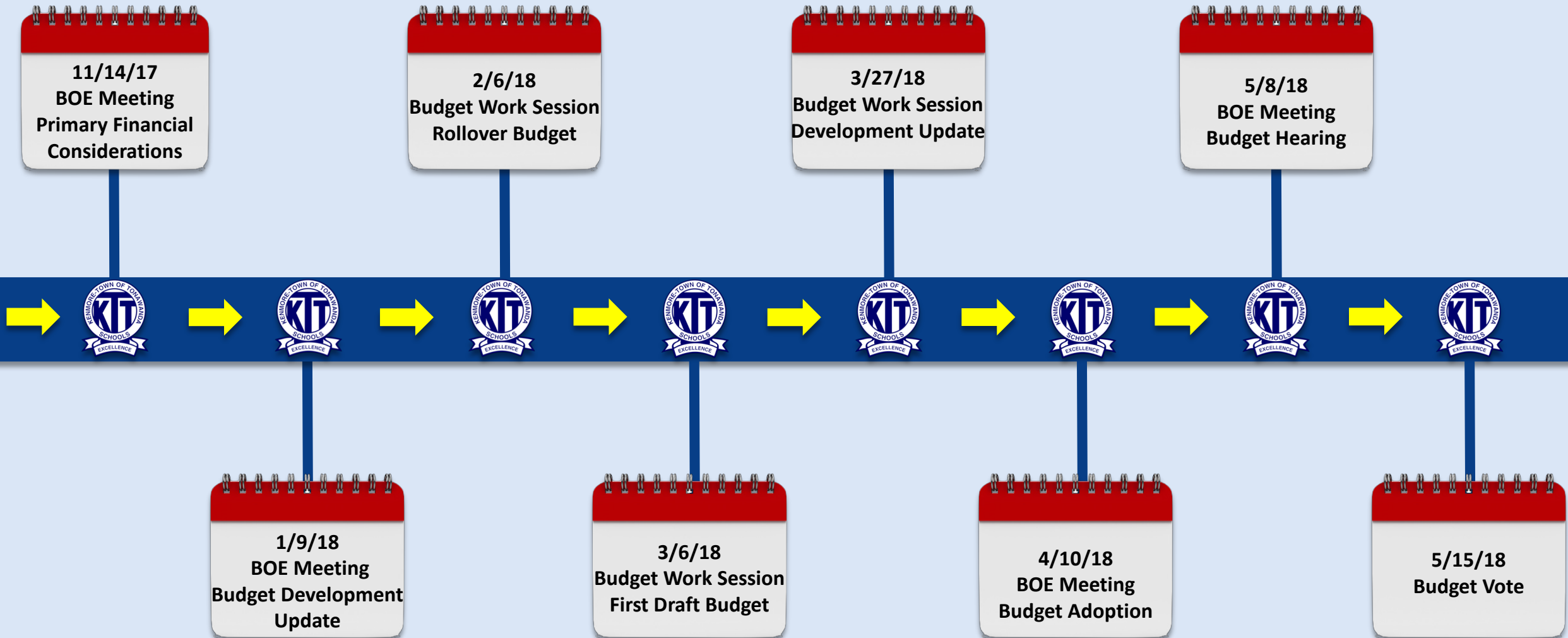

Budget Timeline

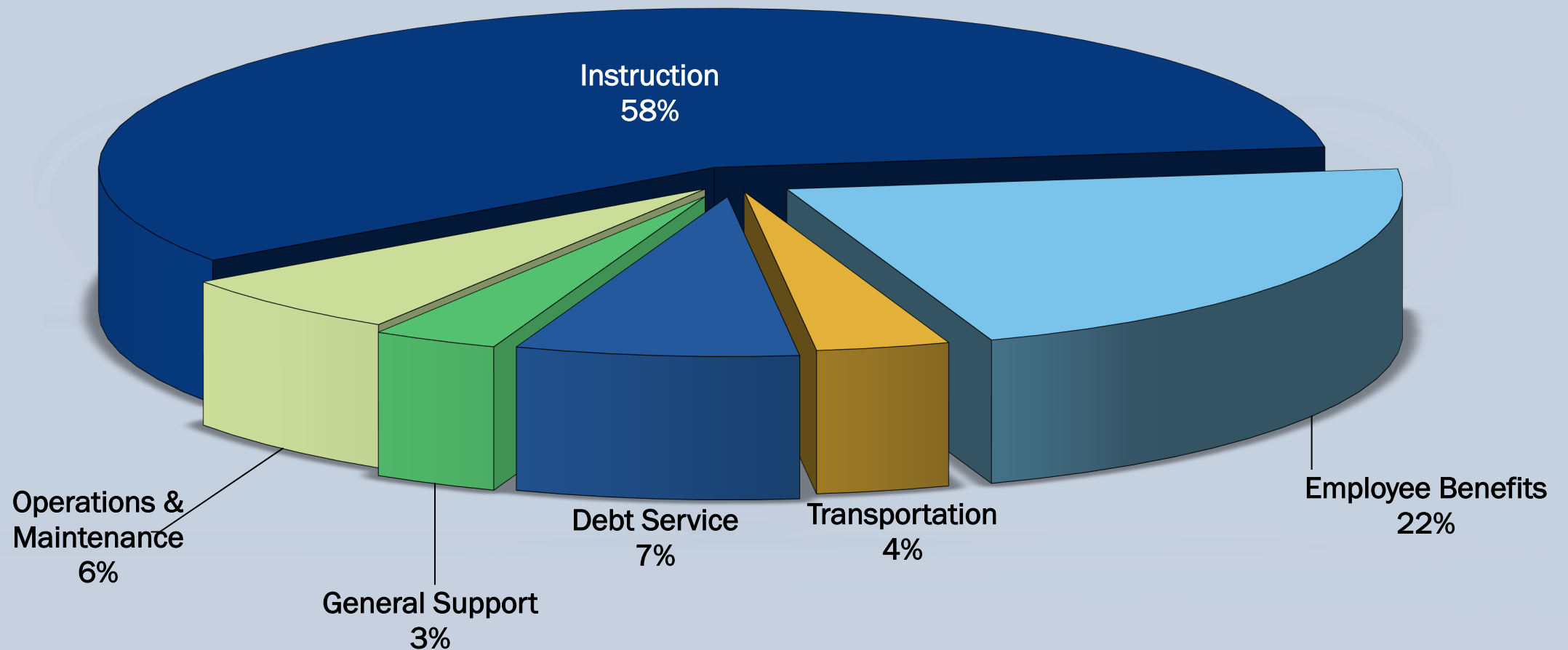
