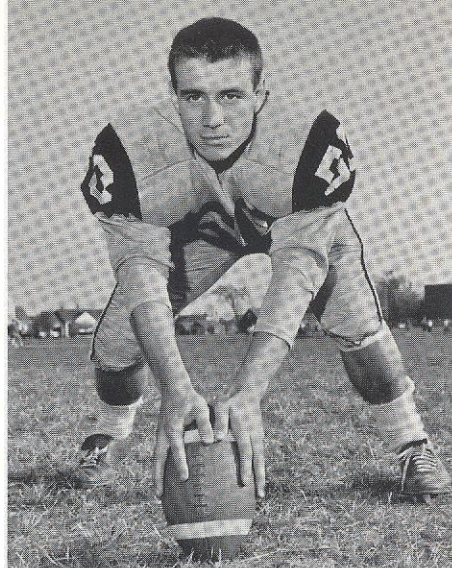

George Stockham. A Bill Schauer Cab was ready and waiting with Jim Winebrenner as the driver. On to the Barge Inn . . . which was now owned and operated by Jack Schweigel . . . The head waiter, Bill Shreve, quickly led us to a table where some of our friends, Johnny Rhodes, Norm Rice, Bruce Cadby, and Paul Stanton, were already gathered.

Here we were entertained by the "whistle-stop" chorus line by Linda Tank, Sandy Dangleis, Donna Simon, Louise O'Connor, Kathy Pauly, Ro Vaticano, Jo Welch, Lynda Burgasser, and Joan DeMariano. At the next table I thought I saw a few familiar faces, and sure enough, there were some of the great figures of the sports' world—Bob McIntosh, Al Terpay, Ray Theet, Roy Starkey, sharp shooter Bill Zimmer, racing czars Bill Wilcox and Tom Cimato, swimming stars Brad Roberts, Jim Ide, and the heavyweight wrestling champ Rich Angelino. They seemed to be enjoying the dancing of Gloria Parralli, Diane Gray, Marie Scalisi, and Loretta Picone. We left for the next stop—Nicken's. Our cab driver this time was Stacy Pallas, and I didn't think we would ever make it. When she started playing "chicken" with Joy Pudaloff, I was almost ready to bail out. Nicken's was the known hide-away for the intellectuals, so I was quite surprised to see Lorraine Vito, Ros Antman, and Karen Swenn, but I was reassured when I noticed Professor Sam Rabkin in deep discussion with Professors Carol Schwartz and Dennis Shea.

To complement the intellectual atmosphere, Carolyn Peglau was singing a soft sweet, melodious ballad. Across the room I spotted Charlie Santa Maria, jewelry magnate, discussing the finer arts of diamonds with Char Smith, Peggy Deegan, and Jackie Farrell. Businessmen Ron Olmsted, Roger Lake, and Dave Mueller were listening intently to Gerry Meloon, the photographer. None other than Roger Williams was playing the piano, and on the dance floor I spotted Allan Zollitsch, Merle Wirth, Don Strobel, Bill Springborn, Bill Thomas, Maxine Strauss, Kathy Stewart, and Nanci Smith. Bob Stout, the waiter, took our orders to Betty Lou Williams, the cook, who insisted that we try her new Betty-burgers. I thought it was about time to head for the office and write my column, so out to the street corner we went to catch a bus. While waiting, we talked to some of the night-owls—Dave Allen, Karen Barnaby, Gary Cologgi, Arlene Cohen, and Chuck Ciehemski. The bus driver, Doug Muir, took us directly to Penny's house and waited while we shook hands at her door. While Doug zoomed toward my office, I talked to the Krueger twins of "which twin has the Toni" fame.

While writing my column, I realized how many of my old Kenmore East pals I had seen tonight and how well most of them had done . . . I think I knew when I graduated that most of us would do well.



HISTORY

The curtains have closed . . . the Class of 1961 has completed three sell-out seasons of "The East Side Story." Just as many famous personalities keep scrapbooks to store their clippings and momentos, the Class of 1961 has also kept such a book. We invite you to relive each act with us as we thumb through its pages . . .

The opening scenes of our show were dominated by confusion. The cast was divided into two separate theatres . . . Hoover and Franklin. To help us in learning and rehearsing our scripts, we had famous directors on loan from Kenmore West Studios. At Franklin our producers even imported a German set designer, who enriched us with his new concepts of the art of the theatre. Being oldest in the schools, we assumed positions of leadership in establishing our first yearbook and eating last lunch.

