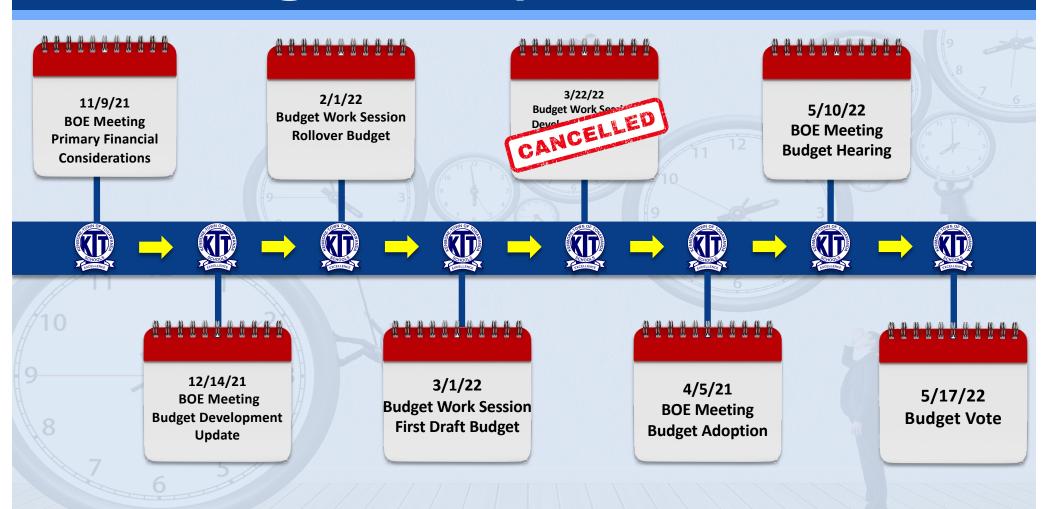

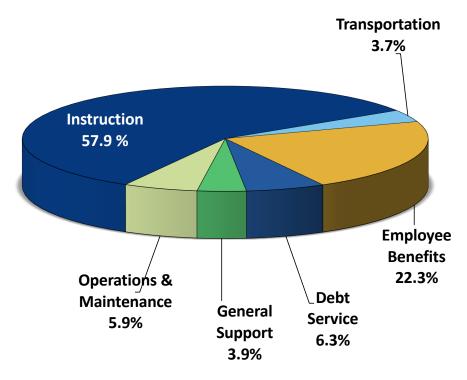

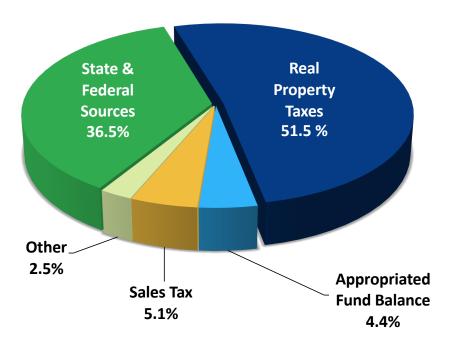

Revenue Categories as a % of Total Proposed Budget



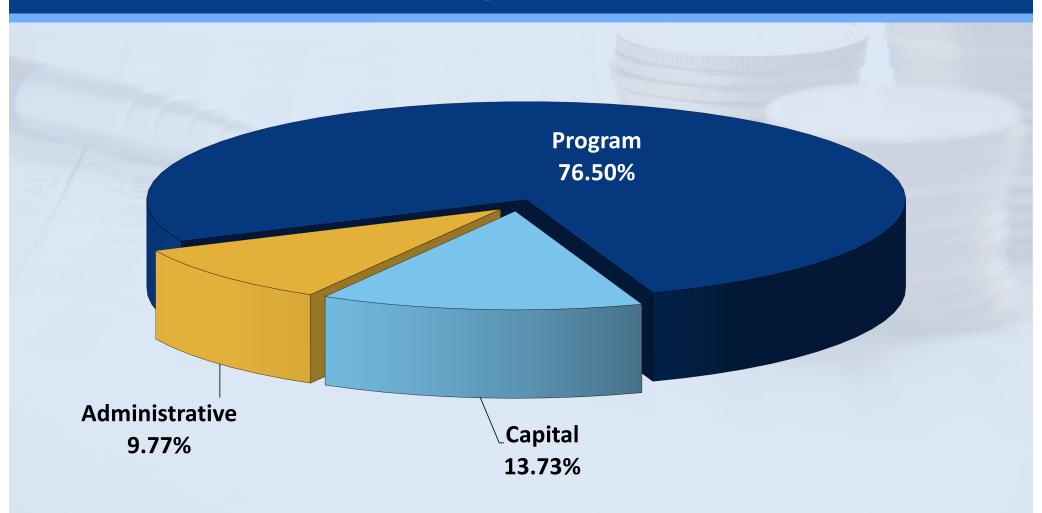

Property Taxes

Estimated Tax Levy: 2022-23 School Year

• Tax Levy: \$ 90,898,779

• Increase: \$899,988

• % Increase: 1.00%

- Tax Levy Cap Threshold Adj. for Exclusions: \$2,170,570
 - Within the allowable tax levy cap
 - Does not require a super majority vote

Estimated Tax Rate: 2022-23 School Year

Assumes no change in assessed value

• **Rate:** \$54.84/thousand

• **Increase:** \$.54

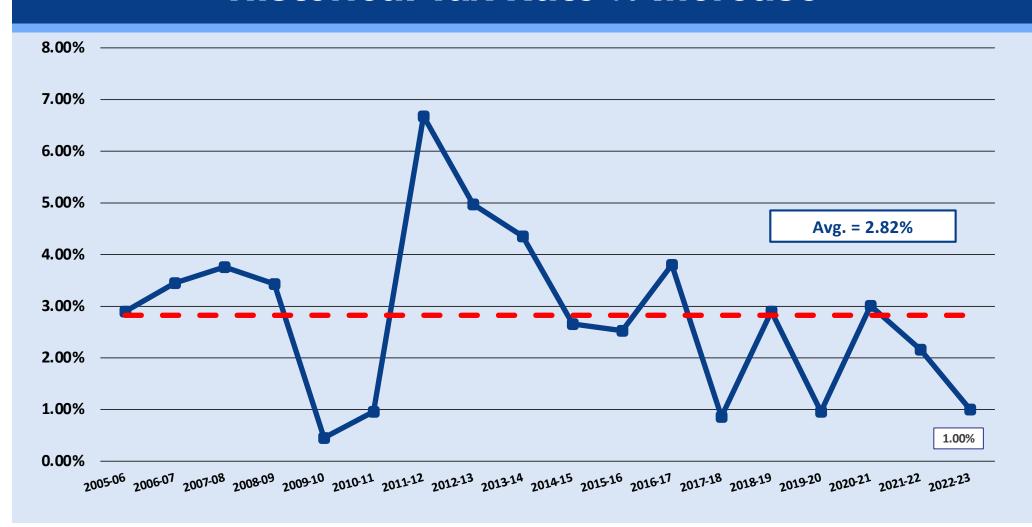

Capital Outlay

What is a capital outlay project?

- A planned project total that will cost no more than \$100,000 that will receive building aid
- Aided in next fiscal year once project final expenditures are sent in
- One per year allowed
- Planning to replace the water main at the Transportation Building
- Built into General Fund Budget

Budget Propositions

Proposition 1: Budget: \$176,494,282

Proposition 2: Bus Purchase \$1,250,000

10 (Ten) 65-Passenger Gasoline Buses

\$1,250,000

Approximately 70% State Transportation Aided District Share: Approximately \$375,000

What Happens if the Budget is NOT Approved by the Public?

Two Options:

- Resubmit the original budget or submit a revised budget to the voters on the third Tuesday in June OR
- 2. Adopt a contingency budget that levies a tax no greater than that of the current year (0% increase in the tax levy).

If the resubmitted/revised budget proposal is not approved by the required margin:

• The Board of Education <u>must</u> adopt a budget that levies a tax no greater than that of the current year (0% increase tax levy) and the budget would be subject to contingent budget requirements.

Districts will <u>not</u> be allowed to increase the tax levy to the extent necessary to fund items of expenditure excluded from the tax cap

- No growth factor
- No capital, court order/judgments or pension exclusions