Budget Development Timeline



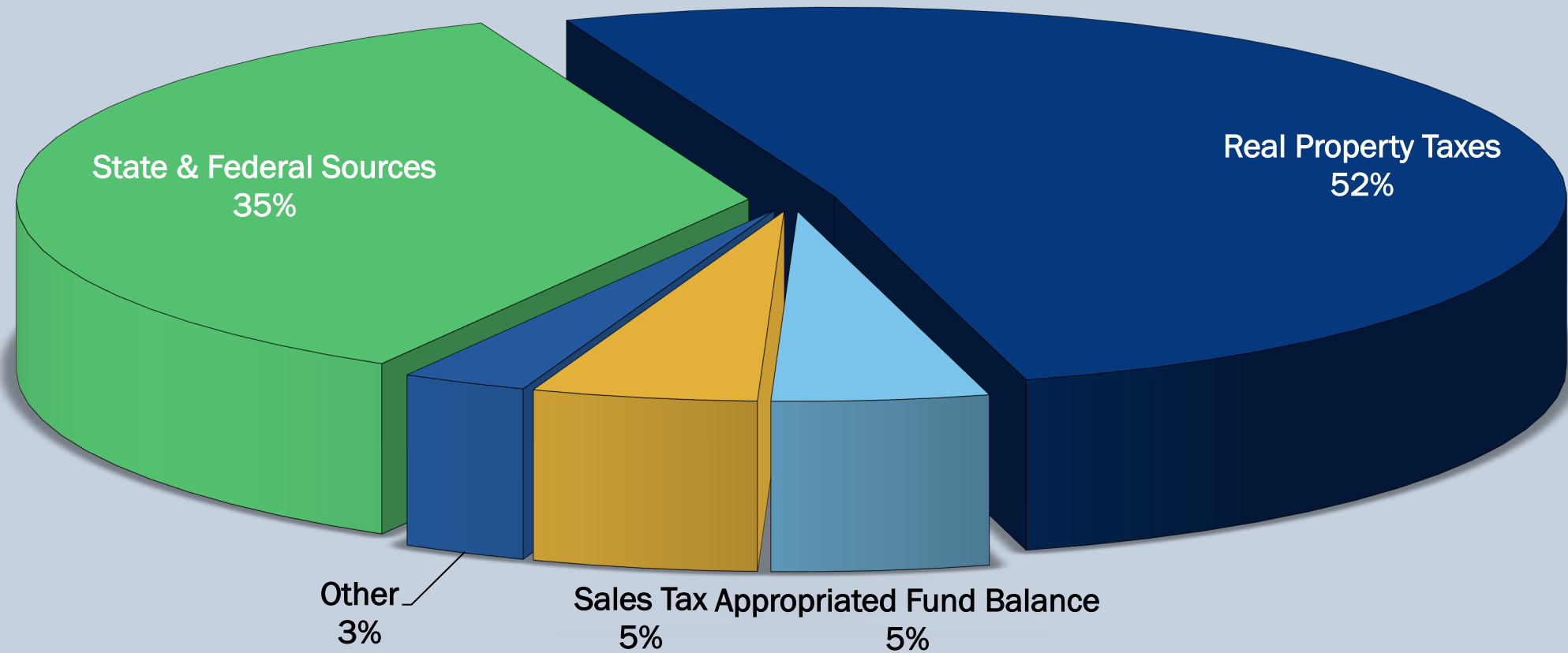
Revenues & Expenditures

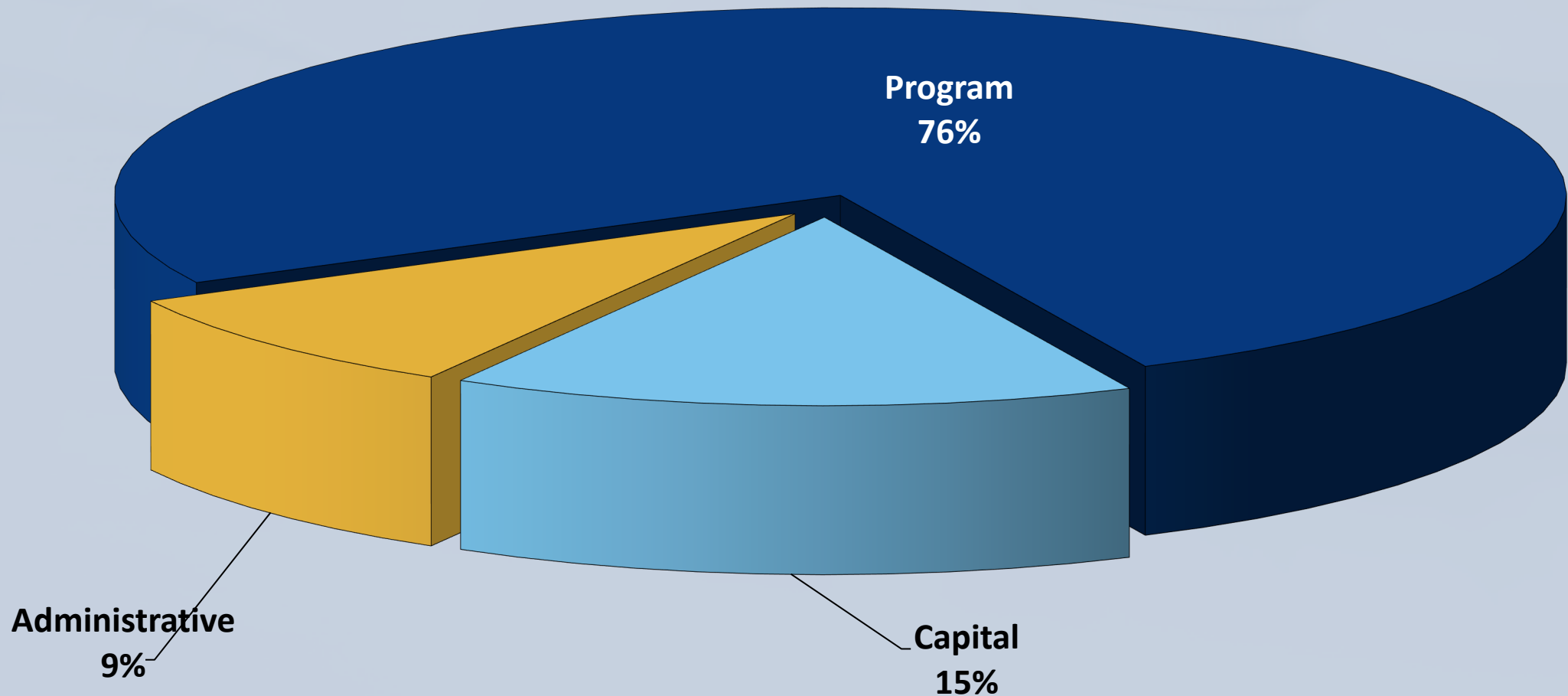