After the first few weeks, we were reminded of our loyalty to Kenmore High School by our only representative on the cheerleading squad—Sharon Aquilino. So we dutifully went to football games and cheered for the blue and white. We had spirit, but weren't quite sure where our loyalties lay. Winter passed quickly with Christmas dances, basketball games, and biology projects.

When the scenes faded into spring, both "halves" of our class were busy at work. At Hoover, the Sophomore Show—Greenwich Village Night—was presented. While at Franklin great dramatic talents were being discovered . . . not to mention how cute Ross Runfola looked in Bermudas or Norm Rice in a bikini . . . as our class presented "Pleasure and Prance." And both schools answered the call for contributions to Kenmore West's Sophomore Show . . . why they couldn't have gotten along without Hoover's "This is your life" or dancing horse, or Franklin's Ram Rods and Tennessee Hillbillies. The curtain was slowly closing on our Sophomore year, but we still had time to have a Sophomore Dinner Dance at Franklin and at Hoover. Our class contributed two new cheerleaders to join Sharon—Joni Borschel and Mickey Parker. We then faced our most challenging line in Act I—our exams; but we carried through and won great applause.

The rising curtain of our second season found us no longer stagehands—we were now understudies. And we now had our own theatre . . . As Mr. Witzig, head of our new production, spoke to us, we sized up the characters that would combine into the class of '61. Under the guidance of the senior stars, we faced the challenge of becoming a strong unified class. We elected Faith Becker, Alex Terpay, Judy Burzynski,

and Rich Angelino as the first officers of our class, and as our much needed advisors we chose Miss Bradley and Mr. Facos. We now went to football games whole heartedly. We replaced the old rivalries of Franklin vs. Hoover with a new enemy—Kenmore West. Members of our class worked hard to make our new theatre a vital, unified school.

By winter we were used to all the Kenmore East firsts and were determined that our class could contribute a few too. Our Junior Show, "Peter Gumm," was our initial class venture and a very successful one. Inspired, we presented our spring dance, "May Magic" . . . and set a new record for using pink kleenexes. Spring found honors brought to our class by the selection of Judy Burzynski as an American Field Service Exchange Student. To support A. F. S., East and West worked together and presented the now traditional talent show. After weeks of campaigning, Tim O'Hara was elected student forum president. Don Hewitt and Joni Borschel were selected as our representatives for Boys' State and Girls' State. Sue Hein and Tone Hala joined the cheerleading squad.

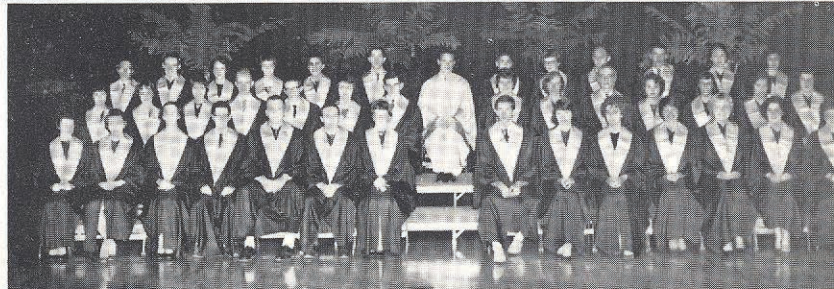
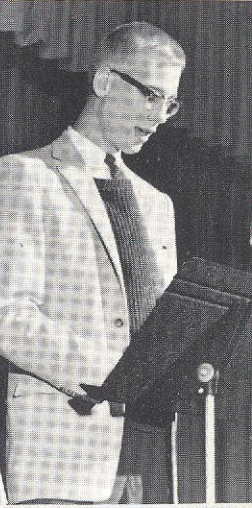
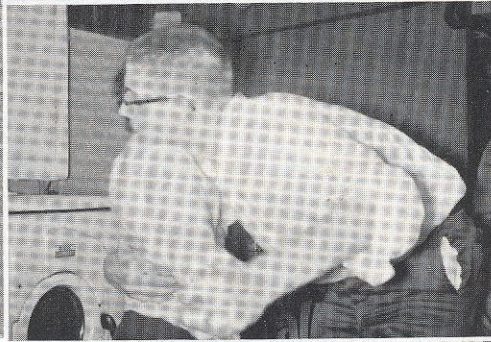
Many of us played summer stock at the Kenmore West Studios to earn extra credits and raise sagging averages. Miss Bradley and Mr. Reed aided us with the Senior Show, "Our Last, Our Best," which fulfilled its name. For us the basketball season reached its height at the East-West game when we won in the last few minutes. That was paying off a certain debt for the blue paint on our sidewalks. The Senior Play, "Time Out for Ginger," under the capable direction of Miss Barrett, was further proof that now we were capable of being stars. In the scholastic field, Valedictorian Judy Burzynski and Salutatorian Bob Vincent bow with honors. Our honor society was ceremoniously chosen, and they elected Bob Vincent president. Our last act progressed rapidly, and with mixed emotions, we saw Class Day, the Senior Supper, Senior Prom, and Graduation become memories.

