Travelogue 1990

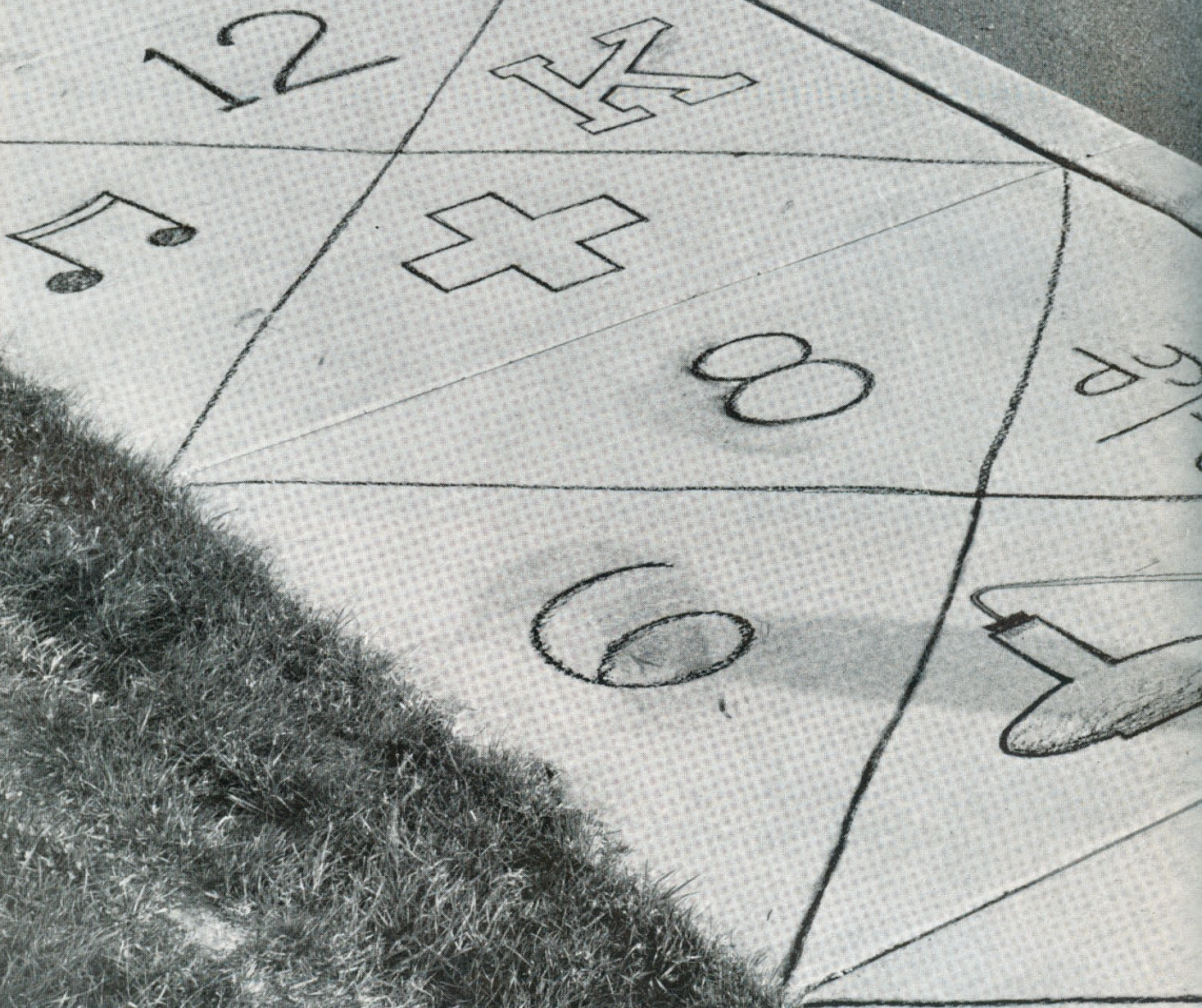

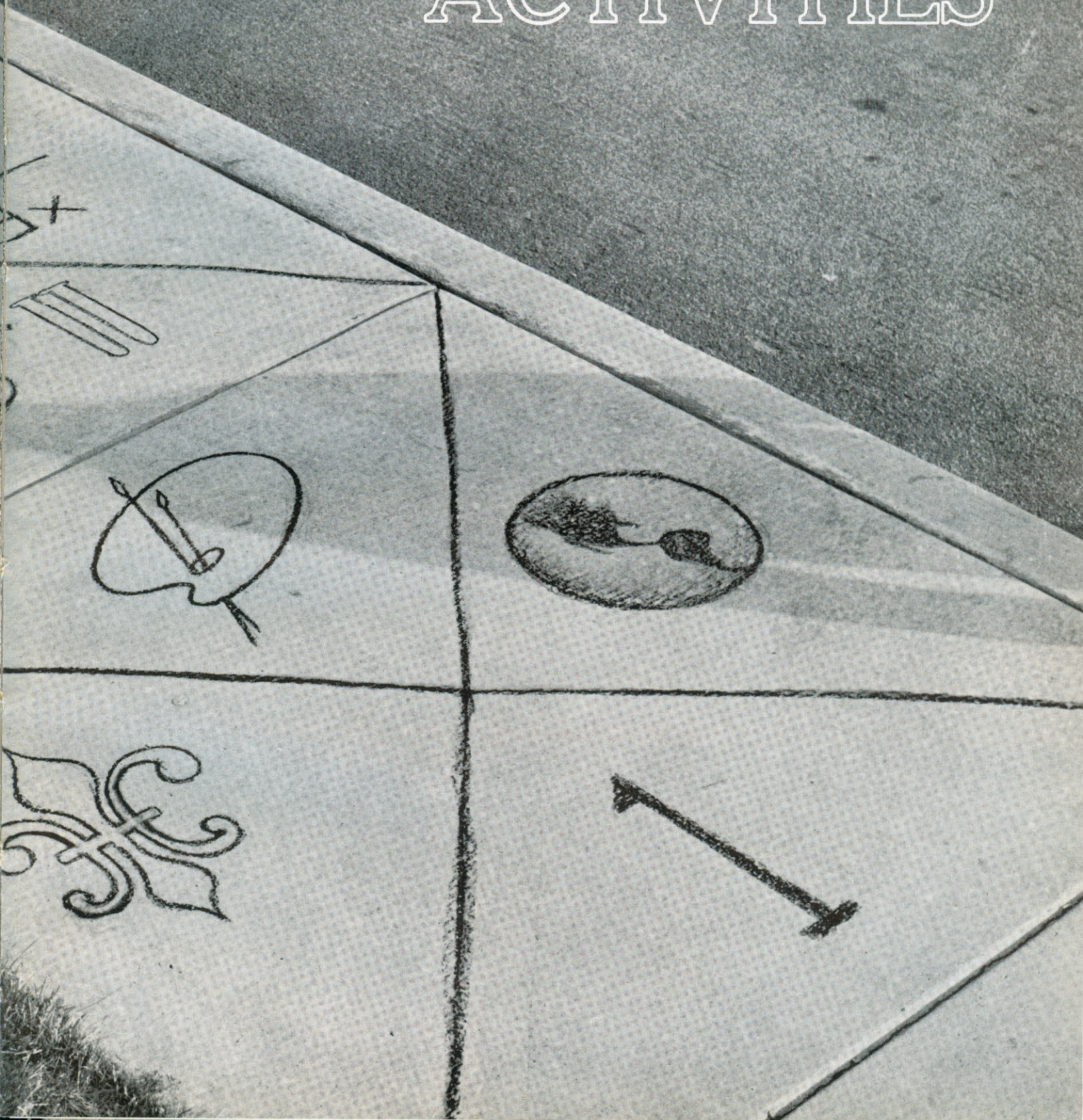

This, the motto of the American Field Service, effectively summarizes its worthwhile purpose and goal.