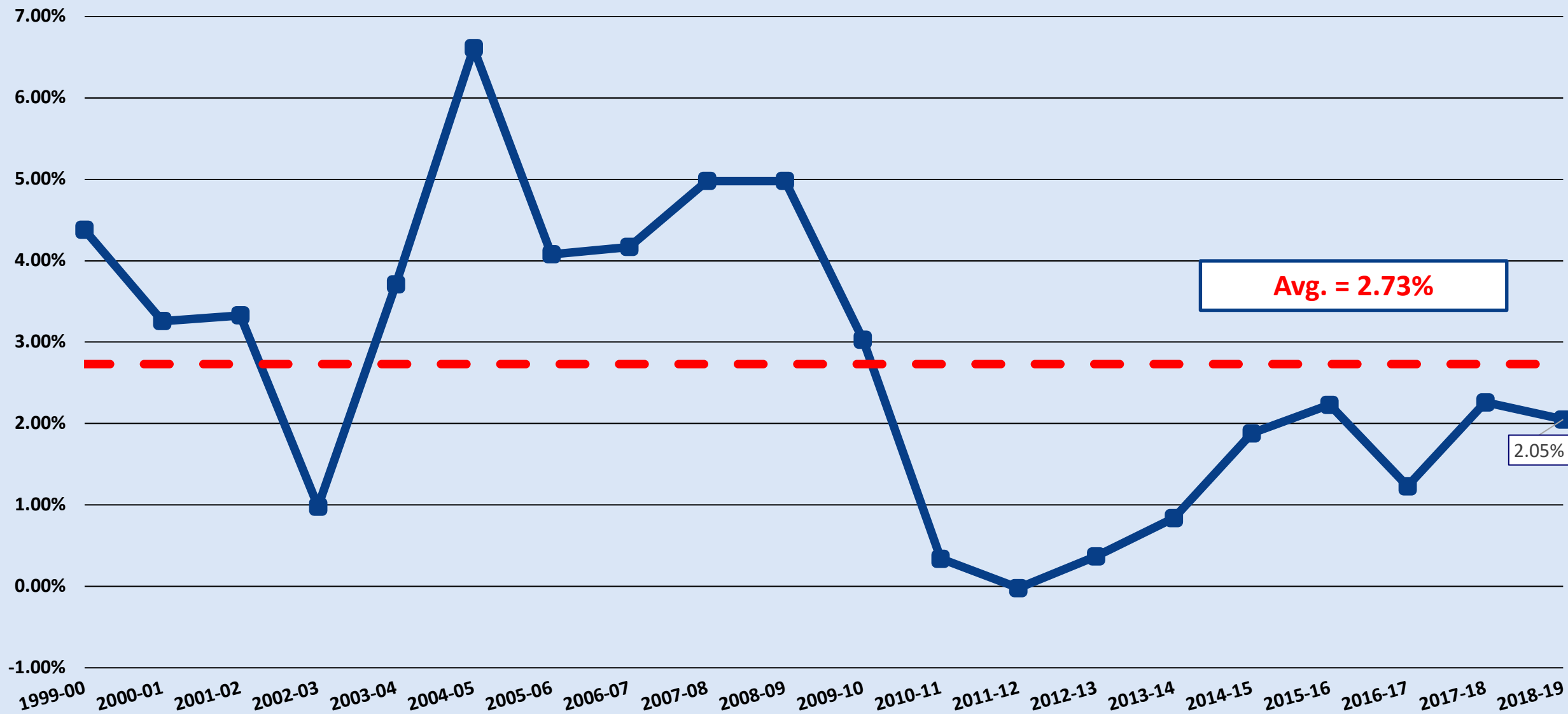

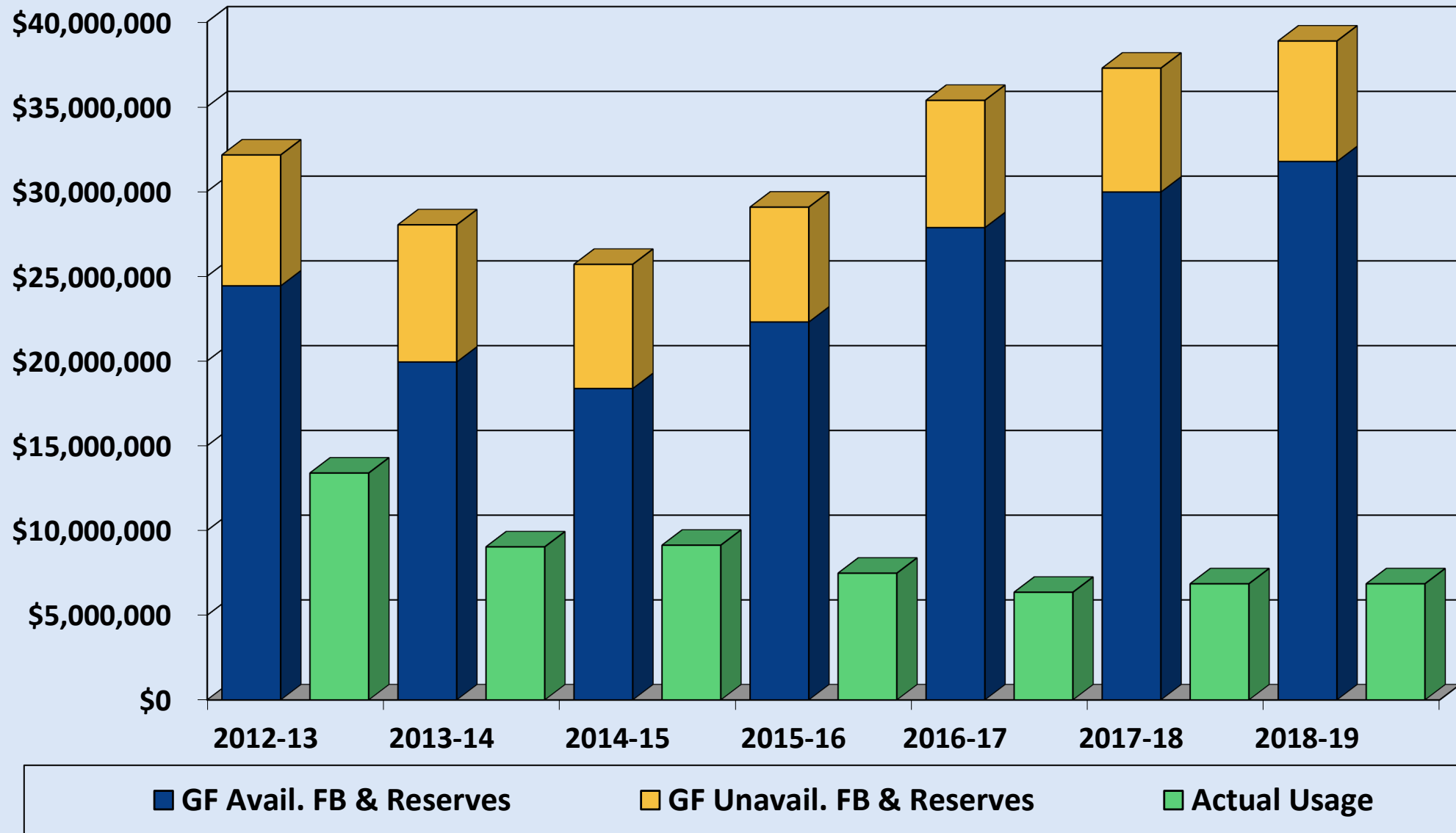
Budget History