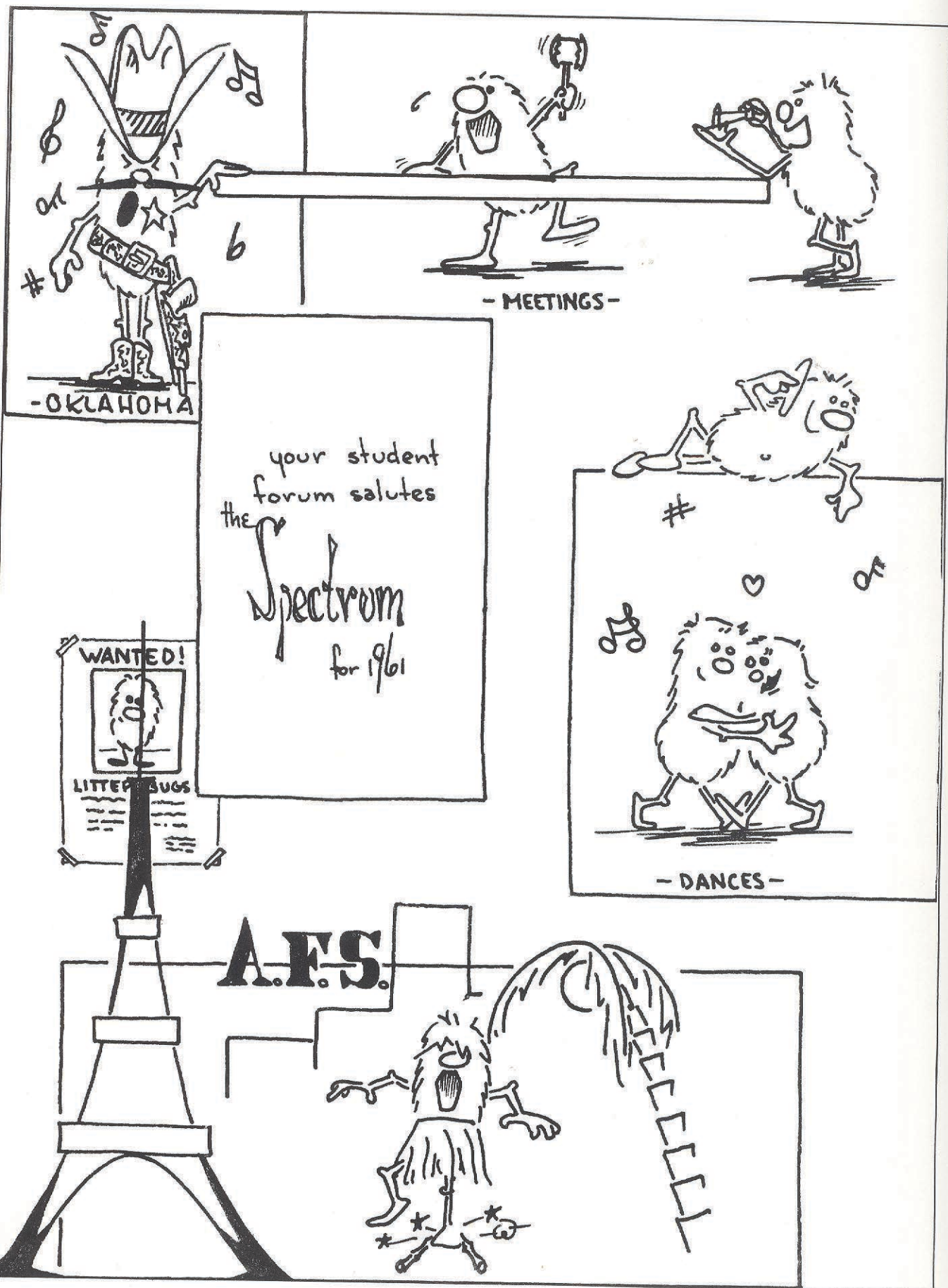