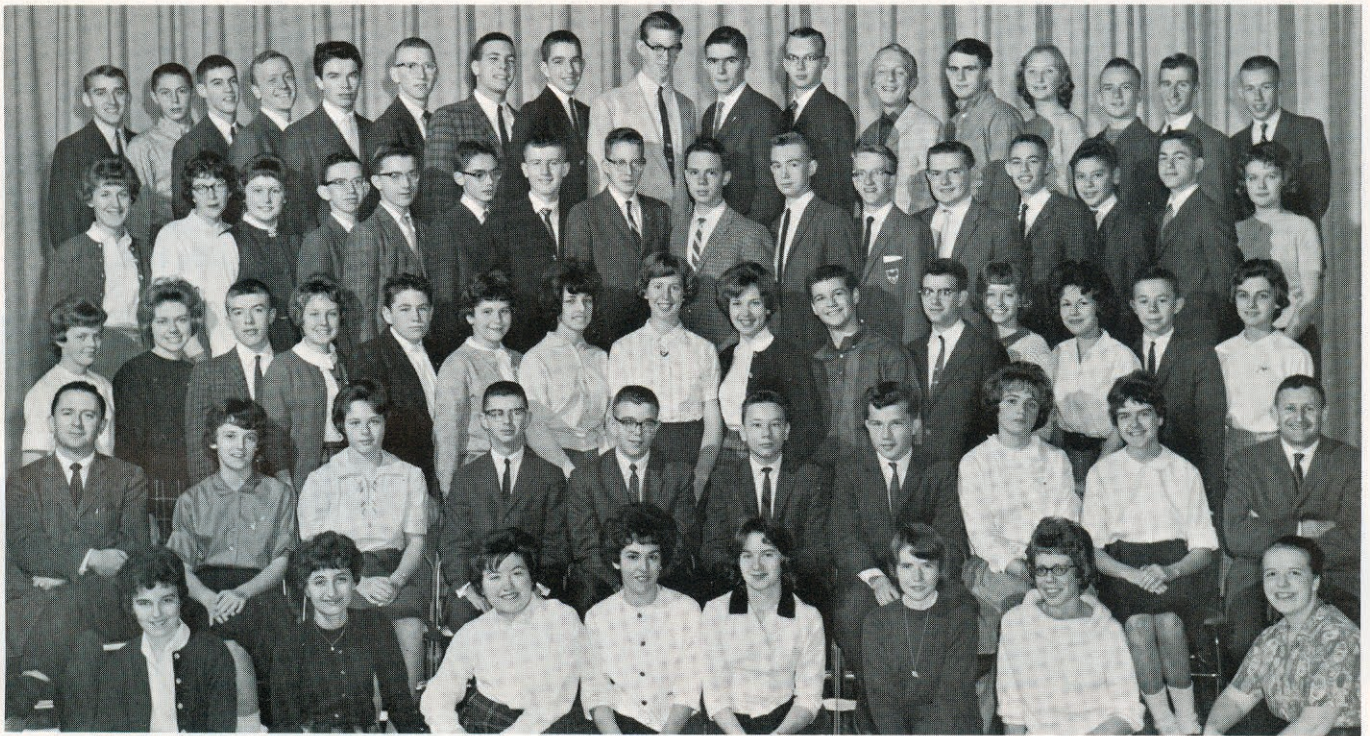

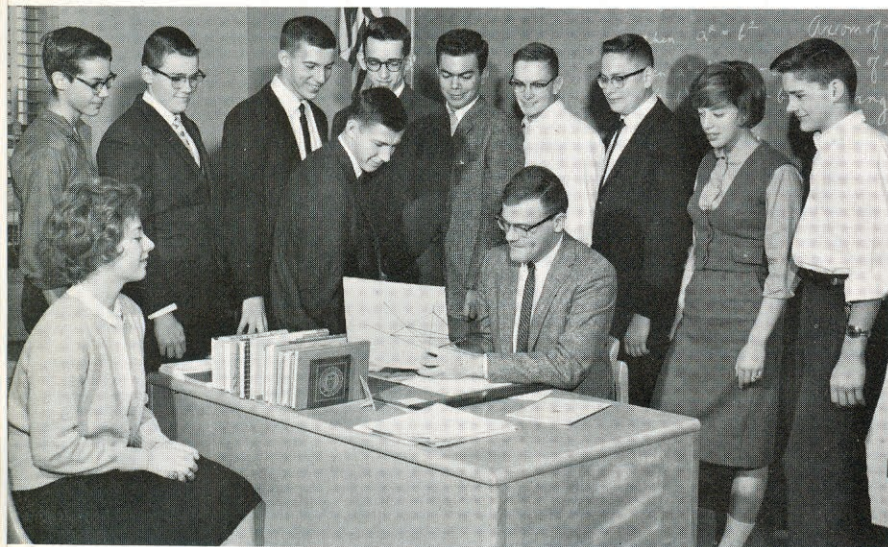
Scholarship Club

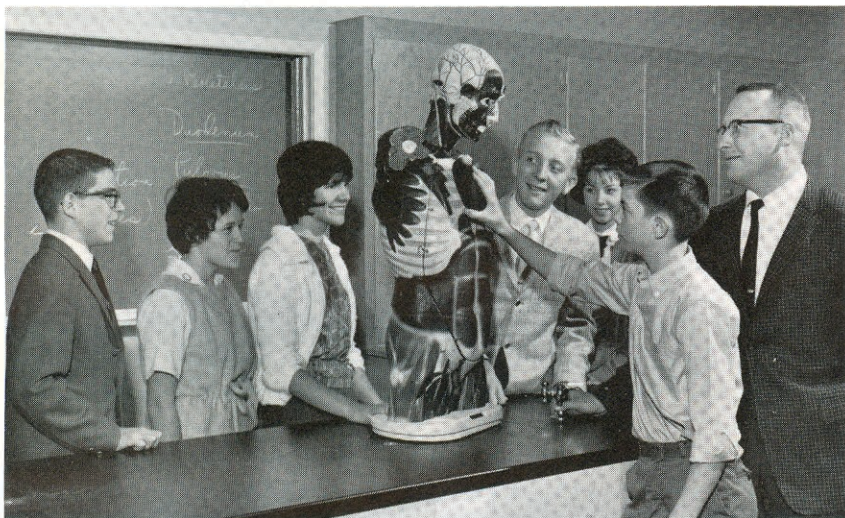