Property Taxes

Estimated Tax Levy: 2018-19 School Year

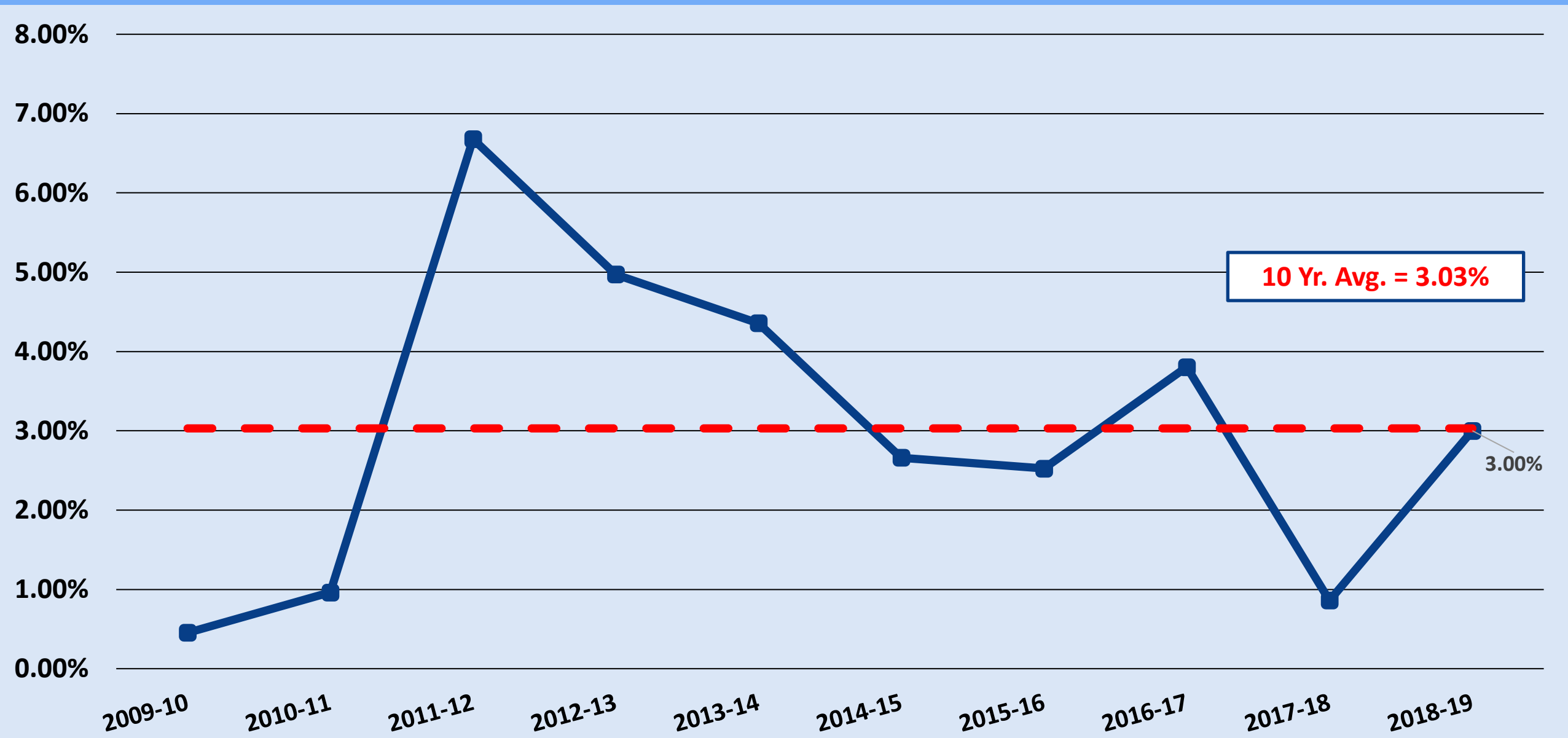
- **Tax Levy: \$84,862,121**
- **Increase: \$2,471,712**
- **% Increase: 3%**
- **Tax Levy Cap Threshold Adj. for Exclusions: \$85,437,480**
 - *Within the allowable tax levy cap*
 - *Does not require a super majority vote*