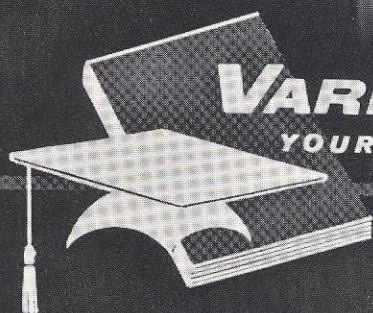

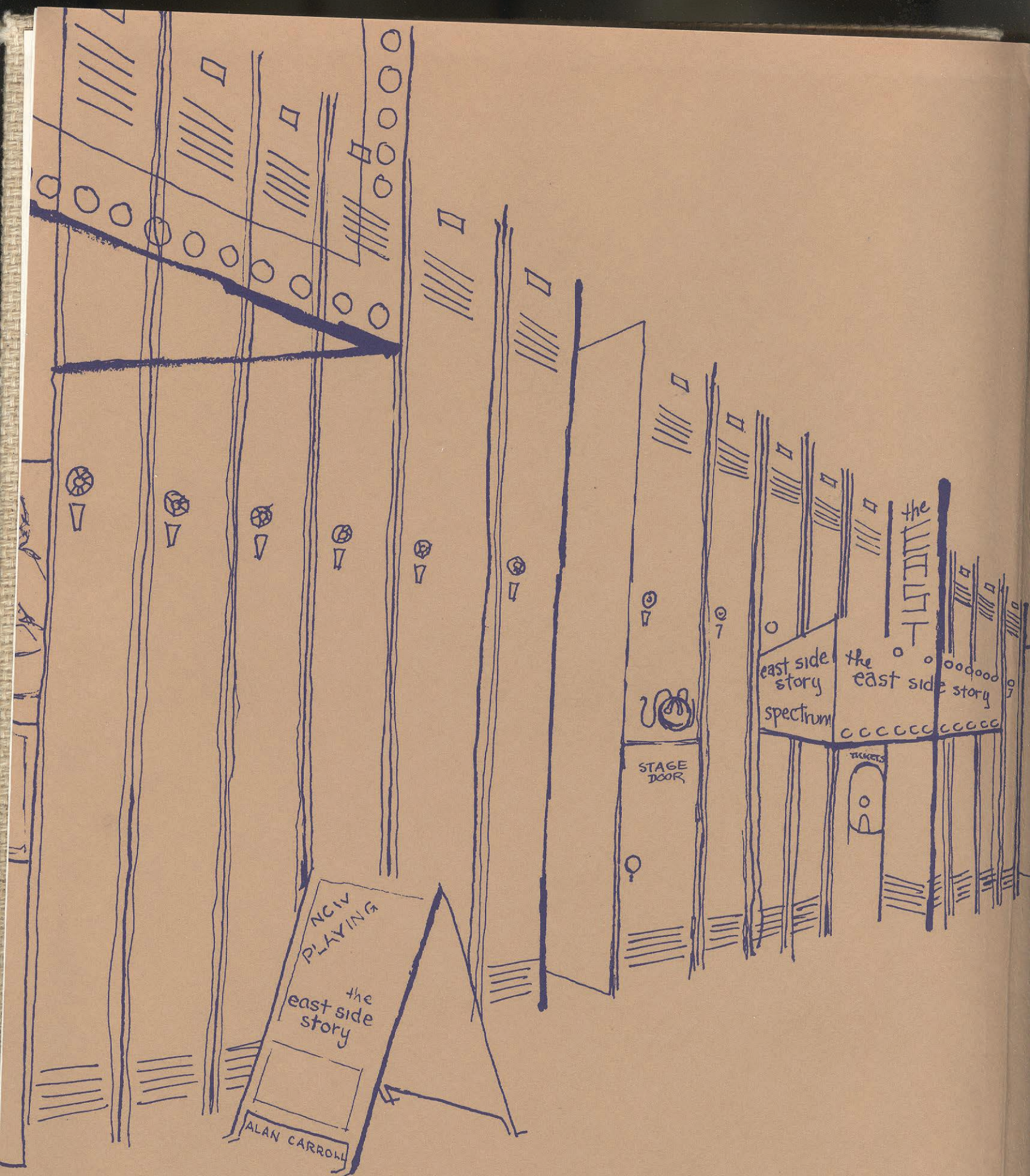