Art Club

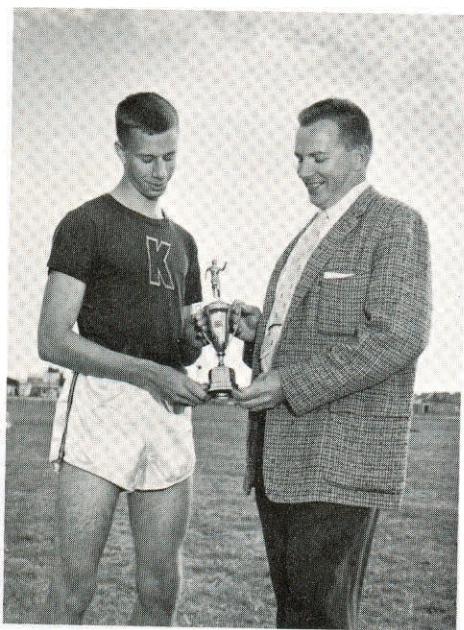

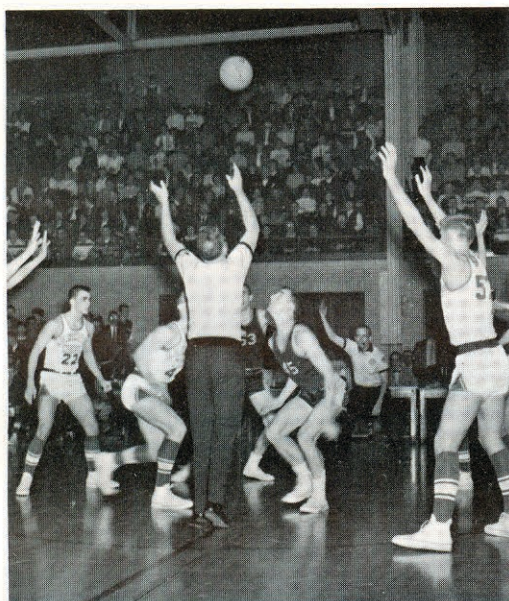

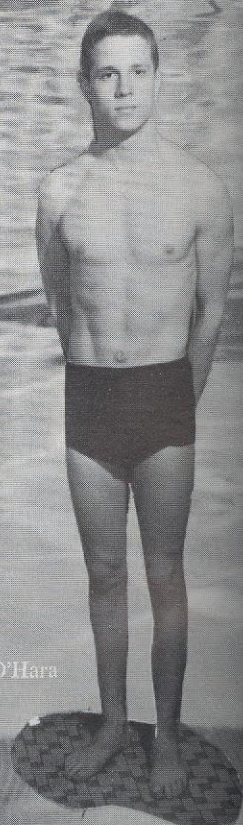