Estimated Tax Rate: 2018-19 School Year

Assumes no change in assessed value

- **Rate:** \$51.16/thousand
- **Increase:** \$1.49
- **% Increase:** 3%
- **5-Year Average:** 2.57%
- **10-Year Average:** 3.03%

Projected Annual Tax Impact on a Home with a Full Market Value of \$100,000

	Actual 2017-18	Projected 2018-19	Projected Increase
Assessed Value*	\$39,000	\$37,000	\$-2,000
Tax Rate Per Thousand	\$49.67	\$51.16	\$1.49
Tax Paid	\$1,937	\$1,893	-\$44

*The 2019 estimated equalization rate is 37%

Property Tax Relief Credit

Established in 2015-16 budget

- Valid 2016-17 through 2019-20 school years

Eligibility:

- Receiving STAR exemption or STAR credit
- Resident of New York State
- Gross income no greater than \$275,000
- School district is “tax cap compliant”

Property Tax Relief Credit

Property Tax Relief Credit Amounts

2018-19:

- *Basic STAR* tax savings multiplied by percentage:

Qualified Gross Income as of 2016	Percentage
Not over \$75,000	60%
Over \$75,000 but not over \$150,000	42.5%
Over \$150,000 but not over \$200,000	25%
Over \$200,000 but not over \$275,000	7.5%
Over \$275,000	0%

- *Enhanced STAR* tax savings multiplied by 26%

Propositions

Proposition 1: Budget: \$163,957,543

Proposition 2: Bus Purchase

Total Proposition:	\$754,716
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*Approximately 70% State Transportation Aided
District Share: Approximately \$226,413*

Proposition 3: Sale of Philip Sheridan Building for \$1,049,017

What Happens if the Budget is NOT Approved by the Public?

Two Options:

1. Resubmit the original budget or submit a revised budget to the voters on the third Tuesday in June OR
2. Adopt a contingency budget that levies a tax no greater than that of the current year (0% increase in the tax levy).

If the resubmitted/revised budget proposal is not approved by the required margin:

- The Board of Education must adopt a budget that levies a tax no greater than that of the current year (0% increase tax levy) and the budget would be subject to contingent budget requirements.

Districts will not be allowed to increase the tax levy to the extent necessary to fund items of expenditure excluded from the tax cap

- No growth factor
- No capital, court order/judgments or pension exclusions

- Registered to vote at least 5 days prior to the vote
- Provide proof of citizenship, age, and residency
