1964 CLASS HISTORY

The candle flickers weakly; soon our days at Kenmore East will be at an end. Not wishing to leave, yet knowing we must, we think back upon these years and recall with mixed emotions the events that took place.

In September of 1961 we entered, for the first time, the august corridors of Kenmore East. Unsure of ourselves at first, we bravely stepped into the whirl of events. Quickly we found new friends and a firm footing in the ways of our school.

Much of our attention was at first focused on the spirited athletic contests. We followed with great interest the fortunes of the Big Gold varsity teams and cheered wildly for the J.V.'s. The year rolled on, and almost before we knew it, we were comparing examination grades.

After a pleasant vacation we returned to school and assumed a new air of importance: we no longer had the dubious distinction of being sophomores. Knowing the importance of our junior year, we plunged earnestly into the academic and extracurricular activities of our school. Many of us became leaders in student government and schoolwide activities as well as enthusiastic boosters of class functions. A large portion of collegeminded juniors also managed to take such new and different standarized tests as the P.S.A.T. and National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test. We were well on the road to seniority.

As juniors we took an even greater interest in varsity sports. Our former sophomore cheerleading trio was now, with the addition of Joanne Good, a quartet. The Blue-Gold Weekend, the first of its kind, was a great success, for it was the first time our football Bulldogs were not overpowered by the Blue Devils. By the same token our basketball team, composed of many fine juniors, was successful in capturing both East-West games. In league competition the spectators were victorious: East again won the the Sportsmanship Trophy.

In the fall of our junior year we elected a new team of class officers: Bob Young, Sue Schillo, George Constantino, and Chris Geiselhart. With these people to guide us, we began working energetically on our next project, the Junior Carnival. Every member of the

Class of '64 recalls the fun of throwing ice-cold sponges at Mr. MacGamwell and Mr. Byrd, as well as the elaborate planning necessary to transform the West cafeteria into a western saloon. Thus we chalked up our second class success. Another great step toward seniority was the Junior Prom. None of us will forget that encounter with polka dots and moonbeams.

The year closed quickly, the summer came and passed, and suddenly we were seniors. Our minds were whirling with the initials R.S.A.T. and C.E.E.B., college applications, transcripts, and class placement. Our future loomed before us, yet we had to be concerned with the present: we were leaders of the school.

Though responsibility weighed heavy upon our shoulders, we still had time for other activities. Our enthusiastically supported football team, led by all-league stars Ken Rutkowski, George Constantino, Gary Dean and Buzz Dinwoodie, aided East's causes in bidding for first place contention during much of the season. The senior play, *The Man Who Came to Dinner*, evoked laughter from the entire student body and many parents. Before we had finished applauding Mike Solly's brilliant performance as Sheridan Whiteside, the senior show was in full swing. The auditorium was certainly never louder or gayer than during our *Hootenanny* when everyone chimed in to sing.

Thus the senior class, and the student body as a whole, moved vigorously forward. We were interrupted, however, by a worldwide tragedy, the assassination of President John F. Kennedy. On that sorrowful Friday, November 22, and the days and weeks to follow, we, as students and Americans, mourned the passing of a great leader. We watched as President Lyndon Johnson gathered the reins of government and unified the nation in this time of crisis. We came to realize, perhaps as never before, the great strength of our government under freedom.

Amidst this sorrow, grief again struck our hearts. Mr. William Pawling, a dedicated social studies teacher in our school system for many years, passed away in December. It was indeed "a time to mourn."

Yet we, as seniors, were obliged to move toward the completion of our high school careers. The Honor Society inducted its new members, and we attended the Senior Tea, the Senior Prom, Class Day, and finally Commencement. The largest class to be graduated from Kenmore East, we regretfully left the corridors where, through extracurricular and academic participation, we had begun on the road of learning.



CROSS COUNTRY





Gullo ends high school career anchoring sectional record—setting relay team.



March, 1963, marked the inception of Kenmore East's fourth consecutive outstanding track season. From the first day the boys ran outside in the snow until the day of the Sectionals in June, the team proved time and again that it was one of the best in the Niagara Frontier League. The team's strength lay in the running events, in most of which East could place a man or team as good as any in the area. The Bull Dogs ended their season fittingly, placing fourth of fourteen teams in the triple A Sectionals. Chuck Bahne completed his unbeaten senior year there with a victory in the 180-yard hurdles, and East's once-defeated 880-yard relay quartet turned in a Section VI record time of 1 minute, 32 seconds.

The Sectionals also marked the end of the high school career of Chuck Gullo, team captain and one of the finest athletes ever to attend East. Undefeated over three years of varsity competition in the spring events, Chuck amassed over 200 points for the team during this span, and retired as holder or co-holder of one state and three league records. He, too, ended his career in typical fashion, tying a sixteen-year-old Section VI record in the 100-yard-dash, 9.9 seconds.

This year's team was led by Captain Ron Manne and a nucleus of veteran seniors. Coaches Mr. Alfred Heinen and Mr. Robert Byrd have worked hard with this team, as with other teams in the past, to continue the fine tradition that they have set at Kenmore East.




